**NEW GRANTS****Recycling Waste Materials for City Colleges of Chicago (PD# 9822).**

Central Office has requested \$226,962 from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs to implement waste reduction programs at all City Colleges of Chicago. Period of performance: April 1, 1998 through March 31, 2000.

**Chemical Professional Laboratory Program (PD# 9824).** Harold Washington, a subcontractor to the University of Illinois at Chicago, has submitted a proposal to the National Science Foundation to include new experiments in Harold Washington's General Chemistry courses. The subcontract to Harold Washington is for \$1,500. Period of performance: May 1, 1997 through May 1, 1998.

**Teen Responsibility, Education, Achievement, Caring, and Hope (REACH) (PD# 9827).** Wright College is requesting \$350,000 from the Illinois Department of Human Services to provide academic, enrichment, recreation, and life skills training to Austin youth ages 10 through 17. Period of performance: April 15, 1998 through June 30, 1999.

**Strengthening Institutions: A Cooperative Program (PD# 9828).** Harold Washington College, in cooperation with East-West University, has requested \$350,000 from the U.S. Department of Education to establish a distance learning program. Period of performance: October 1, 1998 through September 30, 1999.

**CONTINUATION GRANTS**

**Hispanic Math/Science Education Initiative (PD# 9821).** Malcolm X, a subcontractor to the University of Illinois at Chicago, has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education to provide a Saturday enrichment program that strengthens students' science and math skills. The subcontract to Malcolm X College is for \$7,000. Period of performance: September 1, 1997 through August 31, 1998.

**Truants' Alternative and Optional Education Program (PD# 9823).** Central Office has prepared a proposal requesting \$2,313,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education to provide alternative educational programs and services to reclaimed youth 16 to 21 years old who have dropped out of high school. Period of performance: August 1, 1998 through June 30, 1999.

**National Youth Sports Program (PD# 9825).** Central Office has requested \$329,002 from the National Collegiate Athletic Association to support the operation of the National Youth Sports Program at Daley (\$79,550), Kennedy-King (\$61,500), Malcolm X (\$73,000), Olive-Harvey (\$58,652) and Truman (\$56,300) Colleges. Period of performance: June 1, 1998 through May 31, 1999.

**Adult Education and Literacy (PD# 9826)**. Central Office has prepared a proposal requesting \$10,000,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education to provide Adult Basic Education (ABE), General Educational Development (GED), English as a Second Language (ESL), and Vocational instruction to educationally disadvantaged students who are more than 16 years of age. Period of performance: July 1, 1998 through June 30, 1999.

#### CONTRIBUTIONS

**Kenneth F. And Harle G. Montgomery Foundation** has made a \$30,000 contribution to the Opportunities Program at City Colleges of Chicago. The funds will be used for on-the-job training at ABC Data.

**American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS)** has made a gift of \$14,495 to WYCC-TV/Channel 20. The funds will be used to underwrite the "Epic of Evolution" conference broadcast on Channel 20 in April, 1998.

**American Health Care Provider, Inc.** has contributed \$1,000 to the Kennedy-King College Child Development Laboratory Center. The purpose of this gift is to provide opportunities for cultural enrichment through educational field trip for the children at the Center.

#### TRANSFER

**Harry S Truman College** will transfer \$18,000 from the Philip Morris Companies Inc. Careers in Teaching grant to DePaul University's School for New Learning as part of the partnership arrangement between both institutions; and that the funds from Truman will be matched by funds provided through the School for New Learning, and as a result of this joint arrangement, Mr. Atsbaha will be provided one half of his salary with benefits for his services to both institutions as a liaison for the Truman College/DePaul University Bridge program in which capacity he has served for the past six years.

that the Board of Trustees approves submission of these proposals to the appropriate funding agencies, and authorizes the execution of all documents by the Chancellor or the Executive Director of Resource Development, the Assistant Secretary of the Board and the General Counsel for the acceptance of any funding that may be forthcoming; said funds to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth by the grantors, and not to be expended by the Board for any other purposes.
