REPORTS

that Elena Mulcahy, acting assistant director of Adult Learning Skills Program at Truman College, has been appointed to the DePaul University Institutional Review Board for the Protection of Human Subjects; and will participate in reviewing, approving and monitoring the use of human subjects in research projects conducted by students, faculty and staff of DePaul University; and

that Carol Harmel, Art Professor, had her photographic work featured in a special exhibition at the Printworks Gallery of Chicago; and that proceeds from the exhibit benefitted the Amity Foundation, a New Jersey based organization that provides aid to Chinese orphanages; and

that Amir Nour, Art Professor, has been selected by the Stadtische Galerie Goppingen to display his sculpture in the internationally esteemed invitational exhibition, *7th Triennale der Kleinplastik* (7th Triennial of Small Scale Sculpture), to be held in Stuttgart, Germany in late 1998; and that Mr. Nour has been invited by the Herbert F. Johnson Museum of Art of Cornell University to display his sculpture in the autumn 1998 featured exhibition, *Objects and Their Makers: New Insights (OMNI)*, which celebrates the work of African artists; and has been selected by the National Institute for Staff Organizational Development (NISOD) to be the recipient of the 1998 NISOD Excellence Award, which recognizes outstanding contributions to teaching and learning; and that Mr. Nour also has three sculptures on permanent display at the Smithsonian Institute and was one of only five artists invited to display his sculpture at the 1996 Olympic Games held in Atlanta, Georgia; and

that Dung Doan, who graduated in 1993, has been awarded the prestigious Dwight D. Eisenhower Graduate Fellowship by the United States Department of Transportation, which provides a three-year fellowship covering tuition, fees and stipends for Mr. Doan's doctoral studies in Civil Engineering at Northwestern University; and that he is also the sole recipient of the Walter P. Murphy Fellowship for graduate study and other academic awards including the Alfred Benesh Award, the Wilfred F. and Ruth Davidson Langelier Award, the Irene N. Jones Award, the Civil Engineering Scholar Award, and the 1996 Most Outstanding Senior of the Year Award while earning his Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering with high honors from the University of Illinois at Chicago; and, while a student at Truman College, Mr. Doan was a member of Phi Theta Kappa honor society and president of the Asian Student Association.
