## NEW GRANTS

**Accelerated Multimedia Training Program (PD# 9866)**. Truman College has requested \$45,872 from the U.S. Department of Labor to establish an accelerated multimedia training program that will address the needs of high-skilled workers displaced by corporate restructuring and economic fluctuations. Period of performance: September 1, 1998 through August 31, 1999.

## CONTINUATION GRANTS

**Upward Bound Program at Daley (PD# 9862)**. Daley College has requested \$250,000 from the U.S. Department of Education to establish a college preparatory program for high school student in the Chicago area. Period of performance: October 1, 1999 through September 30, 2000.

**Food Service Sanitation Program (PD# 9863)**. Harold Washington College has requested \$61,779 from the Chicago Department of Public Health to certify workers in Food service Sanitation to meet City and State requirements. Period of performance: January 1 through December 31, 1998.

**Skills Standards Curriculum Integration Project (PD# 9864)**. District Office has requested \$8,000 from the Illinois Community College Board to integrate Illinois manufacturing skills standards into credit programs at City Colleges of Chicago. Period of performance: August 1 through December 31, 1998.

**Bridge to Advance Technological Education (PD# 9865)**. Daley College, a subcontractor to the University of Illinois at Chicago, will receive \$56,474 from the National Science Foundation to develop technological curricula for adults who lack basic skills. Period of performance: June 15, 1998 through May 31, 1999.

## CONTRACT AMENDMENTS

**Children Development Training Program (PD# 9848)**. Malcolm X College has received a contract amendment from the Illinois Board of Higher Education for an additional \$2,654 to develop curriculum materials to train individuals in child development/child care. Period of performance: July 1, 1997 through June 30, 1998.

**Site Administered Child Care (PD# 9762)**. District Office has received a contract amendment from the Illinois Department of Human Services for an additional \$5,000 to provide child care for children whose parents are economically disadvantaged. Period of performance: July 1, 1997 through June 30, 1998.

## CONTRIBUTIONS

Mr. Ferdinand J. Karrman has donated \$500.00 to the Truman College Scholarship Fund. Mr. Karrman is an alumnus of Truman College.

The Birkelund Foundation has donated \$1,000 to Malcolm X College. This grant will help to establish a lending library at Malcolm X College for children and parents affiliated with the Child Development Lab.

The Polk Bros. Foundation has donated a gift of property to Malcolm X College. The property, located at 4607-4611 W. Madison, Chicago will be used by the West Side Learning Center for student parking and possible future expansion of programs. The estimated value of the land donation is \$35,000.

The Estate of William C. Kosinar has donated \$500.00 to Kennedy-King College. This gift will be used by the Department of Social Science for purchasing library books in the field of Psychology.
