The Chairman declared a quorum was present.

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(20353) COLLEGE REPORT [NONE]

(20354) REPORT BY OFFICE OF ACADEMIC AFFAIRS [SYSTEM-WIDE STRATEGIC PLAN]

Suarez summarized the 21-page draft which had been submitted in November 1997 by the consultants working with the District's Strategic Planning Committee. A draft was developed following an analysis of multiple sources of information which included surveys of public/private high school students, high school teachers/counselors and corporate employers, and interviews with civic, business, educational and governmental leaders, as well as information obtained from focus groups meeting at the Colleges. Priorities are being developed and each will be followed by action steps and performance measures. Suarez indicated that the draft would be finalized this month, and that College plans would be developed consistent with the system wide plan and local priorities. The final phase of the Plan will be the development of performance indicators which will be used to measure achievement of the system-wide priorities from 1997 to 2002.

(20355) REPORT OF THE CHANCELLOR

Dr. Temple announced the following:

- Kennedy-King and Washington Colleges have been confirmed locations for national meetings scheduled in March 1998 to conduct presidential discussions on race.
- Wright, Malcolm X and Truman College students are currently serving on the IBHE Student Advisory Committee; and Gershom Rangai of Wright has been nominated to the Illinois Student Assistance Commission.
- Daley College has been granted NCA accreditation to the year 2001.
- WYCC Channel 20 recently reached a high point according to Nielsen Ratings by attaining a "3" rating for "Battlefield," a WWII documentary.
- 100% of the graduates of the Wright College Radiography Program have passed the certification exam and have been offered jobs.
- Accomplishments of a Truman College professor and the receipt of a \$160,000 grant were highlighted.
- Student successes in the Gear Training Program at Daley College.

(20356) COMMITTEE REPORT - ACADEMIC & STUDENT SERVICES

Czadowski asked Suarez to report on the 1-6-98 Committee meeting. Presidents of Kennedy-King, Malcolm X, Truman and Wright Colleges presented annual progress reports. An update on the strategic planning project was tabled to the 1-8-98 Board meeting. A special Committee meeting will be held on 1-21-98 to further discuss the overall ALSP program.

Moore introduced the report of the 1-6-98 Committee meeting. Thomas reported on the expected completion of the FY97 audit. The FY99 budget process has begun. IBHE grant allocations were reviewed by the Committee. A discussion was held about TIF District #69 which is within a few blocks of Kennedy-King College. Securities in the District's portfolio have been sold based on authorization

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granted in a previous Board Resolution. The OIT report was made by a visiting Collegis executive. Computer downtime during spring registration was discussed and OIT procedures reviewed. Moore requested a matrix of the timelines/project completion dates involved in the WAN. Calhoun presented monthly reports on capital projects, PBC actions, M/WBE percentages, and WYCC-TV. The Committee reviewed all purchasing reports that were submitted.

The Chairman asked Calabro to report on the 1-6-98 Committee meeting. Preparation of W2 forms is in progress. A comparison of health benefit costs from FY92 to FY97 showed significant savings estimated at \$3 million per year.
