## THE CHANCELLOR

that proposals, contracts, and other special funding instruments are under development or have been submitted by staff at this time.

## NEW GRANTS

**Project with Industry (PD# 9806).** Harold Washington College has requested \$157,752 from the U.S. Department of Education to implement a comprehensive vocational training and employment program designed to provide employment opportunities for young adults with developmental disabilities. Period of performance: September 1, 1998 through August 31, 1999.

**Quality Enhancement Services (PD# 9808).** City Colleges is submitting six proposals to the Illinois Department of Human Services for \$160,546 (Dawson Technical Institute \$10,546; Kennedy-King \$40,000; Malcolm X \$40,000; Olive-Harvey \$40,000; Truman \$10,000; and West Side Technical Institute \$20,000) to provide quality enhancement services for children whose parents are economically disadvantaged. Period of performance: March 1 through June 30, 1998.

**Child Care Services (PD# 9810).** Truman College has requested \$106,275 from the Illinois Department of Human Services to provide child care services to 40 additional pre-school and 25 elementary school children. Period of performance: July 1, 1998 through June 30, 1999.

**Integrating Skill Standards into Occupational Curricula (PD# 9811).** Central Office is preparing a proposal requesting \$25,000 from the Illinois Community College Board to create a model for the integration of occupational skill standards within the Illinois community college system. Period of performance: February 15 through June 30, 1998.

## CONTINUATION GRANTS

**Proyecto Access (PD# 9805).** Daley College with the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities has requested \$90,000 from National Aeronautics and Space Administration to identify and provide middle school and high school students an academic enrichment program in engineering, science, and other related areas. Period of performance: January 1 through December 31, 1998.

**Chicago School-to-Work Opportunities System (PD# 9807).** City Colleges of Chicago, in partnership with the Chicago Public Schools, has requested \$303,499 from the U.S. Department of Education to provide curriculum and staff development to participants in School-to-Work schools and occupational clusters. Period of performance: December 1, 1997 through July 31, 1998.
