THE CHANCELLOR

that proposals, contracts, and other special funding instruments are under development or have been submitted by staff at this time.

NEW GRANTS

Faculty Exchange, Recruitment and Retention Program (PD# 9854). City Colleges of Chicago along with the College of DuPage, Illinois Central College, Carl Sandburg College, and Parkland College have requested \$98,000 from the Illinois Board of Higher Education to establish an exchange program that will provide minority faculty an opportunity to share different cultural environments and resources at Illinois community colleges. Period of performance: July 1, 1998 through June 30, 1999.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

Early School Leavers Program (PD# 9852). City Colleges of Chicago has requested \$284,710 (Dawson Technical - \$84,672, Olive-Harvey - \$43,178, Malcolm X - \$60,287, Harold Washington - \$49,493, and Harry S. Truman - \$47,080) from the Illinois State Board of Education to provide work-based learning experiences to 16 to 21 year old high school non-completers who are academically disadvantaged. Period of performance July 1, 1998 through June 30, 1999.

Susan Harwood Training Program (PD# 9853). Olive-Harvey College has requested \$100,000 from the U.S. Department of Labor to provide local employers with knowledge and skills necessary to recognize, avoid, and prevent health hazards in the workplace. Period of performance: October 1, 1998 through September 30, 1999.

Chicago Manufacturing Center Affiliate (PD# 9855). Daley College has requested \$100,000 from the National Institute of Standards and Technology to provide operational and technical assessments and workforce preparation to manufacturing companies in Chicago. Period of performance: July 1, 1998 through June 30, 1999.

Education-to-Careers (PD# 9856). District Office will receive \$145,696 as a block grant from the Illinois Community College Board to support City Colleges' one-stop career centers. Period of performance: July 1, 1998 through June 30, 1999.

Technology Support (PD# 9857). District Office will receive \$249,270 as a block grant from the Illinois Community College Board to upgrade and maintain the District's teleconferencing network. Period of performance: July 1, 1998 through June 30, 1999.

Upward Bound Program (PD# 9858). Daley College has requested \$233,376 from the U.S. Department of Education to provide support services to low income high school student who have the ability to pursue postsecondary education. Period of performance: October 1, 1998 through September 30, 1999.

Site Administered Employment Related Child Care Program (PD# 9859). District Office has requested \$486, 806 from the Illinois Department of Human Services to provide programs for children of parents who qualify for subsidized child care at Daley, Kennedy-King, Malcolm X, Olive-Harvey, and Truman Colleges and Dawson Technical Institute. Period of performance: July 1, 1998 through June 30, 1999.

Foster Parent Training (PD# 9860). Harold Washington College has requested \$105,456 from the Department of Children and Family Services to prepare qualified adults to become foster parents. Period of performance: July 1, 1998 through June 30, 1999.

Adult Tech Prep Bridge Program (PD# 9861). Daley College will serve as a subcontractor to the University of Illinois at Chicago to provide training and support to adults from high-poverty communities who desire to enter postsecondary education. The subcontract agreement is for \$20,000. Period of performance: October 1, 1998 through September 30, 1999.

CONTRACT AMENDMENTS

Illinois Small Business Innovation Resource (SBIR) Center (PD# 9784). Daley College has received a contract modification for a \$5,000 increase from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs. Period of Performance: July 1, 1997 through June 30, 1998.

Learning Resource Center Information Infrastructure (PD# 9812). Wright College has requested an additional \$2,000 from the Illinois Board of High Education to upgrade computer workstations. Period of performance: June 1 through August 30, 1998.

that the Board of Trustees approves submission of these proposals to the appropriate funding agencies, and authorizes the execution of all documents by the Chancellor or the Executive Director of Resource Development, the Assistant Secretary of the Board and the General Counsel for the acceptance of any funding that may be forthcoming; said funds to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth by the grantors, and not to be expended by the Board for any other purposes.
