THE CHANCELLOR

that proposals, contracts, and other special funding instruments are under development or have been submitted by staff at this time.

NEW GRANTS

Expansion and Enhancement of Existing Networks (PD# 9882). Wright College has requested \$4,845 from the Illinois State Library to upgrade the library network server.

Local Area Network (PD# 9883). Wright College has requested \$11,027 from the Illinois State Library to install a library network at Wright South.

Chicago Regional Manufacturing Workforce Development Partnership (PD# 9884). Wright College (with the College of DuPage, Harper College, Joliet Junior College, Moraine Valley College, and South Suburban College) has requested \$130,000 (\$21,000 for Wright College) from the Illinois Board of Higher Education to support manufacturing services and programs. Period of performance: September 1, 1998 through August 31, 1999.

Urban Working Connections Project (PD# 9885). Daley College has requested \$271,090 from the American Association of Community Colleges to create a model for preparing underserved urban Chicago students to succeed in jobs that emphasize information technology skills. Period of performance: March 1, 1999 through June 30, 2001.

Business and International Education Program (PD# 9886). Truman College (with the North Business Industrial Council - NORBIC) has requested \$154,801 from the U.S. Department of Education to develop curriculum for promoting international understanding of economic enterprises. Period of performance: September 1, 1999 through August 31, 2001.

Project C-AMPS: Chicago's Added Minority Participation in the Sciences (PD# 9887). Harold Washington College (with the Illinois Institute of Technology, University of Illinois at Chicago, Northern Illinois University, Northwestern University, and Chicago Public Schools) has requested \$500,000 from the Office of Naval Research to conduct activities that will improve recruitment and retention in postsecondary fields of mathematics, science, and engineering; improve transfer rates; and prepare students for possible matriculation to graduate programs. Period of performance: October 1, 1999 through September 30, 2002.

Business/College Partnership for Environmental Problem Solving Through Education (PD# 9888). Wright College has requested \$212,000 from the National Science Foundation to provide local businesses with environmental compliance assistance. Period of performance: January 5, 1999 through December 31, 2001.

Reinventing American Identity (PD# 9889). Truman College has requested \$150,000 from the U.S. Department of Education (Office of Postsecondary Education) to redesign curriculum and instructional methods to unite cultural, social, and professional identities of immigrant Americans and other students. Period of performance: September 1, 1999 through August 31, 2001.

New Faculty Mentoring Program (PD# 9890). Daley College has requested \$200,000 from the U.S. Department of Education (Office of Postsecondary Education) to establish a model program for recruiting and preparing teacher education majors for faculty positions at Daley College. Period of performance: September 1, 1999 through August 31, 2002.

Advanced Technology Education Program (PD# 9891). Daley College (with Governor State, St. Xavier, Chicago Public Schools, and the Center for International Technology) has requested \$1,323,905 (\$108,000 for Daley College) from the National Science Foundation to improve the high-technology skills of elementary and secondary school teachers and strengthen classroom instruction. Period of performance: July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2002.

Student Success Center (PD# 9892). Daley College has requested \$222,368 from the U.S. Department of Education (Office of Postsecondary Education) to significantly reduce attrition by establishing a student success center at Daley College. Period of performance: September 1, 1999 through August 31, 2002.

Discover DePaul: Access, Persistence, and Success (PD# 9893). DePaul University and City Colleges of Chicago are requesting \$236,848 from the U.S. Department of Education (Office of Postsecondary Education) to provide a curriculum-based program for students typically under represented on college campuses. Period of performance: September 1, 1999 through August 31, 2002.

Head Start/Child Care: Extended Hours (PD# 9894). District Office has requested \$569,572 from the Chicago Department of Human Services to provide extended night time head start/child care to low-income parents at Kennedy-King College and Dawson Technical Institute. Period of performance: December 1, 1998 through November 30, 1999.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

Austin YouthNet Program, 1999 (PD# 9881). Wright College has requested \$160,000 from the Chicago Department of Human Services to provide a positive alternative to drugs and gangs for youth in the Austin community. Period of performance: January 1 through December 31, 1999.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Olson International has donated a rotary drill press to the Humbolt Park Vocational Center at Wright College. The Radial Master Drill Press has an estimated value of \$5,000.00. This equipment will be used to help train students in Computerized Numerical Control and Machining Clock Hour Vocational Programs.
