REPORTS

that the Natural Science Department held it's first Student Science Symposium on October 8, 1998 at which 15 students who participated in the Summer Science research programs at Chicago State University presented their research results. Eight students are alumni of Kennedy-King College, and seven students are currently enrolled at Kennedy-King College; and

that these students are participants in the CLIMB/ChAMP Programs. The Science Symposium is the result of The Chicago Linkage for Minorities (CLIMB) in Biomedical Sciences (a program designed to help increase the successful transfer of students to a four-year college or university in biomedical sciences and biomedical research); the purpose of Chicago Alliance for Minority Participation (ChAMP) Program is to increase the number of undergraduate and graduate degrees awarded to under-represented minorities in science, mathematics, engineering and technology (SMET) by the year 2000; and

that the College's Natural Science Department is continuing to meet the needs of the science community and the high demands of the global market.
