OPENING ENROLLMENT REPORT -- 1999 SUMMER SEMESTER CITY COLLEGES OF CHICAGO

THE CHANCELLOR

REPORTS that as of Census Date, unduplicated headcount enrollment in all programs reached 54,620 students, and the Full-Time-Equivalent (FTE) enrollment reached 27,256 FTE students (Tables 1 and 2). Opening summer enrollment figures represent a *snapshot of enrollments* as of Census Date (June 30, 1999) and do not include registrations that will take place in several programs during the summer term. State and federal government agencies use census date information to report educational statistics.

A total of 44,814 headcount students and 26,599 FTE students were reported to the Illinois Community College Board. ICCB figures do not include Special Interest or Military enrollments because they are not reimbursed by the state.

Headcount enrollment in the credit program reached 12,316 students, an increase of 1.7 percent over the previous year. The credit FTE enrollment reached 7,718 FTE students, which represents a 5 percent increase over the previous year.

Headcount enrollment in college credit, pre-credit, and vocational skills reached 13,466 students, a decrease of 3 percent compared to summer 1998 (Table 1 and Figure 1). These programs represent the traditional baccalaureate/transfer, occupational and remedial courses in the district. FTE enrollment reached 8,374 students, a decrease of 0.8 percent (Table 2 and Figure 1).


Headcount enrollment in the ALSP program reached 28,804 students, a decrease of 5.5 percent compared to summer 1998 (Tables 1 and 3; Figure 3). FTE enrollment reached 17,044 FTE students, a decrease of 13.9 percent (Tables 2 and 3; Figure 3).



Opening summer enrollment figures represent a snapshot of enrollments as of Census Date, and do not include registrations in programs starting after census date




