that proposals, contracts, and other special funding instruments are under development or have been submitted by staff at this time.

NEW GRANTS

Illinois Cooperative Work Study Program (PD#9940) Wright College, Humboldt Park Vocational Education Center, has requested \$36,000 from the Illinois State Board of Higher Education to develop and implement a cooperative work study program. Period of performance: July 1, 1999 through June 30, 1999.

Illinois Cooperative Work Study Program (PD# 9941) Daley College has requested \$80,000 from the Illinois State Board of Higher Education to partially support internships for up to 60 students enrolled in the Manufacturing Technology Program. Period of performance: July 1, 1999 through June 30, 1999.

Charting the Course K-16 Project (PD#9942) District Office has requested \$567,937 in HECA funding from the Illinois State Board of Higher Education to pilot, evaluate and revise the initiatives developed in the first year by the Chicago K-16 Partnership. The partners consist of City Colleges, the Chicago Public Schools, Chicago State University, Northeastern Illinois University, University of Illinois at Chicago and Northern Illinois University. Initiatives include implementation of English and Mathematic articulation agreements which delineate the alignment of standards, early college entrance testing, and sharing of faculty development resources. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000.

CIRCA-Chicago International and Regional Career Academy (PD#9943) Daley College has requested \$665,570 from the U.S. Department of Education to pilot the academy which encourages both bilingual and English speaking underrepresented groups to enter careers in technology and business with enhanced communication skills. Period of Performance: October 1, 1999 through September 30, 2002.

Science Careerlinks (PD#9944) Harold Washington College has requested \$107,986 from the U.S. Department of Education to establish a hands-on summer program to encourage junior high school and high school minority females to continue mathematics and science subjects throughout their educational career. This would allow them to obtain high paying jobs in science and technology. Period of Performance: September 15, 1999 through August 15, 2002.

Steps to Success: Counseling from Education to Careers (PD# 9945) Truman College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Community College Faculty Association for \$1,000 to host a professional development workshop for community college counseling faculty. By linking this activity to other critical initiatives such as IAI, SCANS and P-16, the Counseling Department at Truman and the ICCFA can help to create, promote and implement best practices in teaching and learning for counseling faculty in the State. Period of Performance: August 1, 1999 through July 31, 1999.

Bring in the Expert (PD# 9946) Truman College has requested \$4,500 from the Illinois State Library to train all their library staff, including part-timers and work study students, in the new library automation system so they can properly train students to use the system.

Youth Skills Development and Training Project (PD#9947) District Office has requested \$412,500 from the Alternative Schools Network to serve as a demonstration project to reclaim DCFS youth who have dropped out of school and provide them with an academic program and support services that will assist them in graduating from high school and leading independent lives. Period of Performance: April 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

UIC Grant for Tech Prep Bridge Program (PD#9948) Daley Colleges has requested \$15,000 from the University of Illinois to recruit individuals from high poverty communities and train them for well-paying advanced technology careers. Period of Performance: October 1, 1999 through September 30, 2000.

A Bridge to Advanced Technological Education (PD#9949) Daley College has requested \$58,592 from the University of Illinois to develop curricula for programs designed to provide a bridge to advanced technological education for adults who lack the basic skills and knowledge. Period of Performance: June 15, 1999 through May 31, 2000.

Chicago Manufacturing Center Affiliate (PD#9950) Daley College has requested \$100,000 from the Chicago Manufacturing Center to help improve the competitive positions of the manufacturing companies in Chicago, through operational assessments, technical assessments and work fore preparation. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000.

Career Access Center Job Education and Training Project (PD#9951) Kennedy-King College, Dawson Technical Institute, has requested \$85,000 from the Illinois Community College Board to provide economically disadvantaged adults with remediation in Reading and Math so that they meet training program entrance requirements. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000.

RECOMMENDS

that the Board of Trustees approves submission of these proposals to the appropriate funding agencies, and authorizes the execution of all documents by the Chancellor or the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, the Assistant Secretary of the Board and the General Counsel for acceptance of any funding that may be forthcoming; said funds to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth by the grantor, and not to be expended by Board for any other purposes.
