THE CHANCELLOR

that proposals, contracts, and other special funding instruments are under development or have been submitted by staff at this time.

NEW GRANTS

Title III Strengthening Institutions Project (PD# 9915). Malcolm X College is requesting \$350,000 from the U.S. Department of Education to provide additional services to students in an effort to achieve higher completion and retention rates. Period of performance: September 1, 1999 through August 31, 2000.

Advancing Opportunities Program Supportive Services Payments (PD# 9916). District Office has requested \$100,000 from the Illinois Community College Board to provide support services to students in the Opportunities Program. Period of performance: January 1 through June 30, 1999.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

Hispanic Math/Science Education Initiative (PD# 9912). Malcolm X College is serving as a subcontractor to the University of Illinois at Chicago who submitted a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education to provide a Saturday enrichment program that strengthens students' science and math skills. The subcontract to Malcolm X College is for \$8,000. Period of performance: September 1, 1998 through August 31, 1999.

Small Business Technology Resource Center (PD# 9913). Daley College has requested \$70,000 from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs to (1) provide quality assistance to high tech small businesses, and (2) encourage start-up, growth, and development of new small businesses in Illinois. Period of performance: July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000.

1999 Proyecto Access (PD# 9914). Daley College, a subcontractor to the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities, will receive \$80,000 from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration to identify and provide middle school and high school students with an academic enrichment program in engineering, science, and other related areas. Period of performance: January 1 through December 31, 1999.

THE CHANCELLOR

RECOMMENDS

that the Board of Trustees approves submission of these proposals to the appropriate funding agencies, and authorizes the execution of all documents by the Chancellor or the Executive Director of Resource Development, the Assistant Secretary of the Board and the General Counsel for the acceptance of any funding that may be forthcoming; said funds to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth by the grantors, and not to be expended by the Board for any other purposes.
