OPENING ENROLLMENT REPORT: SPRING 1999  
CITY COLLEGES OF CHICAGO

THE CHANCELLOR

REPORTS that as of Census Date, unduplicated headcount enrollment in all programs reached 75,723 students, and the Full-Time-Equivalent (FTE) enrollment reached 38,742 FTE students (Tables 1 and 2). Opening spring enrollment figures represent a *snapshot of enrollments* as of Census Date (February 15, 1999) and do not include registrations that will take place in several programs during the spring term. State and federal government agencies use census date information to report educational statistics.

A total of 64,891 headcount students and 37,682 FTE students were reported to the Illinois Community College Board. ICCB figures do not include Special Interest or Military enrollments because they are not reimbursed by the state.

Headcount enrollment in college credit, pre-credit, and vocational skills reached 33,509 students, a decrease of 1.4 percent compared to spring 1998 (Table 1 and Figure 1). These programs represent the traditional baccalaureate/transfer, occupational and remedial courses in the district. FTE enrollment reached 19,098 students, an increase of 1.1 percent (Table 2 and Figure 1).

Headcount enrollment in the ALSP program reached 30,293 students, a decrease of 3 percent compared to spring 1998 (Tables 1 and 3; Figure 3). FTE enrollment reached 17,900 FTE students, a decrease of 14.5 percent (Tables 2 and 3; Figure 3). The overall FTE decline in ALSP is associated with the length of the ALSP modules at Truman College. Truman College will offer a second 8-week module which will bring Truman College and the CCC FTE enrollment to the level of the previous year. In contrast, the headcount decline in ALSP enrollments is associated with the decline in ALSP enrollments at Kennedy-King college, where a significant number of off-campus sites were closed or not accessible during registration due to the snowstorm of early January. Kennedy-King college is offering a special session the first week of March to recoup lost enrollment.

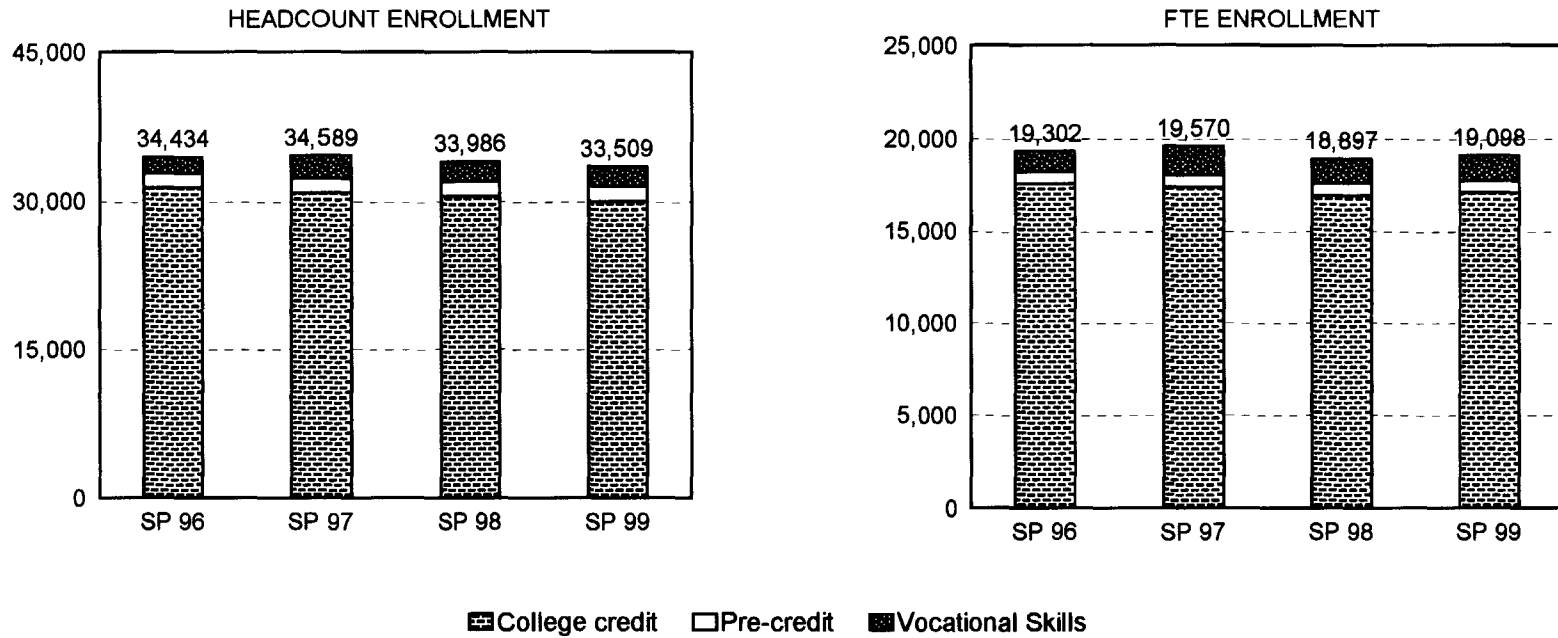

**Opening spring enrollment figures represent a snapshot of enrollments as of Census Date, and do not include registrations in programs starting after census date**

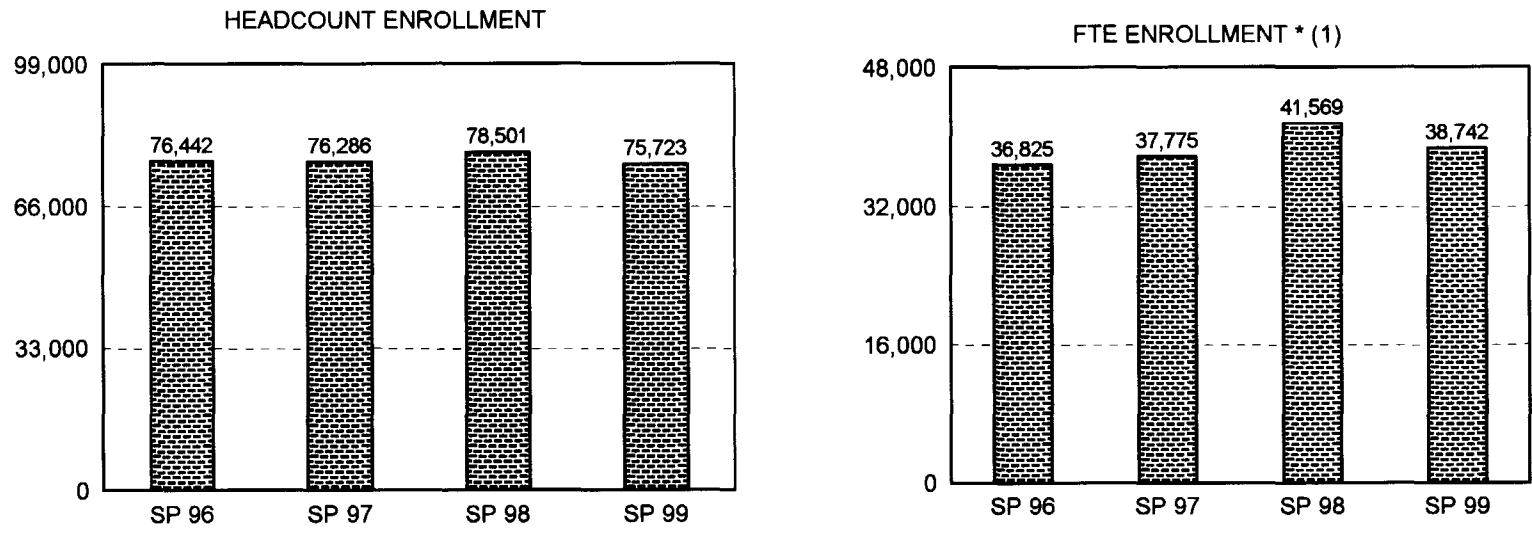

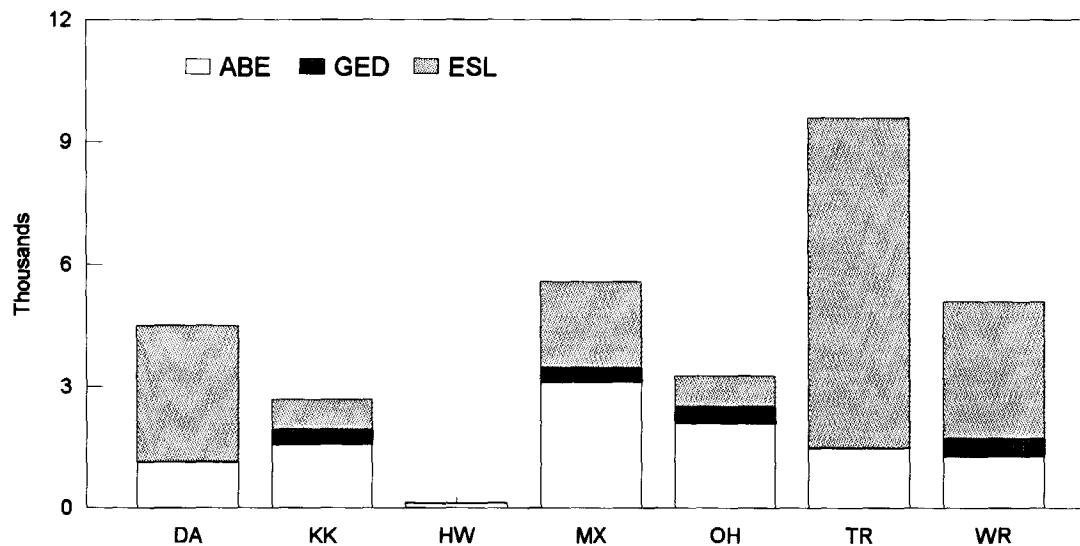
