that proposals, contracts, and other special funding instruments are under development or have been submitted by staff at this time.

NEW GRANTS**Physician Assistant Program - Malcolm X College**

Malcolm X College has received \$100,000 from the Cook County Bureau of Health Services in recognition of the value received by Cook County Hospital from the College's Physician Assistant Program. The grant will provide financial assistance to deserving Program students.

Quality Enhancement Grant (PD#9921)

Daley, Truman, and Kennedy-King Colleges, and the Dawson Technical Institute have requested funding from the Illinois Department of Human Services to enhance the quality of the Child Care Services they provided. Period of Performance: DA (\$20,000), DTI (\$37,293), MX (\$20,000) and TR (\$40,000) from July 1, 1999 - June 30, 2000, KK (\$60,000) from July 1, 1999 - June 30, 2002.

Child Care Access Means Parents in School (PD#9922)

Truman College has requested \$38,516 from the U. S. Department of Education to support the participation of low-income parents in post-secondary education through the provision of campus-based child care services. Period of Performance: August 1, 1999 - July 31, 2000.

Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs--GEAR-UP (PD#9928) Daley College has requested \$1,500,000 from the U.S. Department of Education to increase college enrollment of participating Chicago Public School students. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 - June 30, 2000.

Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs--GEAR-UP (PD#9929) Malcolm X College has requested \$400,000 from the U.S. Department of Education to increase enrollment of disadvantaged students. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 - June 30, 2000.

Technology Innovation in Internet Course Development for Linking with Videoconference Activities (PD#9930) The District Office has requested \$150,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education to develop web-based instruction to enhance the integration of technologies for education, particularly as education impacts community programming. Period of Performance: September 1, 1999 - August 31, 2000.

Chicago Consortium for Higher Education - "Reach for the Sky: Science and Math Education Cooperation" (PD#9931) The Consortium has requested \$100,000 from the Illinois Board of Higher Education to enhance teacher preparation and certification, ultimately impacting the scientific literacy of Chicago's community of Learners. Project partners include City Colleges, Chicago State University, The Adler Planetarium, the Charles Hayes Center (Chicago Housing Authority), Chicago Public School's TAMS. Period of Performance: September 1, 1999 - August 31, 2000.

Chicago Consortium for Higher Education - Consortium Administration Grant (PD#9932) The Consortium has requested \$120,000 from the Illinois State Board of Higher Education to support Consortium administration around regional educational planning, resource sharing, initiative coordination, and effective utilization of telecommunication resources. There are now twenty Consortium member organizations including City Colleges. Period of Performance: September 1, 1999 - August 31, 2000.

Chicago Consortium for Higher Education (PD#9933)

The Consortium has requested \$100,000 from the Illinois State Board of Higher Education to fund the continuation of Technology Development and Enhancement Institute for African American and Latino faculty in Chicago. Period of Performance: September 1, 1999 - August 31, 2000.

Reach for the Sky (PD#9934)

City Colleges is a partner in a \$650,000 Telecommunications Information Infrastructure Program (TIAP) grant submitted by the Adler Planetarium & Astronomy Museum to the U.S. Department of Commerce National Telecommunication Information Administration. Other partners include Chicago State University and the Charles A. Hayes Center (Chicago Housing Authority). The funds will be used to deliver network based learning resources to Chicago Public School Teachers and faculty members from Chicago State University and City Colleges, and on-line informational, educational and cultural services to participating families. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 - July 1, 2002.

Illinois Professional Learners Partnership: Enhancing Teacher Education through Statewide Partnership (PD#9937) City Colleges of Chicago, Illinois State University, Northeastern Illinois University, Roosevelt University, the University of Illinois at Urbana/Champaign, and the Illinois Federation of Teachers are requesting \$4,375,000 from the U.S. Department of Education to redesign and transform the way Colleges of Education, Arts and Sciences prepare their graduates to teach in high-need Illinois K-12 schools. Illinois State University will be the fiscal agent for the Program; City Colleges will receive approximately \$100,000. Period of Performance: September 1, 1999 - August 31, 2004.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

Native American Heritage as Survival, Storytellers of the 21st Century

PD#9919 Truman College's Institute for Native American Development has requested \$47,270 from the Illinois Arts Council to encourage and increase student retention, and to enhance student self-esteem by promotion and instillment of cultural pride. This is done partly through incorporating Native American history and literature into the INAD GED instruction program curriculum. Period of Performance: September 1, 1999 - August 30, 2000.

ALSP/Adult Education and Family Literacy PD#9923

The District Office has requested \$8,000,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education's Community & Family Partnership Division to support GED and Vocational (Secondary) programs including Family Literacy and support services for the Adult Learning Skills Programs of the District. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 - June 30, 2000.

Chicago Manufacturing Center Consortium (HECA) PD#9924

Daley College, in partnership with Illinois Institute of Technology and Northern Illinois University, has requested \$250,000 to provide manufacturing modernization and other assistance to small and medium size manufacturing companies. Period of Performance: September 1, 1999 - August, 2000.

Alternative Education Consortium PD#9925

The District Office has requested \$2,273,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education to fund the Alternative Education Consortium. This consortium is a unique partnership between public, private and community-based organizations designed to provide alternative educational programs and services to reclaim youth 16-21 years old that have dropped out of high school. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000.

State Pre-Kindergarten PD#9926

Daley, Kennedy-King, Malcolm X, Truman and Olive-Harvey Colleges and the Dawson Technical Institute have requested \$709,877 from the Chicago Public Schools to provide an enriched Developmental Appropriate Program to serve at risk children ages 3-5 with priority given to children of teenage parents. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 - June 30, 2000.

Summer Food Program PD#9927

The District Office has requested \$190,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education to provide hot meals to National Youth Sports Program participants. The grant will also provide meals to children participating in the Upward Bound and Chicago Prep Programs at Daley College. Period of Performance: June 1, 1999 - September 30, 1999.

Minority Student Transfer Success Through Articulation with Community-Based Organizations (PD#9935)

Truman College is requesting \$55,600 from the Illinois State Board of Education to increase the number of minority, disadvantaged, and "at risk" students who enroll in credit courses at the City Colleges of Chicago. Period of Performance: September 1, 1999 - August 31, 2000.

Tech Prep PD#9936

The District Office has requested \$409,144 from the Illinois State Board of Education to provide technical preparation in specific career fields and combines two years of secondary and post-secondary education in a non-duplicative sequence of courses. The total consists of \$290,975 in State Funding and \$118,169 in Federal Funding. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 - June 30, 2000.

Carl Perkins - Program Improvement Grant (PD#9938)

The District Office is requesting \$163,987 from the Illinois State Board of Education to support improvement in career and technical education programs. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 - June 30, 2000.

Carl Perkins Grant PD#(9939)

The District Office is requesting \$3,728, 222 from the Illinois State Board of Education to provide student skill attainment and program performance. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 - June 30, 2000.

THE CHANCELLOR

RECOMMENDS

that the Board of Trustees approves submission of these proposals to the appropriate funding agencies, and authorizes the execution of all documents by the Chancellor or the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, the Assistant Secretary of the Board and the General Counsel for the acceptance of any funding that may be forthcoming; said funds to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth by the grantors, and not to be expended by the Board for any other purposes.
