NEW GRANTS

Chancellor's Scholars Program (PD# 9979) The District Office has requested \$192,584 from the National Science Foundation to provide scholarships for 60 students enrolled full-time in Associate Degree Programs in Mathematics, Computer Information Systems or Engineering. Period of Performance: January 1, 2000 through December 31, 2001.

College "Values" Tool (PD#9981) Harold Washington College (HWC) has requested \$10,000 from the Illinois Community College Board to identify HWC 'values' and develop behaviorally anchored interview questions based on those values to use as part of the college's hiring process. Period of Performance: October 1, 1999 through March 31, 2000.

Upgrading Science Teaching Skills of Secondary Teachers (PD# 9982) Daley College has requested \$38,381 from the Dwight D. Eisenhower Professional Development Program of the Illinois State Board Higher Education to provide training for secondary teachers in the latest and most effective strategies for teaching Science. Period of Performance: June 19, 2000 through February 16, 2001.

Domestic Violence Prevention Program (PD# 9983) Kennedy-King College has been awarded \$150,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education through an appropriation from the State Legislature to plan a domestic violence prevention program. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000.

Laptops for Learning (PD#9987) Wright College has requested \$2,400 from the Illinois State Library to purchase three laptop computers for use in their library. Period of Performance: September 1, 1999 through November 30, 1999.

Molecular Biology Training Workshop (PD#9988) Olive-Harvey College has requested \$300,000 from the Advanced Technological Education Program of the National Science Foundation to provide an eight-week summer program to familiarize young minority students with basic molecular biological techniques used in research and in diagnostic laboratories. The workshop will be conducted in cooperative with the University of Illinois at Chicago, West Side Veterans Administration Medical Center and the University of Wisconsin Biotechnology Center at Madison. Period of Performance: October 1, 1999 through September 30, 2002.

Linking Values and Workplace Competencies (PD#9989) The District Office has requested \$10,000 from the Illinois Community College Board to implement a program integrating core values analysis and SCANS Workplace Competencies. The project has an overall goal of linking national norms for workplace competencies with faculty and student ethics and values. Period of Performance: October 1, 1999 through September 30, 2000.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

FY2000 Child and Adult Care Food Program (PD#9980) The District Office has requested \$231,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education to provide nutritious meals for children attending Child Development Centers at Daley, Kenned-King, Malcolm X, Olive-Harvey and Truman Colleges, and the Dawson Technical Institute. Period of Performance: October 1, 1999 through September 30, 2000.

Head Start-Wrap Around (PD# 9984) The District Office has requested \$221,095 from the Chicago Department of Human Services to provide Head Start funding for children of low income parents at Kennedy-King and Malcolm X Colleges. Period of Performance: December 1, 1999 through November 30, 2000.

Head Start-Full Day (PD#9985) The District Office has requested \$159,992 to provide Head Start funding for children of low income parents at Olive-Harvey College. Period of Performance: December 1, 1999 through November 30, 2000.

Head Start/Child Care - Extended Hours/Nighttime (PD#9986) The District Office has requested \$664,061 from the Chicago Department of Human Services to provide extended day and nighttime care for children of low income parents at Kennedy-King College and Dawson Technical Institute Child Development Centers. Period of Performance: December 1, 1999 through November 30, 2000.

Opening Doors and Changing Lives Program (PD #9990) Kennedy-King College has been awarded \$400,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education through an appropriation from the State Legislature to continue the Opening Doors and Changing Lives job training program. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000.

AMENDMENT

Truants' Alternative and Optional Education Program (PD#9915)

District Office requested \$2,273,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education to fund the Alternative Education Consortium and received \$2,411,512. This is an increase of \$138,512. The consortium is comprised of the Middles Colleges at Kennedy-King (Benjamin E. Mays Academy), Olive-Harvey and Truman Colleges, the Institute for Native American Development at Truman College, and 12 community-based organizations. All programs are designed to provide alternative educational programs and services to reclaim youth 16-21 years old that have dropped out of high school. IBSE approved the distribution of \$1,050,045 in sub-contracts to the agencies listed below. Period of Performance: July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000.


