
NEW GRANTS

Staff Development Project (PD# 9974) Malcolm X College has requested \$145,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education for an Adult Education Administration Grant to develop videotapes and resource guides that focus on specific literacy topics and issues of particular interest to adult education practitioners who work with adults with special learning needs. Period of Performance: August, 1999 through June, 2000.

Fulbright Scholar Program (PD# 9976) Professor Dennis Lehman of Harold Washington College has submitted an application to become a Fulbright Scholar. Through a lecture/research assignment to the City Colleges of Birmingham, England, he will test reading and learning models as they apply to chemistry and physical science in order to develop new models for distance learning in other educational venues. The stipend request is \$12,000. Period of Performance: September, 2000 through January, 2001.

Staff Development Project (PD#9977) Olive-Harvey College has requested \$35,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education for an Adult Education Administration Grant to develop a resource manual for the successful transition of adult education students to postsecondary education and careers. Period of Performance: August, 1999 through June, 2000.

Women's Empowerment Project (PD #9978) The District Office working in cooperation with the Southwest Women Working Together, the Chicago Women in Trades, the Illinois Department of Employment Securities and the Electricians Joint Apprenticeship Training Trust have submitted a proposal to the Illinois Department of Human Services to establish a training program to prepare women on welfare for jobs in the trade unions. Southwest Women Working Together will be the fiscal agent. The classes will take place at the West Side Technical Institute of Daley College. Daley College will receive \$26,000 to cover instructional costs, in addition to space, phone and copy machine costs. Period of Performance: August, 1999 - June, 2000.

KaBoom Project (PD#9964) - Amendment In Board Report No. 21381, Kennedy-King, Olive-Harvey and Truman Colleges were authorized to participate in a playground development matching grant project with KaBoom, a not-for-profit corporation which works with communities to build playgrounds. Each college was required to raise \$10,000 in support of the project. Due to design selection and other costs related to installation of equipment at the playground sites, the colleges will be required to raise additional funds for the project in total amounts not to exceed the following: Kennedy-King College, \$20,000; Olive-Harvey College, \$20,000; and Truman College, \$40,000.
