NEW GRANTS

Industrial Training Program (PD# 0031)

The District Office is requesting funding of \$10,000 through a subcontract to a grant from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs (DCCA) to the Illinois State Chamber of Commerce. The funds would support an industrial training project which would take place during the period from April 1, 2000 through June 30, 2000.

Prairie State 2000 Individual Training Assistance Program (PD# 0032)

The District Office is requesting funding of \$10,000 from the Prairie State 2000 Authority for an "Individual Training Assistance Project" which would take place during the period from April 1, 2000 through June 30, 2000.

MXC Family Literacy Project (PD# 0034)


Malcolm X College has requested \$35,000 from the Secretary of State's Literacy Office for a project to provide a literacy program to the parents of Head Start children and other parents reading below the 9th grade level. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2000 to June 30, 2001.

Malcolm X Child Development Center Summer Literacy Enrichment Program (PD# 0035)

Malcolm X College has requested \$4,500 from the Illinois Secretary of State's Office for a summer literacy enrichment program which will be targeted at helping families incorporate family literacy in their everyday lives. The project's performance period will be from June 1, 2000 to August 15, 2000.

Native American Heritage as Survival: Storytellers of the 21st Century (PD# 0036)

A grant of \$10,000 has been request by Truman College's Institute for Native American Development. The project would provide outreach events to the Native community including special role model speakers, workshops and other community events during the Native American

heritage month. The Illinois Arts Council is the prospective funding source and the period of performance is from September 1, 2000 to June 30, 2001.

Vanguard College Proposal (PD# 0037)

Richard J. Daley College has applied to be a Vanguard College in the Learning College Project of the League for Innovation in the Community College. The letter of application included indications that the Daley College will satisfy the five criteria for this significant recognition: commitment to five years (minimum) of participation; resources; assessment; personal commitment; institutional commitment.

Instant English Online (PD# 0038)

Truman College has requested \$101,304 from the Fund for the Improvement of Post Secondary Education (FIPSE) for a project to offer an on-line language program that teaches non-literate, non-native English speakers to read and write. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2000 to June 30, 2002.

Title V - Developing Hispanic-Serving Institutions Program (PD# 0039)

Truman College has requested \$1,843,632 from the U.S. Department of Education for a program which will strengthen Truman as an Hispanic serving institution by providing faculty development programs and student services which are targeted at increasing retention and course completion rates in basic skills, and in math, science, and technology programs. The period of performance for the project is from October 1, 2000 to September 30, 2005

NYSP, The Voyager Project (PD# 0040)

Malcolm X College has received a grant for \$75,000 from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for the *Voyager Project*. This pilot project will incorporate a K-16 initiative into the National Youth Sports Program at Malcolm X. During the summer, 200 elementary and middle school students will participate in a five week program which stimulates, academically enriches, and provides hands-on activities related to medical and health science professions. The period of performance for this project is from July 1, 1999 to June 30, 2001.

Institute for Native American Kids Fund (PD# 0041)

Truman College has requested \$25,000 from the WGN Neediest Kids Fund to assist Native American students attending Truman College and Truman Middle College and to provide culturally based GED classes. The period of performance for this project is from September 1, 2000 to January 31, 2001

CONTINUATION GRANTS

National Youth Sports Programs (PD# 0030)

The City Colleges of Chicago has requested refunding from the NYSP Fund for summer, 2000 programs. Federal funds are coordinated through the NCAA and provided for "Youth Education through Sports" programs for children ages 10 to 18 for the period from June 19 through August 2, 2000. Program requests are being made for:

- Kennedy-King College (\$70,000)
- Daley College (\$66,900)
- Olive-Harvey College (\$75,000)
- Malcolm X College (\$82,500)
- Truman College (\$58,800)

In addition, the District Office will support NYSP participants by operating a food services program, funded by the Illinois State Board of Education, and a bus transportation program, funded by the U.S. Department of Transportation.


Technology Enhancement Grant PD# 0033 - revised from PD# 9816)

Revisions to the grant funded project (which was originally approved by the Board at its March 5, 1998 meeting) include a no cost extension, from June 30, 1999 to June 30, 2000 and a modification in the purpose of the project to support alternative communications technology (including the option to implement VOIP) over traditional PBX phone switching technology.
