NEW GRANTS

Information Technology Articulation (PD#0103)

The District Office will submit a proposal to the National Science Foundation for \$75,000 to work with DePaul University on the articulation of Information Technology Programs. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2001 through December 31, 2003.

Hispanic Mathematics/Science Education Initiative (PD#0104)

Malcolm X College has received a subcontract of a grant from the Illinois Board of Higher Education to the University of Illinois at Chicago. The subcontract, for \$4,000, will allow Malcolm X to provide space and to collaborate on this project to improve the mathematics and science education of Hispanics. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 1999 through August 31, 2000

The Monarch Project: A Multi-Cultural Program for Early Childhood Literacy (PD#0105)

The District Office has submitted a proposal to the U.S. Department of Education for \$80,000,000 over a five year period, to produce a series of early childhood language development television programs. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2001 through December 31, 2005

Opening Doors/Domestic Violence (PD#0106)

The Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs (DCCA) has awarded \$550,000 to Kennedy-King College for a project which will initiate activities to reduce domestic violence. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001.

Post Secondary Tech Prep Transitional Services (PD#0107)

The District Office has received a grant of \$35,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) for a project to provide transitional support to increase the number of students who continue from the Chicago Public Schools into the City Colleges of Chicago in occupational programs. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001.

Workforce Investment Act: Core and Intensive Services (PD#0108)

Truman College has received funding of \$100,000 from the Mayor's Office of Workforce Development for a project to provide employment services to community members. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001.

2000 Kraft Employee Fund (PD#0111)

Truman College has submitted a proposal for \$40,000 to the Kraft Employee Fund for a project to provide support for Truman College's Child Care Center. The performance period for this project is from November 1, 2000 through October 31, 2001.

Organization of Transportation Investment and Operations (PD#0112)

Daley College has received a subcontract of \$25,000 from the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System as part of a grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation. Daley College will assist in leadership training and data collection related to regional transportation issues. The performance period for this project is from April 1, 2000 through March 31, 2001.

Intergovernmental Agreement for Physician Assistant Student Grants (PD#0117)

The Cook County Board of Commissioners has awarded \$100,000 for scholarships and book vouchers for students in the Malcolm X College Physicians Assistant Program. A maximum of \$5,000 per student will be disbursed with a total maximum of \$27,000 for students who are expected to graduate in the Class of 2001, and \$63,000 for students who are expected to graduate in the class of 2002. The performance period for this project is from August 1, 2000 through August 31, 2002, except that funds not disbursed to students by the expiration of this agreement may be disbursed from a Physician Assistant Scholarship Fund, which will be created, on a continuing basis until these funds are exhausted.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

Illinois Community College Board Fiscal Year 2001 Grants to Colleges (PD# 0109)

The Illinois Community College Board has released information about annual grants to the colleges and the City Colleges of Chicago will receive the following grants for fiscal year 2001:

The *Workforce Development Grants* (above) will include *Business and Industry Services* (\$559,833), *Education to Careers* (\$248,353) and *Welfare to Work* (\$996,179) and the *Advanced Technology Grants* (above) will include *Instructional Equipment* (\$780,235), *Technology Support* (\$282,938), and *Staff Technical Skills* (\$443,437). In addition, Olive-Harvey College will be receiving an additional grant of \$500,000, for the *Probation Challenge Program* via an appropriation to the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs (DCCA).

Chicago Consortium for Higher Education (PD#0102)

The District Office has submitted a proposal for \$125,500 to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for the administrative costs of the Chicago Consortium for Higher Education. CCHE serves as one of Illinois' regional higher education consortia, has been in existence since 1993 and provides services for its higher education members in the Chicago area, including the operation of the video conferencing system between the colleges and universities. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2000 through August 31, 2001.

Truants' Alternative and Optional Education Program (TAOEP) (PD#0113)

The Illinois State Board of Education has refunded the TAOEP, at the District Office, for \$2,411,512. This program is a unique partnership between public, private and community-based organizations designed to provide alternative educational programs and services to reclaimed youth, 16-21 years old, who have dropped out of high school. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001. From the grant funds, the following diploma programs and GED programs will utilize subcontracts from the City Colleges of Chicago:

Youth Skills Development Training Project (PD#0114)

The District Office has submitted a proposal, to the Alternative Schools Network of the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS), for \$275,000 to serve as a demonstration project that will reclaim DCFS youth who have dropped out of school and provide them with the academic program and support services that assist them in graduating and leading independent lives. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001.

Dropout Retrieval: Empowerment for Academic Matriculation (PD#0115)

The District Office has submitted a proposal for \$1,018,743 to the Chicago Public Schools / Youth Connection Charter School Board for a program to provide academic programs and services for retrieved high school dropouts in the CCC middle colleges. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001.

Early School Leaver Program (PD#0116)

The District Office has submitted a proposal to the Illinois State Board of Education for \$365,049 to provide a structured opportunity for youth, 16-21 years old, to complete secondary education, develop career awareness and cooperatively be placed in employment. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001.

IBM Corporation (PD#0110)

Olive-Harvey has been selected by United Way in Chicago to receive a gift of two *Young Explorers* computer systems from IBM. The two systems, valued


