NEW GRANTS

Native American Scholarship Fund, Inc. Reading Award Program (PD# 00001)
Truman College has submitted a proposal for implementation of a reading contest for Native American Students attending the GED program at Truman Middle College. The proposal, for \$1000, was submitted to the Native American Scholarship Fund, Inc. and the performance period for the project is January 1, 2000 through December 30, 2000

Systemic Changes in the Undergraduate Chemistry Curriculum (PD# 00002)
Harold Washington College has been awarded a subcontract for \$13,000 from a National Science Foundation project which is funded at Oakton Community College. The project is funded for the period from June 1, 1998 through July 31, 2000 and Washington College's subcontract will focus on improvements to the chemistry curriculum.

Internet Training for Librarians (PD# 00003) The District Office is submitting a proposal to the Institute of Museum and Library Services for \$100,000. The project will provide training for librarians in using the Internet and online services for research, assist them in setting up Web pages, and establish collective projects between librarians and faculty to set up electronic reserves and research projects. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2002.

English Literacy and Civics Education Demonstration Grants (PD# 00004)
Truman College is submitting a proposal to the U.S. Department of Education to support activities that demonstrate effective practices in providing and increasing access to English literacy programs linked to civics education. The proposal is for \$800,000 and the period of performance for the project is from June 1, 2000 through May 31, 2003.

National Hispanic Bilingual Engineering Program (PD# 00006) Daley College has been awarded a subcontract under a Department of Energy grant, DE-FG02-97EW13987, to Equity Research Corporation. The subcontract is for \$47,936.67 for the period from September 3, 1999 through September 2, 2000. The project agreement authorizes Daley College to obtain the consulting services of Francisco Javier Barajas (as an independent contractor, at the rate of \$3800 per month) for the term of the project to provide coordination and other specified services for the National Hispanic Bilingual Engineering Program.

Improving Minority Success through Articulation With Community-Based Organizations (PD# 00007)

The Illinois Board of Higher Education has approved a renewal grant, under the Higher Education Cooperation Act, for \$200,000 to the City Colleges of Chicago to improve articulation and transfer activities and to increase the number of minority students who enroll in community colleges and, subsequently, transfer to four-year institutions. The project is funded for the period from September 1, 1999 through August 31, 2000. The grant provisions include a specified fund of \$136,286 which will be provided to the colleges and other agencies as follows:


