## REPORTS

**THE CHANCELLOR**

that proposals, contracts, and other special funding instruments are under development or have been submitted by staff at this time.

**NEW GRANTS**

**Child Care and Child Care Services (PD# 99109)** The City Colleges of Chicago have submitted qualifications to the Chicago Department of Human Services for the Kennedy King Child Development Center (\$117,800) and for the Malcolm X Child Development Center (\$235,600). These centers will provide collaboration funds for child care and child care related services to children through the Head Start Wrap-Around programs for the performance period December 1, 1999 through June 6, 2000.

**ENLACE (PD# 99110)** Malcolm X has submitted a proposal to the Kellogg Foundation for a planning grant to develop a network of Community based organizations (CBO's), Public Schools (K-12), business and post-secondary institutions to strengthen the educational pipeline to secure access and retention of Latino students in post-secondary education. The requested planning grant of \$100,000 is for the performance period of December, 1999 through December, 2000.

**Department of Defense Instrumentation Program (PD# 99111)** Malcolm X has submitted a proposal to the Department of Defense for \$120,000 to acquire instruments needed to strengthen the Chemistry and Physical Science programs at the College. The period of performance is June 1, 2000 through December 31, 2001.

**UIC Community College Collaborative for Excellence in Teacher Preparation (PD# 99112)** Harold Washington College has been awarded a subcontract for \$9,837.75 from a National Science Foundation grant to the University of Illinois at Chicago. The project will focus on teacher training and curriculum reform. The performance period for the project is July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000.

**Maximizing Career Opportunities for Minority Young Adults with Disabilities (PD# 99113)** The City Colleges of Chicago is participating in the submission of a proposal with the University of Illinois at Chicago and the Chicago Public Schools to improve career opportunities for minority young adults with disabilities. The proposal is being submitted to the US Department of Education, Office of Special Education and Rehabilitation Service Administration for a total of approximately \$450,000 per year for a three year period. The City Colleges of Chicago will be a subcontractor in the project. The first year period of performance is June 1, 2000 through May 31, 2001.

**The Career Transcript System (PD# 99114)** The City Colleges of Chicago has been awarded a subcontract of a grant from the US Department of Labor to Johns Hopkins University. The subcontract, for \$308,166, is for work to be performed in conjunction with the piloting of the SCANS/2000 Career Transcript System. The period of performance is November 15, 1999 through December 31, 2001.

**Education to Careers (PD# 99115)**. City Colleges of Chicago is a named principal in the Federal *Education to Careers* grant the Chicago Public Schools is receiving through the State Board of Education. City Colleges of Chicago's portion of the plan submitted by CPS includes completion of the Center for Occupational Research Development Faculty Fellowship Partnership for 70 members of the faculty, and conducting gender equity activities with Chicago Women in Trades to ensure that the District is in compliance with Perkins regulations. One ETC coordinator will be placed at each college. City Colleges of Chicago will receive approximately \$450,000 to complete these projects. Subcontracts will be awarded to Chicago Women in Trades and the Center for Occupational Research Development. The performance period is September 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000.

**IBHE Matching Grant Program (PD# 99116)** The City Colleges of Chicago is submitting a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for funds to be used in the matching share of other federal grant proposals. The amount to be awarded will be determined by the IBHE based on the A-133 audit statement which is being submitted with the request. The period for expenditure of granted matching funds will be Fiscal Year 2000.

**Assessment of Project Skills Partnership Programs (PD# 99117)** Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal for \$10,000 to the US Department of Labor to develop and deliver the program and to survey participants in a unique training program resulting in employment in overlooked neighborhoods within the Chicagoland area. The period of performance is January 1, 2000 through December 31, 2000.

**Project CHALLENGE (PD# 99118)**. Kennedy-King College and Olive-Harvey College have submitted a proposal for \$100,000 per year for a three year period, to NASA. The goal of the project is to enhance the academic programs of minority children (K-12) in mathematics and science and to encourage more minority children to explore careers in mathematics, science, engineering and technology. The project will provide academic year and summer programs to children, provide workshops for teachers, create Teaching Resource Centers, and provide support for science and mathematics competitions. The performance period for the first year of a three year project is March 1, 2000 through April 30, 2001.

**Chicago GEAR UP Alliance (PD# 99119 - Truman College, PD# 99120 - District Office)** The City Colleges of Chicago are participating in the *Chicago Gear Up Alliance*, an effort to transform the K-16 education of disadvantaged students. The project has been funded by the US Department of Education, for five years with a total award of \$31 million to Northeastern Illinois University as the fiscal agent for the Chicago Education Alliance. First year subcontracts have been awarded to Truman College (\$281,735) and to the District Office (\$50,000). The period for performance of the first year projects is September 1, 1999 through August 30, 2000.

**A Virtual Reality Learning Laboratory (PD# 99123)** Malcolm X College is seeking

funds to furnish and staff new computer laboratories. These computer labs will have virtual reality capabilities and will be locations for learning with and creating new virtual reality lessons. Malcolm X is seeking these funds from local foundations; the amounts being requested and durations of the projects depend on the foundation which is being contacted.

#### CONTINUATION GRANTS

**Quality Enhancement - Olive-Harvey College Child Development Center (PD# 99121)** Olive-Harvey College has been awarded \$40,000 by the Illinois Department of Human Services, for the continuation of services provided by its Child Development Center. The period of performance is July 7, 1999 through June 6, 2000.

**Learning Resource Center Information Infrastructure Enhancement Grant (PD# 99122)** The District Office is submitting a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education, under the Higher Education Cooperation Act (HECA) for \$42,700 to provide supplemental assistance to the college libraries for the acquisition of workstations, servers, printers, print managers, scanners and related equipment. The period of performance is December 1, 1999 through June 2, 2000.

**Head Start Support CDA Training (PD# 99124)** Harold Washington College has been awarded grant funds from the Chicago Department of Human Services in the amount of \$467,100, to provide Head Start and Early Head Start services. The period of performance is December 1, 1999 through November 30, 2000.

**Korean American Merchants Association Scholarship (PD# 99125)** The Korean American Merchants Association has presented Kennedy-King College with a \$500 scholarship for students at its 10th Annual Food Basket Presentation on December 17, 1999.

#### AMENDMENT

**KaBoom Project (PD# 9964)** In Board Report No. 21488, Truman College was authorized to participate in the playground development matching grant project which required raising funds in an amount not to exceed \$40,000. Construction and development expenses exceeded the initial projected cost by \$10,815.30. Truman College will be required to raise additional funds to cover the final total cost of playground construction in an amount not to exceed \$50,815.30.

that the Board of Trustees approves submission of these proposals to the appropriate funding agencies, and authorizes the execution of all documents by the Chancellor or the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, the Assistant Secretary of the Board and the General Counsel for acceptance of any funding that may be forthcoming; said funds to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth by the grantor, and not to be expended by the Board for any other purposes.
