NEW GRANTS

Rail Road Conductor Training(PD#0092)

Richard J. Daley College has received a grant of \$260,700 from the Mayor's Office of Workforce Development, to provide pre-employment training to Chicago residents wanting careers in railroading. Successful completers will be interviewed for jobs with CSX RR. Historically, 97% of completers have been hired. The project's period of performance is from April 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001.

Collaborations: The Mathematics, Science-Technology Initiative PD#0093)

The City Colleges of Chicago are a collaborating partner in a IBHE funded grant project at Illinois Institute of Technology. The project (funded at \$96,000) will improve teacher and student development in mathematics, science and technology via a summer institute, conferences and the development of web sites. The performance period for this project is from December 14, 1999 until August 31, 2000.

Cooperative Work Study (PD#0094)

Wilbur Wright College and Richard J. Daley College have received grants from the Illinois Board of Higher Education for \$36,000 and \$70,000 respectively. The grants will support the cooperative work study programs on each campus by paying a portion of the salaries that students earn while in their internship positions in business and industry. The performance period for the projects is from April 4, 2000 until June 30, 2001.

Workforce Investment Services (PD# 0095)

Kennedy-King College is submitting a proposal to the Mayor's Office of Workforce Development in Chicago (MOWD) for \$300,000 to provide core and intensive services to persons referred or recruited for assistance leading to employment. The performance period for the project will be from July 1, 2000 until June 30, 2001.

Values to Action (PD#0096)

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal for \$15,000 to the Illinois Board of Higher Education under the Leadership and Core Values

initiative. The project would focus on finalizing the institutional values and mission statement by utilizing techniques to build consensus within the campus and community with regards to the role, purpose and values of the College. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2000 until June 30, 2001.

Cooperative Ventures from High School to College: Using the Web to Connect Campuses (PD#0097)

Harry S. Truman College has submitted a proposal for \$386,964 to the National Science Foundation for a project which enable high school and community college instructors, and their students, to collaborate, via the Internet, on activities which will enhance the academic success of all participants. The performance period for the project will be April 4, 2001 to May 30, 2004.

Information Technology Articulation (PD#0098)

The City Colleges of Chicago (with DePaul University as a partner) is submitting a proposal to the National Science Foundation for \$240,000 to create an effective articulation plan for the area of information technology. The performance period for the project will be from January 1, 2001 until December 31, 2003.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

Quality Enhancement - Unfunded Extensions (PD# 0090)

The Illinois Department of Human Services has extended the ending date for Quality Enhancement Grants (for Child Care Services) from June 30, 2000 (original ending date) until October 31, 2000 for their funded projects at the following sites: Olive-Harvey College (\$40,000 - original PD#99121), Dawson Tech (\$37,293 - original PD# 9921) Kennedy-King (\$60,000 - original PD# 9921) and Truman (\$40,000 - original PD# 9921).

Foster Parent Training (PD#0091)

Harold Washington College has received a contract from the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services for \$939,209 to provide foster parent training activities for the period from July 1, 2000 until June 30, 2001.

Carl D. Perkins, Title III (PD#0099)

The City Colleges of Chicago has received a grant allocation under the federal Carl D. Perkins Title III program of \$3,642,996 and the seven colleges have received Illinois general revenue funded program improvement grants totaling \$163,910. The federal grant is designed to improve student performance in career and technical education programs as measured by a set of core measures specified in the local plan guidelines. The state funded program

improvement grants are intended to improve the quality of the occupational education programs through the support of instructional equipment, staff development, curriculum development, and activities which enhance the integration of academic and occupational course content. The performance period for these projects is from July 1, 2000 to June 30, 2001. The individual state program improvement grants are:

State and Federal Tech Prep Grants (PD# 0100)

The City Colleges of Chicago has submitted its request to the Illinois State Board of Education for grant funding of \$136,266 from Federal "Tech Prep" funds and for grant funding of \$258,027 from Illinois "Tech Prep" funds. These funds will be utilized to support programs of preparation for technical careers and the development of an articulated occupational curriculum through the high school and college levels. The performance period for these projects is from July 1, 2000 to June 30, 2001.

Small Business Technology Resource Center (PD# 0101)

Daley College has received a continuation contract for \$70,000 from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs to provide quality assistance to high tech small businesses and encourage start-up, growth and development of new small businesses in Illinois. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2000 until June 30, 2001.
