NEW GRANTS

Illinois Corrections Industries Recidivism Project (PD#0071)

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Department of Corrections to fund a project which will design and implement research and a reporting tool on the impact of participation in Illinois Corrections Industries by parolees. The project will study the recidivism rates in Illinois Corrections Industries. The project's period of performance is from June 1, 2000 through September 15, 2000.

Illinois Professional Learners Partnership Subcontract (PD#0072)

The District Office has received a subcontract award for \$2,650 from Illinois State University to support the P-16 school reform initiative. The funding is part of a grant from the Illinois Board of Higher Education. The period of performance is from December 14, 1999 to August 31, 2000.

Enhancing Student Performance (PD#0073)

Richard J. Daley College has submitted a proposal to the U.S. Department of Education for a Title V grant, under the "Developing Hispanic Serving Institutions" Program. The proposal is for a total of \$1,767,371 (including \$1,607,045 of Federal support and \$160,326 of local support.) This project will fund a technology-driven tracking and feedback system which will decrease the attrition rate of targeted students. The performance period for the project is from October 1, 2000 until September 30, 2005.

Food Services Program Support for NYSP (PD# 0074)

The District Office has submitted an application to the Illinois State Board of Education to participate in the 2000 Summer Food Program which will provide breakfast and lunch for children participating in the National Youth Sports Programs (NYSP) at five of the City Colleges, Daley, Malcolm X, Kennedy-King, Olive-Harvey, and Truman. The application specifies that the City Colleges will contract with Eurest Dining Services for more than 2,000 breakfasts and lunches, each of 25 days, during the period from June 19, 2000 until August 3, 2000.

Voyager Summer Program Legislative Add On Request (PD#0075)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Legislature for \$124,000 to support their NYSP summer program with an academic

component. The period of performance for the project is from June 19, 2000 until August 31, 2000.

Project Transfer-Minority Student Transfer Center (PD#0076)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for a project which will increase the number of minority, disadvantaged, and "at-risk" students who transfer from community colleges to four-year institutions of higher education. The request is for \$94,000 and the performance period for the project will be from September 1, 2000 through August 31, 2001.

Staying the Course: Extending the Chicago K-16 Partnership (PD#0077)

The District Office has submitted a grant request to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for \$316,448 to extend its participation in the K-16 school reform which is taking place in Chicago. This project will enable the City Colleges, in conjunction with the Chicago Public Schools and the University of Illinois in Chicago, to work with teachers to revise and align curriculum. The performance period for the project is from September 1, 2000 through May 30, 2001.

Chicago Manufacturing Center Consortium (PD#0078)

Richard J. Daley College, in conjunction with Joliet Junior College, South Suburban College, and the Chicago Manufacturing Center has submitted a HECA proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for the funding of the Chicago Manufacturing Center Consortium which will provide manufacturing modernization assistance to small and medium sized manufacturing companies. The proposal requests \$275,000 and the period of performance for the project is from September 1, 2000 until August 30, 2000.

H.O.L.D. to S.O.L.D. for Academically Challenged Students (PD#0079)

Harry S. Truman College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for a project which would provide intervention strategies to students on academic probation in order to change the way that they think about and approach school. The project is targeted at improving retention and graduation rates. \$10,000 was requested and the period of performance for the project is from August 22, 2000 until August 31, 2001

Head Start FY 2000 Program Improvement Proposal (PD#0080)

A grant of \$105,000 is being requested from the Chicago Department of Human Services for the improvement of facilities at the Malcolm X Child Development Center and replacement of furniture/equipment at the Kennedy-King Child Development Center. The period of performance for the project is from May 1, 2000 through November 30, 2000.

Head Start FY 2000 Program Improvement Proposal (PD#0081)

A grant of \$10,000 is being requested from the Chicago Department of Human Services for the replacement of furniture/equipment at the Olive-Harvey Child Development Center. The period of performance for the project is from May 1, 2000 through November 30, 2000.

Head Start FY 2000 Program Improvement Proposal (PD#0082)

A grant of \$30,000 is being requested from the Chicago Department of Human Services for the replacement of furniture/equipment at the Kennedy-King and Dawson Technical Institute Child Development Centers. The period of performance for the project is from May 1, 2000 through November 30, 2000.

CONTINUATION GRANTS**Teen Parent Services Program (PD#0083)**

\$166,700 has been awarded to the City Colleges of Chicago by the Illinois Department of Human Services for continuation of the Teen Parent Services Program at Truman College. This program provides counseling and services to young parents. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001.

FY 2000 Community Service Contract (PD#0084)

Harold Washington College has received an award of \$451,442 from the Illinois Department of Human Services for a continuation of the Community Services Contract. The focus of this activity is to train developmentally disabled adults. The performance period for the new award will be from July 1, 2000 until June 30, 2001.
