NEW GRANTS

DCCA Legislative Add-On Grant (PD#0050)


The District Office has received a legislative add-on grant, from the Department of Commerce and Community Affairs (DCCA) for \$3,000,000 to upgrade and replace embedded computer systems, personal computers, and computer software. The project's period of performance is from July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2001.

<u>United States Air Force Research Science Grant (PD 0054 - Previously PD#9817)</u> Harold Washington College in cooperation with Northwestern University has received a \$200,000 grant from the United States Air Force to conduct research entitled, "New Strategies For Designing Receptors and Preparing Ultra-Sensitive, Chemically Selective Electrode Surfaces". The Grant will be used to assist a selected group of Harold Washington College students develop science research skills. Period of performance is March 15, 2000 to November 30, 2000, with options to support two additional 12 month research periods upon application by the College.

Automotive Technology Program (PD#0056)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal to the Coleman Foundation for a grant of \$25,000 to support an entrepreneurial program for students enrolled in automotive technology, which can lead to self-sufficiency and financial independence. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2000 until June 30, 2001.

Training and Education Program for Future Child Care Workers (PD# 0057) Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal to the County/City oversight Committee for the training and education for staff and future child care workers employed by the County/City Child Care and Development Center at 69 W. Washington. The proposal is for a five year project and requests funding of \$832,408 including \$155,037 for the first year. The performance period for the project is from January 1, 2001 until January 1, 2006.



Bridge to Future Careers (PD#0058)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for \$148,625 to fund a project which will prepare economically and academically disadvantaged minorities at the middle school, high school, and early college levels for acceptance into the Chicago Area Health and Medical Careers Program. The period of performance for the project is from August 22, 2000 until August 31, 2001.

Computer Literacy and Repair Program (PD#0059)

Malcolm X College, in conjunction with New Galilee Church, has submitted a proposal to the Ameritech Foundation and the SBC Foundation for \$25,000 to fund a computer literacy and repair training program. The performance period for the project will be from May 1, 2000 until April 30, 2001.

Project P.R.I.D.E. (PD#0060)

Malcolm X has requested a grant of \$10,000 from UMB, Inc. to fund a partnership project which will increase the participation of minorities in craft trades. The project will be a pilot program and will support speakers and training activities. The performance period for the project is from May 1, 2000 until December 31, 2000.

Illinois Alliance for Minority Participation (PD#0061)

Each of the City Colleges of Chicago has received a subcontract of a grant from the Illinois Board of Higher Education which was funded to Chicago State University. The seven subcontracts provide \$7,500 to each of the colleges (a total of \$52,500). The goals of the project are to enhance the participation of minority students in science, mathematics and engineering. The period of performance for the subcontracts is from January 3, 2000 until June 15, 2000.

State Prekindergarten Sub-contracting Project (PD#0062)

The District Office has submitted a proposal to provide preschool experience for three and four year old children who are at risk of academic failure at Daley, Kennedy-King, Malcolm X, Oliver-Harvey and Truman Colleges and at Dawson Technical Institute Child Development Centers. The proposal, for \$787,384 has been submitted to the Chicago Board of Education. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2000 to June 30, 2001.

GIFTS OR DONATIONS

BP Amoco Foundation Donation (PD#0051)

On April 14, 2000 the BP Amoco Foundation donated a voucher to Truman

College which can be utilized for the purchase of \$5,000 of equipment, including three computers, a scanner and a printer.

University Club of Chicago Computer Donation (PD#0052)

In April, 2000, the University Club of Chicago donated equipment to Kennedy-King College, including 11 computer CPU's, one laptop computer, five keyboards, one monitor and one fax machine. The estimated value of the equipment is \$3,000.

Swedish Trade Council Furniture Donation (PD#0053)

In April, 2000, the Swedish Trade Council donated six Scandinavian style office desks to Kennedy-King College which have an estimated total value of \$3,000.
