NEW GRANTS

Education to Careers Grant (PD# 0150)

The District Office has received a subcontract for \$400,000 from the Chicago Public Schools, "Education to Careers" grant from the U.S. Department of Education. These funds will be used for a variety of activities including faculty workshops, the development of articulation agreements, the development of electronic portfolios, and recruitment efforts. The performance period for the project is from September 1, 2000 until August 31, 2001

MAD (Mathlab Activities Development) Teacher Preparation (PD#0151)

Harold Washington College has requested \$46,356 from the Illinois Board of Higher Education for an Eisenhower Professional Development project to train teachers to facilitate learning with mathlab activities. The performance period for the project is from January 1, 2001 until December 31, 2001.

Mayor Daley's Early Child Care and Education Plan - Phase I, Type III Renovation of a Building into a Child Care Facility (PD#0152)

Harold Washington College has requested \$678,487 from the Chicago Department of Human Services for the renovation of the east side of the first floor of Harold Washington College into a facility which will provide day care for toddlers and preschool children and a laboratory training center for HWC students. The performance period for the project is from December 1, 2000 until November 30, 2001.

Community Kitchens (PD#0153)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal to the Mayor's Office of Workforce Development to provide certified training for food handlers for jobs in hospitals, hotels, and other organizations in conjunction with the Greater Chicago Food Depository. The proposal requests \$238,000 for a project which would run from January 1, 2001 until December 31, 2001.

MOWD/EZ/EC Southside Workforce Collaborative (PD#0154)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal to the Mayor's Office of Workforce Development to assure that South side agencies and organizations participate in empowerment zone designated activities. Kennedy-King College is part of a collaborative of 30 organizations which is requesting \$300,000 in grant funding for the period from January 1, 2001 until December 31, 2001.

Entrepreneurial Training for CHA Residents (PD#0155)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal to the Chicago Housing Authority for a project to train CHA residents for self sufficiency through self employment. The proposal requests \$253,000 in funding for the period from January 1, 2001 until December 31, 2001.

The Chicago Academy of Early Childhood Professionals - Child Development Course (PD#0157)

Harold Washington College has received an award of \$75,280 from the Chicago Department of Human Services for the offering of a program of training in child development to CDHS employees. The performance period for the project is from August 15, 2000 until June 30, 2001.

Microform Reader/Printer (PD# 0160)

Wilbur Wright College has requested \$4,500 from the Illinois State Library to apply toward the \$7,245 cost of a Cannon Microfilm Scanner 500 for use by students and faculty in the Learning Resource Center. The remainder of the cost would be provided by Wright College. The unit would be purchased when funded, hopefully by January 1, 2001.

IT Curriculum Model for Chicago (PD# 0161)

Harry S. Truman College has requested \$50,000 from the Illinois Community College Board under the Special Initiative Grant Program, for a collaborative project which will establish a new Associate in Applied Science Degree in Information Technology. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2001 until October 31, 2001.

Technology Research, Education, and Commercialization Center: A Partnership with the Department of Defense (PD#0163)

The Illinois Small Business Technology Resource Center at Richard J. Daley College is a subcontractor in a proposal being submitted by the Battelle Memorial Institute and the University of Illinois to the National Center for Supercomputing Applications for Technology Commercialization Services. The project would support research and educational activities to make available technology commercialization services which would bring Department of Defense technology (particularly that from the U.S. Navy) to Chicago area companies. The subcontract would be for \$50,000 per year and the performance period of 24 months could begin as early as January 1, 2001.

TRIO Student Support Services Program (PD#0164)

Truman College has submitted a proposal to the U.S. Department of Education for \$742,493 for a project which will provide student services so as to enhance the foundations and opportunities available to students for success at the college and university levels. The performance period for the project is from September 1, 2001 until August 31, 2004

Multi-Media Servers (PD# 0165)

Wilbur Wright College has requested \$15,127 from the Illinois State Library for the expansion and enhancement of existing networks. The College will provide matching funds of \$15,127 for the project. The performance period for the project is from January 1, 2001 until August 31, 2001.

A Community Computer Lab (PD# 0166)

Wilbur Wright College has requested \$50,000 from the Illinois Community Technology Fund Committee for a project which would make technology more available and accessible to low-income individuals and families, and to assist participants to achieve better results in school and job training. The performance period for the project is from January 1, 2001 until December 31, 2001.

Chicago K-16 Partnership: Qualified Mathematics Initiative for Improving Middle School Student Achievement Through Mathematics Endorsements (PD# 0167)

The District Office is requesting \$104,177 from the Illinois Board of Higher Education through the Eisenhower Professional Development Program for a project that would train 72 middle school teachers to more effectively facilitate student learning in mathematics. The performance period for the project is from January 1, 2001 until December 31, 2001.

Illinois State Library Microform Reader/Printer (PD# 0168)

Kennedy-King College has requested \$4,500 from the Illinois State Library to purchase a plain paper microform reader/printer. The performance period for the project is from January 1, 2001 until June 30, 2001.

FY2001 Educate and Automate Fast-Start-Assistive Technology (PD# 0169)

Kennedy-King College has requested \$2,500 from the Illinois State Library to provide assistive technology for the specialized needs of handicapped students in the library. The performance period for the project is from January 1, 2001 until June 30, 2001.

Rebirth of Englewood/Kennedy-King College Job Training Partnership Printing Industry (PD# 0170)

Kennedy-King College has requested \$3,727 from Rebirth of Englewood for a training partnership in the graphic communications area. The performance period for the project is from September 25, 2000 until December 31, 2000 and the project will be renegotiated in the Spring of 2001.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

Information Technology Upgrade Project (PD# 0156)

The District Office has received \$1,500,000 in funding as the second half of a legislative add-on project to upgrade computer networks and equipment at the City Colleges of Chicago. This portion of the project will be implemented during the period from January 1, 2000 until December 31, 2002.

GEAR-UP (PD# 0158)

Northeastern Illinois University has awarded a continuation subcontract of \$50,000 to the District Office to support efforts to better align standards from high school to college and to provide services which increase the proportion of students who leave high school prepared for college. In addition to costs of managing the Project, funds will support materials for students, faculty stipends, travel to K-16 conferences, and external consultants. The period for this project is September 1, 2000 through August 31, 2001. This project will utilize the services of Dr. Don Barshis, an external consultant, for project evaluation activities at a projected cost of \$12,000.

Illinois Professional Learners Partnership (PD# 0159)

Illinois State University has awarded a continuation subcontract of \$56,250 to the District Office to support its Teacher Quality Enhancement grant to better prepare teachers for Illinois K-12 schools. The City Colleges will work with university administrators and faculty to ensure that future teachers who begin their studies at CCC will be fully prepared to transfer into junior level courses in the education colleges of Illinois universities. In addition to costs of managing the Project, funds will support materials for students, faculty stipends, travel to K-16 conferences, and external consultants. The period of the grant is from October 1, 2000 through September 30, 2001. This project will utilize the services of Ms. Judith Welch, an external consultant, for instructional design activities at a projected cost of \$12,000.

Food Services Sanitation Program Agreement (PD#0162)

The Chicago Department of Health wishes to extending its Food Services Sanitation Program agreement with Harold Washington College for an additional year with additional compensation of \$78,779 to the College. The food handling and sanitation certification program began, originally, on January 1, 1998 and has previously been extended through December 31, 1999. The performance period for the new extension is from January 1, 2000 until December 31, 2000.

THE CHANCELLOR

RECOMMENDS that the Board of Trustees approves acceptance of any gifts, grants or other funding which may be forthcoming from these proposals, and authorizes the execution of all documents by the Chancellor or the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, the Assistant Secretary of the Board and the General Counsel for the acceptance of this funding or these gifts; said acceptance to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth by the grantor, and said funds not to be expended by the Board for any other purposes.
