NEW GRANTS

Grow With a Pro (PD# 01127)

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal for \$4,900 to the Illinois State Library for a project which would provide a lighting consultant the college's renovation. The performance period for this project is from October 1, 2001 to May 31, 2002.

Grow With a Pro (PD# 01128)

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal for \$4,710 to the Illinois State Library for a project which would provide a library space planner for the college's renovation. The performance period for this project is from October 1, 2001 to May 31, 2002.

Illinois Satellite Network (PD# 01131)


The City Colleges of Chicago has joined the Illinois Satellite Network as a participating member. This membership will provide the City Colleges with a transponder and services which could be valued as high as \$10,000 per year. The membership agreement is dated July 20, 2001 and has no current expiration date.

New Campus at Kennedy-King (PD# 01132)

The District Office has received a legislative add-on grant for \$4,000,000 through the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs to apply toward the new campus of Kennedy-King College. Allowed activities include land acquisition, demolition, project design, and construction. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2001 until June 30, 2003.

Access to Information Technology Education and Careers (PD# 01133)

The Illinois Department of Human Services has received a grant for \$600,000 from the U.S. Department of Labor, Office of Rehabilitation Services. A subcontract of \$252,575 is being offered to the City Colleges of Chicago to utilize four of its sites in maximizing the availability of its information technology training, assessments, guidance and other support to Chicago residents. The performance period for this project will be from October 1, 2001 to September 30, 2002



CONTINUATION GRANTS

Foster Parent Training (PD# 01120)

Harold Washington College has received a contract from the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services for \$1,033,875 to provide foster parent training activities for the period from July 1, 2001 until June 30, 2002.

Current Workforce Training Grant (PD# 01123)

The District Office has received a grant of \$489,014 from the Illinois Community College Board to provide non-credit training for incumbent employees at businesses, industry and other employers. The priority for these funds is to provide financial support for small and mid-sized businesses which need to enhance or upgrade the skills of their employees. The project may incur expenditures in salaries, contractual services, instructional materials, and equipment purchases in conjunction with the customized training program of a specific employer or group of employers. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002 with all payments completed by August 31, 2002.

Carl D. Perkins, Title III (PD# 01121)

The City Colleges of Chicago has received a grant allocation under the federal Carl D. Perkins Title III program of \$3,759,750 and the seven colleges have received Illinois general revenue funded program improvement grants totaling \$177,569. The federal grant is designed to improve student performance in career and technical education programs as measured by a set of core measures specified in the local plan guidelines. The state funded program improvement grants are intended to improve the quality of the occupational education programs through the support of instructional equipment, staff development, curriculum development, and activities which enhance the integration of academic and occupational course content. The performance period for these projects is from July 1, 2001 to June 30, 2002. The individual state program improvement grants are:

State and Federal Tech Prep Grants (PD# 01122)

The City Colleges of Chicago has received notification of funding from the Illinois State Board of Education for \$126,498 from Federal "Tech Prep" funds and for \$265,103 from Illinois "Tech Prep" funds. These funds will be utilized to support programs of preparation for technical careers and the

development of an articulated occupational curriculum through the high school and college levels. The performance period for these projects is from July 1, 2001 to June 30, 2002.

<u>Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS) Administered Child Care</u> (PD# 01125)

The City Colleges of Chicago has received funding of \$565,400 to provide quality child care services for parents meeting criteria for subsidized child care at Dawson, Daley, Kennedy-King, Malcolm X, Olive-Harvey and Truman College through their Child Development Centers. The period of funding for this grant is from July 1, 2001 to June 30, 2002.

Enhancement Grant - Training and Professional Development of Child Care Providers, Program Development, The Merit Music Program, and the Establishing A Volunteer Program (PD# 01126)

A proposal has been submitted to the Illinois Department of Human Services for \$60,000 to support a professionally supervised educational program that will continue to enhance child care services and engage the children and their parents in a variety of learning experiences. The period of performance for this project is from July 1, 2001 to June 30, 2002.

Education to Careers (PD# 01129)

The District Office has received a subcontract for \$229,000 from the Chicago Public Schools, "Education to Careers" grant from the U. S. Department of Education. These funds will be used for a variety of activities including faculty workshops, the development of articulation agreements, the development of electronic portfolios, and recruitment efforts. The performance period for the project is from September 1, 2001 until August 31, 2002

Tech Prep Transition Grant (PD# 01130)

The District Office has requested \$35,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education for developing a strategy to make a smother transition of CPS high school students into one of the City of Chicago Colleges. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2001 to June 30, 2002

Head Start / Child Care Collaboration (PD# 01134)

The District Office has received a contract for \$1,230,492 from the Chicago Department of Human Services to provide Head Start and Child Care Day and Nighttime collaborative services for children of low income parents at the Dawson, Kennedy-King, Malcolm X and Olive-Harvey Child Development Centers. The performance period for the project is from December 1, 2001 to November 30, 2002.

AMENDMENTS

Workforce Investment Act: Core and Intensive Services (PD#01124)

Truman College has received an extension of its project with additional funding of \$100,000 from the Mayor's Office of Workforce Development for a project to provide employment services to community members. The project includes funding of \$70,000 for adult programs and \$30,000 for dislocated workers. The extended performance period for this project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002.

College Excel Program (PD# 01135)

The District Office has agreed to extend its contract with the Chicago Public Schools for a project which will provide high school students with opportunities to earn college credit as well as high school credit. The program will serve up to 1200 students at the seven colleges with the Chicago Public Schools providing $\frac{2}{3}$ of the cost of the normal tuition charge. The performance period for the project is from August 16, 2001 to August 15, 2002.
