NEW GRANTS

Assistant Training in Primary Care Physician (PD# 01002)

Malcolm X College has submitted a proposal for \$720,799 to support the Physicians Assistant (PA) program at the College for a three year period. This collaborative program with Cook County Hospital, would serve 52 trainees per year and would focus on recruitment, curriculum improvement and retention as well as overall management and evaluation of the program. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2004.

Illinois Cooperative Work Study Program (PD# 01003)

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for a Cooperative Work Study Program grant for \$53,000. The project would offer students an opportunity to gain work experience for which they would earn both salary and college credit. The College has formed partnerships with community businesses and organizations to provide the internships. The performance period for the project is from April 3, 2001 through June 30, 2002.

Illinois Cooperative Work Study Program (PD# 01007)

The Humbolt Park Vocational Center of Wilbur Wright College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for a Cooperative Work Study Program grant for \$38,440. The project would offer students an opportunity to gain work experience for which they would earn both salary and college credit. The College has formed partnerships with community businesses and organizations to provide the internships. The performance period for the project is from April 3, 2001 through June 30, 2002.

Illinois Cooperative Work Study Program (PD# 01008)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for a Cooperative Work Study Program grant for \$30,000. The project would offer students an opportunity to gain work experience for which they would earn both salary and college credit. The College has formed partnerships with community businesses and organizations to provide the internships. The performance period for the project is from April 3, 2001 through June 30, 2002.

Richard J. Daley College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for a Cooperative Work Study Program grant for \$70,000. The Pew Learning and Technology Program: Institutional Readiness (PD# 01005)

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal to the Center for Academic Transformation at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (supported by the Pew Charitable Trust) for a grant of \$200,000 to redesign instructional approaches using technology to achieve cost savings as well as quality enhancements. The performance period for this project is from February 15, 2001 through June 1, 2001.

Learning Resource Center Information Enhancement Grant Request (PD# 01010)

The District Office has submitted requests for the colleges to the Illinois Board of Higher Education under a special program titled, *NILRC: A Consortium of Community Colleges, Colleges and Universities*, for a total award of up to \$42,000. The funds which have been requested, for technology enhancements include:

The performance period for the project is from January 1, 2001 through April 7, 2001.

Strengthening Health Care Through Creative and Strategic Community Action (PD# 01011)

Richard J. Daley College has submitted a planning grant request to the American Association of Community Colleges under their program, *Bridges to Healthy Communities*, for \$2,865. The project would provide support for staff and travel expenses in the planning activities which could result in a major three year funded project. The performance period for the planning project is from January 19, 2001 through June 30, 2001.

Institutionalizing Service Learning at Malcolm X College (PD# 01012)

Malcolm X College has submitted a proposal to the American Association of Community Colleges \$11,000 to support a project to institutionalize service learning at the College. This project would focus on the involvement of students in addressing community needs in the areas of education, public safety, human needs, and the environment. Two additional years of funding are likely if this proposal is funded. The performance period for the first year project is from January 1, 2001 through August 31, 2001

Initiative for Minority Students: Bridges to the Baccalaureate (PD# 01013)

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal to the National Institutes of Health - Center for Scientific Review, in conjunction with Elmhurst College. The funds requested (\$45,576 - year 1, \$19,818 - year 2, \$20,542 - year 3) would provide mentoring, financial support, and tutoring of Harold Washington students in the biological sciences so that they can continue their educations at Elmhurst College or their preparations for careers in the biomedical field. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2004.

Project CLIMB Subcontract PD#01017

Kennedy-King College has received a subcontract from a grant from the National Institutes of Health to Chicago State University. The subcontract of the CLIMB Project, for \$10,000, will be used to purchase supplies and equipment related to the college's participation in the CSU research project. The performance period for this project is from November 1, 2000 through August 31, 2001.

CONTINUATION GRANTS**Center For Occupational Research and Development (CORD) (PD# 01001)**

The District Office has received funding to continue to participate in a collaborative partnership with the nationally recognized Center for Occupational Research and Development (CORD) to create and develop a model for contextual teaching and learning practices in higher education. The FY 2001 phase of the project will involve the extension of the existing program to 45 new instructors and the development and implementation of a "Master Teacher" training program in contextual education. The District Office will utilize \$90,000 of grant funding, which has been approved by the funding agencies as follows, in a subcontract with CORD to accomplish this phase of the project:

- \$55,000 from the *Education-To-Careers* grant funded project
- \$35,000 from the *Faculty and Staff Technical Skills* grant funded project.

Head Start Support Services Program (PD# 01004)

The City of Chicago, Department of Human Services has awarded Harold Washington College the amount of \$401,000 to provide Head Start Supportive Services, including support for the Teacher Assistant Program, the AA-Early Childhood Program, the AA-Social Services Program, the Child Development Associate Program for Family Child Care Home Procedures and the Child Development Associate Program for Center-Based Head Start. The performance period for this funding is from December 1, 2000 through November 30, 2001.

United States Air Force Research Science Grant (PD#01015 - Previously PD#0054)

Harold Washington College in cooperation with Northwestern University has received a \$200,000 grant from the United States Air Force for the 2nd year of funding of the research project entitled, "New Strategies For Designing Receptors and Preparing Ultra-Sensitive, Chemically Selective Electrode Surfaces". The Grant will also be used to assist a selected group of Harold Washington College students develop science research skills. Period of performance for the 2nd year is

December 1, 2000 to November 30, 2001, with the option to support one additional 12 month research period upon application by the College.

Improving Minority Student Transfer Success (PD# 01006)

Daley College's allocation to community based organizations, under the Improving Minority Student Transfer Success grant project - previously approved as PD# 0130, have been changed as follows:

Special Populations Grant (PD#01016 - previously PD0109)

Funding in the *Special Populations Grant* has been approved to purchase site licenses for 100 concurrent users for tutoring software from PLATO education. Current licenses, funded from last year's project at the cost of \$15,000, are due to expire on January 31, 2001. The current grant includes \$15,000 for the site licenses for the period from February 1, 2001 through January 31, 2002.

GIFTS

ISP Server Hosting and 35 Licenses for E-Commerce (PD# 01014)


