NEW GRANTS

New Campus at Kennedy-King (PD# 01091)

The District Office has received a grant for \$4,000,000 from the Illinois Community College Board (as authorized by Public Act 91-0705, Article 11, Section 110) to apply toward the new campus of Kennedy-King College. Allowed activities include land acquisition, demolition, project design, and construction. The performance period for the project is from June 16, 2001 until June 15, 2002.

Illinois First -Malcolm X Playground (PD# 01092)

Malcolm X College has received a legislative add-on grant for \$25,000 to improve their playground for child care services. The grant will pay the costs of purchase and installation of rubber mat surfacing. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2000 until June 30, 2002.

Our Money Matters: The ABC's of Personal Finance (PD# 01093)

The District has received a grant of \$253,030 from the Treasurer's Office of the City of Chicago for a project in which 12 Chicago area financial institutions will participate along with all seven of the City Colleges of Chicago. The project will offer seminars to assist citizens of Chicago with personal finances and banking. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2001 until June 30, 2003.

Gear Up Program Expenses (PD# 01094)

Truman College has received a legislative add-on grant of \$25,000 from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs (Illinois First). Truman will work with the Arai Middle School in Chicago on a project which will include staff development, student services, parent services and partnership building. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2001 until June 30, 2003.

Illinois Professional Learners Partnership (PD# 01096)

The District Office is participating in a proposal submitted by Illinois State University to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for HECA funding. If funded, ISU will award a subcontract of \$5,595 to the City Colleges which

will support its Teacher Quality Enhancement grant to better prepare teachers for Illinois K-12 schools. The City Colleges will work with university administrators and faculty to ensure that future teachers who begin their studies at CCC will be fully prepared to transfer into junior level courses in the education colleges of Illinois universities. The period of the grant is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002.

The District Office has participated in the submission of a proposal for \$537,972 to the US Department of Education (Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education) The proposal, for a remedial math program for LEP students, is being submitted by CORD, an educational change organization housed in Texas. The performance period for this project is from October 1, 2001 through September 30, 2004

O2 Strategies for Success (PD#01098)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal for \$1,101,478 to the Illinois Board of Higher Education (via the Higher Education Cooperation Act - HECA) for a project to extend the technological preparedness for the workplace from elementary school through senior college. The performance period for this project is from August 1, 2001 through July 31, 2005.

Teacher Assistant Partnership Program (PD# 01102)

Wilbur Wright College has submitted a proposal for \$520,050 to the Illinois Board of Higher Education (via the Higher Education Cooperation Act - HECA) for a pilot project which would recruit and support students and develop curriculum to train and provide assistants and volunteers to support the schools in the Humbolt Park, Annenber Project community. The period of performance for the five year project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2006

CBO College Access (PD# 01104)

The District Office has submitted a proposal for \$907,800 to the Illinois Board of Higher Education (via the Higher Education Cooperation Act - HECA) for a project which would expand on Community Based Organization education programs to provide access to the local colleges and universities. The period of performance for the five year project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2006

Project Transfer Center (PD# 01105)

The District Office has submitted a proposal for \$4,252,760 to the Illinois Board of Higher Education (via the Higher Education Cooperation Act - HECA) for a cooperative project to promote statewide transfer efforts. The

project will focus on the use of technology by community college students and the improvement of articulation agreements between institutions. The period of performance for the five year project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2006

Economic and Business Consortium for Workforce Development (PD# 01107)

Truman College has submitted a proposal for \$31,280 to the Illinois Board of Higher Education (via the Higher Education Cooperation Act - HECA) for a project which would create a network and referral system for job creation and retention efforts in depressed areas. The period of performance for the five year project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002

CONTINUATION GRANTS

Youth Skills Development and Training Project (PD# 01108)

The District Office has submitted a proposal for \$275,000 to the Alternative Schools Network to support training and development activities at the Olive-Harvey Middle College and the Benjamin E. Mays Academy, alternative high schools located at Olive-Harvey College and Kennedy-King College . The period of performance for the project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002.

Dropout Retrieval: Empowerment for Academic Matriculation (PD#01095)

The District Office has submitted a proposal for \$1,018,743 to the Chicago Public Schools / Youth Connection Charter School Board for a program to provide academic programs and services for retrieved high school dropouts in the CCC middle colleges. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002.

Organization of Transportation Investment and Operations (PD#01101)

Daley College has received an extension to its subcontract with an additional \$25,000 (for a current total of \$50,000) from the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System as part of a grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation. Daley College will assist in leadership training and data collection related to regional transportation issues. The performance period for this project from April 1, 2000 through March 31, 2001, has been extended until March 31, 2002.

Illinois Community College Board Fiscal Year 2002 Grants to Colleges (PD# 01103)

The Illinois Community College Board has released information about annual

grants to the colleges and the City Colleges of Chicago will receive the following allocations for fiscal year 2002:

The *Workforce Development Grants* (above) will include *Business and Industry Services* (\$542,180), *Education to Careers* (\$130,299) and *Welfare to Work* (\$1,126,560) and the *Advanced Technology Grants* (above) will include *Instructional Equipment* (\$738,269), *Technology Support* (\$285,735), and *Staff Technical Skills* (\$371,971).

Teen Parent Services Program (PD#01106)

\$126,000 has been awarded to the City Colleges of Chicago by the Illinois Department of Human Services for continuation of the Teen Parent Services Program at Truman College. This program provides counseling and services to young parents. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002.

El Jardin Parking Lot Lease (PD#01110)

El Jardin has agreed to continue its lease of the parking lot adjacent to the Lakeview Learning Center (on Clark Street) from Truman College. El Jardin will pay Truman College \$6,000 per year for a total of three years. The lease will begin on July 1, 2001 and end on July 30, 2004.

AMENDMENTS

Microsoft Office User Training Amendment (PD#01111)

The Board of Education of the Chicago Public Schools has issued a contract amendment to increase funding, to \$55,000 (from \$18,000), for a Malcolm X project which provides computer repair training and A+ certification preparation at Malcolm X and the West Side Learning Center. The period of performance for this project is from May 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002.

GIFTS

University Club of Chicago (PD#01099)

Kennedy-King College has received a gift from the University Club of Chicago of 10 Compaq computers and three printers. The estimated value of this gift is \$530.00.

Spectrum Magazine (PD#01100)


