THIS AGREEMENT is entered into this 1st day of January 1, 2001 by and between the Board of Trustees of the Community Colleges District No. 508, County of Cook and State of Illinois, a body politic and corporate (hereinafter referred to as the (BOARD") on behalf of the Health Occupations Careers Practical Nursing Program under the auspices of Kennedy-King College/Dawson Technical Institute, and SCHWAB REHABILITATION HOSPITAL OF COOK COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the BOARD and the HOSPITAL acknowledge a public obligation to contribute to the Health Occupations Careers, Practical Nursing Program, for the educational benefit of students and for community needs: The BOARD has established a Day and Evening Practical Nursing Program that requires the educational facilities of the HOSPITAL in clinical practice; the Hospital has facilities suitable for the educational needs in Rehabilitation Nursing, which includes patient care unless utilized by schools who have existing contracts; and, it is to the mutual benefit of both the BOARD and the HOSPITAL that students have opportunities for clinical education as students and future practitioners;

THEREFORE, it is agreed as follows:

1. The BOARD assumes full responsibility for offering a Practical Nursing Program eligible for accreditation or certification according to the requirements of the Illinois Department of Professional Regulation. To implement this program, the BOARD will appoint and provide the

necessary faculty members who shall be academically or clinically qualified. Through such faculty the BOARD will plan and conduct all clinical instruction and evaluation of students.

2. The HOSPITAL will maintain the standards required for approval as a clinical area for instruction in an accredited program in Practical Nursing education.

3. The BOARD will develop a Clinical Instruction Plan designed to meet the educational goals of the Practical Nursing Curriculum. The Clinical Instruction Plan will describe the proposed use by the BOARD of the HOSPITAL's clinical Instruction Plan to the HOSPITAL clinical area and patient service facilities. The BOARD will submit the Clinical Instruction Plan to the HOSPITAL's Education Coordinator not less than two weeks prior to the first day on which students are to be assigned to the HOSPITAL for training. The Clinical Instruction Plan should be the result of prior communication between parties and must reflect mutual agreement of the parties. Details of the Clinical Instruction Plan may be modified from time to time thereafter to ensure that the Clinical Instruction Plan continues to meet the goals of the Practical Nursing education curriculum and the patient care standards of HOSPITAL.

4. In accordance with the Clinical instruction Plan, the HOSPITAL will make available and permit the use by the BOARD the following; patient care areas, patient service facilities; clinical areas, rooms or areas as available in which groups of students may hold discussion and receive clinical instruction; supplies and equipment commonly available for patient care; and sources of information for educational purposes.

5. In addition, the HOSPITAL will provide the following services to the students and faculty: reasonable use of parking areas at rates charged to the HOSPITAL's employees, those food services made available to members of the HOSPITAL's staff; emergency medical care to adults and to those minors for whom their parents or legal guardians have previously filed with the BOARD their consent in writing that such emergency medical care may be performed for such minors. Evidence of student's personal health insurance shall be made available to the HOSPITAL on request. (A copy of the medical history and physical examination provided by the student to the Board upon admission to the Program will be on file at the Board" Practical Nursing office, Dawson Technical Institute, 3901 South State Street, Chicago, Illinois 60609. such records include the dates and results of the Chest X-ray or Tine, C.B.C., Urinalysis and Serology, in addition to dates of immunization on boosters for Tetanus, Rubella, Rubeola, and Hepatitis-B, or test results.

6. Students will be assigned to the Practical Nursing education program by the BOARD. The BOARD agrees that all students assigned will meet both the BOARD's and the HOSPITAL's standards of health and academic ability. It is further agreed that the number of students placed each academic year shall be by mutual agreement of the BOARD and the HOSPITAL. Students will not give service to patients in the HOSPITAL apart from that rendered for its educational value as a part of the planned Practical Nursing education program. Students are to remain subject to the authority, policies and regulation of the BOARD, and during periods of clinical assignment, students will be required to observe the regulation imposed by the HOSPITAL on its employees in connection with patient welfare. The BOARD will assign an average of eight (8) students per rotation, unless stipulated by the HOSPITAL. The average number of students assigned will not exceed ten (10) at any one time. Students will be subject to the authority, policies and regulation of the BOARD, however, to the extent applicable, during periods of clinical assignment at the HOSPITAL. Faculty and students are to comply with (1) all policies, procedures, rules and regulations of the HOSPITAL, faculty and students are to comply with (1) all policies, procedures, rules and regulations of the HOSPITAL, faculty and students are to comply with (1) all policies, procedures, rules and regulations of the HOSPITAL and its professional and administrative staff relating to safety and quality care and (2) all federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations governing

the provision of health services. The HOSPITAL may resolve any problem situation in favor of the patient's welfare and restrict the students involved to the role of an observer until the incident can be clarified by the HOSPITAL staff, and the faculty member. The HOSPITAL may refuse educational access to its clinical areas to any BOARD personnel who do not meet the HOSPITAL's standards for safety, health, or ethical behavior.

7. The HOSPITAL will designate a member of its staff to serve as Education Coordinator. The Education Coordinator will represent the HOSPITAL in connection with use by the BOARD of the facilities of the HOSPITAL in carrying out the Clinical Instruction Plan. Members of the HOSPITAL may participate in the education of students at the request of the faculty member. Such participation will be discretionary with the individual members of the HOSPITAL staff, and will not be permitted by the HOSPITAL if the participation interferes with the regular duties assigned to the members of the HOSPITAL staff. The HOSPITAL will schedule conferences among its staff members and the BOARD faculty members at regular intervals upon request of the BOARD for the purposes of interpreting, discussing and evaluating the Practical Nursing Program.
8. The team of the Agreement shall be from June 1st, 1999 to June 1st, 2002. This Agreement will be negotiated for a period of 36 months, unless one party sends written notice, by registered mail, to the other party prior to April 1, of the year the contract is to be amended or terminated.

9. (a) The terms and conditions or agreement may be amended, or deleted, or new terms added, from time to time, but it is understood that no such changes, additions or deletions shall be binding upon the BOARD or the HOSPITAL unless they are authorized by mutual consent of the BOARD and the HOSPITAL. (b) Notwithstanding paragraph 9 (a), in the event of a material breach of one party, the other party may terminate this Agreement by giving the breaching party at the end of the class rotation written notice, by registered mail, of the breach and termination. If, however, the breach is cured to the satisfaction of the party giving notice within the cure period prior to the termination, the notice of termination shall be without effect.

10. It is mutually agreed and understood that during the term of this Agreement the BOARD will indemnify and hold the hospital and its employees, directors, officer, agents and affiliated corporation and such affiliates employees, directors, officers, and agents harmless from all loss, cost expense, injury or damage, including attorney's fees, for personal injury, public liability, and property damage arising directly or indirectly from the use and occupancy of the hospital premises and facilities by the BOARD, the BOARD's faculty and by the students of the BOARD.

11. The BOARD shall procure and maintain throughout the term of this Agreement and any extensions here of \$1,000,000/3,000,000

Comprehensive Malpractice Insurance for each student enrolled in the Practical Nursing Program. Evidence of this Malpractice Insurance Plan shall be provided to the HOSPITAL upon commencement of this Agreement and upon the date of each extension.

12. The Agreement shall be binding upon and shall ensure to benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

13. In the performance of all work, duties, and obligations, the BOARD and HOSPITAL are at all times independent contractors and, subject to paragraphs 3, 4, and 7 hereof, neither party shall have control of the manner in which the other performs its work and functions. Neither party nor their respective faculty, employees, students or agents shall be or shall claim to be the faculty, employees, students or agents of the other.

14. All medical records of patients treated or observed by the BOARD's faculty or students or otherwise utilized in the Clinical Education Program contemplated hereunder are and shall remain at all times the sole property of the HOSPITAL by the BOARD, its faculty or students without the express written consent of the Education Coordinator appointed by the HOSPITAL pursuant to paragraph 8 hereof. At all times during the term of this agreement and thereafter, the BOARD, and its faculty and students shall protect from unauthorized disclosure all information, records, and

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data pertaining to the HOSPITAL its patients; staff, facilities and corporate affiliates.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this Agreement to be executed by their duly authorized representatives as of the date and year first written above.

15. All notices required hereby are to be sent by prepaid registered mail with a return receipt requested, and are effective upon receipt.
