NEW GRANTS

Technology Enhancement Grant (PD# 01063)

The District Office has received \$1,500,000 in funding for a legislative addon project to upgrade computer networks and equipment at the City Colleges of Chicago. The project will be implemented during the period from June 1, 2001 until July 30, 2002.

A Model Project for Preparing At-Risk Low Income Students for A Successful College Experience (PD# 01064)


Daley College has received a grant from the US Department of Education, Office of Postsecondary Education (Trio Programs) for a model project to help prepare at-risk and low income students for success in college. The grant will provide a total of \$760,000 for a four year project. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2001 through August 31, 2005

Chicago Regional IT Internship Connection (PD# 01065)

The District Office has collaborated with the University of Illinois at Chicago and the Council for Adult and Experiential Learning (CAEL) in the submission of a proposal for \$205,000 to pilot test model approaches to the offering of high impact internships for students in degree and certificate programs in information technology. The proposal is being submitted to the Illinois Board of Higher Education through the Higher Education Cooperation Act (HECA) and the project will be implemented during the period from September 1, 2001 through August 31, 2002

Preparing Future Community College Faculty (PD# 01068)

Harold Washington College has collaborated with Loyola University of Chicago in its proposal to the U.S. Department of Education's *Fund for the Improvement of Post Secondary Education* (FIPSE) for a project which will improve the preparation of community college faculty. The proposal requests a total of \$313,025 for a three year project. The project will be implemented during the period from January 1, 2002 until December 31, 2004.



Wright College Displaced Homemaker Program (PD#01069)

Wright College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Department of Labor for \$65,000 to establish a center to provide training opportunities, counseling and services to increase employability of displaced homemakers. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2001through June 30, 2002

Scaling Up Chicago's K-16 Partnership: A Comprehensive View of Articulation (PD# 01071)

The District Office has submitted a proposal to the U.S. Department of Education's *Fund for the Improvement of Post Secondary Education* (FIPSE) for a project which will redesign articulation efforts in Chicago so as to align standards and improve disciplinary and interdisciplinary communications for K-16 faculty. The proposal requests a total of \$664,412 for a three year project. The project will be implemented during the period from October 1, 2001 until November 30, 2004.

The Port: A Workforce Resources Lab (PD#01072)

The District Office has submitted a proposal to the Verizon Foundation for \$50,000 for a project which would develop an employment skills oriented computer laboratory. The lab, called "The Port", would serve adults through a variety of technology based and employability focused activities. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2001through October 1, 2002

Faculty Development Project on the Brain (PD#01073)

Harold Washington College has received a \$8,000 in funding from the Erickson Institute for a mini-grant faculty development project. The project will utilize interdisciplinary study groups and integrated modules of instruction with the ultimate goal of modifying the college curriculum. The performance period for this project is from December 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001

Strengthening Institutions Program (PD# 01074)

Malcolm X College is submitting a proposal to the U.S. Department of Education for \$360,542 for year one of a Title III project, "Strengthening Institutions Program". The project's goal is to achieve higher completion and retention rates by providing extended orientation, academic advising, early warning alerts, tutoring and mentoring services to students. The period of performance for the project is from October 1, 2001 through October 1, 2006

<u>Developing Ethical Student Leaders through Service Learning (PD#</u> 01075)

Malcolm X College is submitting a proposal to the Illinois Community College Board for \$15,000 for a, "Leadership and Core Values" grant. The

project's goal is to enhance the MXC Service Learning Project by developing effective assessment instruments to measure the impact of service learning on students' value systems. The period of performance for the project is from June 1, 2001 through December 31, 2001.

Higher Education Cooperation Act (PD# 01076)

Harry S. Truman College is submitting a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for \$\$25,000 for a project which will create a network and referral service for workforce training opportunities in northeast Chicago. The period of performance for the project is from August 21, 2001 through August 30, 2002.

H-1B Technical Skills Training Program (PD# 01077)

The District Office has received funding of \$500,000 from the Mayor's Office of Workforce Development (MOWD) to provide technical training in skills related to the H-1B-certified IT occupations as described by the US Department of Labor. Participating businesses will determine their training needs and select appropriate incumbent workers for training. Training will be provided at the business location when possible. The period of performance for the project is from February 1, 2001 through March 27, 2002.

Truman College Summer Youth Initiative 2001 (PD# 01078)

Harry S. Truman College has submitted a proposal to the Mayor's Office of Workforce Development (MOWD) to be the primary contractor in a summer academic pre-internship and work experience program for 400 youths. The proposal requests \$708,010 and the period of performance for the project is from June 4, 2001 through August 24, 2001.

Daley College Summer Youth Initiative 2001 (PD# 01079)

Richard J. Daley College has submitted a proposal to the Mayor's Office of Workforce Development (MOWD) to be the primary contractor in a summer academic pre-internship and work experience program for 420 youths. The proposal requests \$409,315 and the six week period of performance for the project is from July 8, 2001 through August 18, 2001.

Leadership Education and Development - LEAD (PD# 01081)

Harold Washington College is submitting a proposal to the Illinois Community College Board for \$10,200 for a, "Leadership and Core Values" grant. The project's goal is to educate college students through service to the community. HW students will participate in a core values and ethical leadership workshop and then plan, implement and evaluate a similar event for selected Chicago High School leaders. The period of performance for the project is from August 1, 2001 through February 28, 2002.

Vocational and Applied Technical Education Act 1998 - III, Part C Grant and Program Improvement Grant - Local Plan for 2002 (PD# 01082)

Kennedy-King College is submitting a proposal to the Illinois State Board of Education for \$1,169,056 for a project which will improve student skill attainment and program performance in all career and technical programs. The period of performance for the project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002.

Linked Development Program (PD# 01083)

Harry S. Truman College is submitting four proposals to the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs (DCCA) for community development projects. The period of performance for these projects is from May 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002. The projects include:

- Planning and management to retrofit the College to create a "Business and Community Conference and Training Center" (\$50,000).
- To develop a site which will allow the College (in conjunction with the Howard Area Community Center) to support 250 families with child care and home visiting services and to integrate these families into a wider system of job development, education and training (\$100,000).
- To create (in conjunction with the Jane Addams Resource Corporation) a new, state-of-the-art, 5,000 square foot training facility in the Ravenswood Industrial Corridor to serve individuals and companies throughout greater Chicago (\$100,000).
- To develop and expand capacity to serve local employers in coordination with DevCorp (\$50,000).

Computer Information Systems Scholarship and Assistance (PD# 01084) Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal for \$190,956 to the National Science Foundation for a 48 month project which will provide scholarships and stipends to students in information technology. The period of performance for the project is from August 1, 2001 through July 31, 2005.

Institute for Business and Technical Careers (PD# 01085)

Richard J. Daley College, in collaboration with three local high schools and one manufacturing industry, has proposed to conduct a program to prepare high school students for technical careers in shortage occupations while earning credit equivalent to that of the first year of college. The proposal, for \$272,975, was submitted to the U.S. Department of Education's *Fund for the Improvement of Post Secondary Education* (FIPSE). The three year project will be implemented during the period from October 1, 2001 until November 30, 2004.

Teacher Assistant Partnership Program (PD# 01086)

Wilbur Wright College has submitted a proposal for \$95,000 to the Chicago Board of Education for a pilot project which would recruit and support students and develop curriculum to train and provide assistants and volunteers to support the schools in the Humbolt Park Annenber Project community. The period of performance for the pilot project is from June 1, 2001 through May 31, 2002.

Making The Move: A Partnership among Chicago Housing Authority, City Colleges of Chicago, and Chicago Faith-Based Organizations (PD#01087)

The Chicago Housing Authority has proposed to enter an intergovernmental agreement with the City Colleges of Chicago. CCC will manage a CHA initiative, subcontracting with approximately 10 faith-based organizations to assist families relocating from CHA housing developments to private housing. CCC will manage the program and offer training to 100 faith-based organizations and skill training to the selected faith-based organizations. The anticipated amount of the contract is \$500,000. The period of performance for the project is from June 15, 2001 through June 14, 2002.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

Truants' Alternative and Optional Education Program (TAOEP) (PD#01066)

The District Office has submitted a request to the Illinois State Board of Education for the refunding of the TAOEP, for \$2,411,512. This program is a unique partnership between public, private and community-based organizations designed to provide alternative educational programs and services to reclaimed youth, 16-21 years old, who have dropped out of high school. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002

Early School Leaver Program (PD#01067)

The District Office has submitted a proposal to the Illinois State Board of Education for \$362,005 to provide a structured opportunity for youth, 16-21 years old, to complete secondary education, develop career awareness and cooperatively be placed in employment. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002.

National Youth Sports Programs (PD# 01070)

The City Colleges of Chicago has requested refunding from the NYSP Fund for summer, 2001 programs (PD# 01053 - May, 2001). Federal funds are coordinated through the NCAA and provided for "Youth Education through Sports" programs for children ages 10 to 18 for the period from June 18

through August 3, 2001. A request is being submitted, at this time, to the Illinois State Board of Education for \$216,742.50 to provide food services (lunch and snacks) for the participants in the projects.

Head-Start Program Improvement (PD# 01077)

The District Office is submitting a request for \$280,000 to the Chicago Department of Human Services for program improvement funds which will address health and safety needs at the Dawson, Kennedy-King, Malcolm X and Olive-Harvey child development centers. The period of performance for the project is from April 16, 2001 through November 30, 2001.

FY2002 Community Services Contract (PD# 01080)

Harold Washington College has been awarded \$462,729 for the *FY2002 Community Services Contract* by the Illinois Department of Human Services. The program will provide children and adults with community and family training and services. The period of performance for the project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002.
