NEW GRANTS

Extended NYSP - Girls Sports Clinics (PD# 01160)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal for \$12,914 to the National Youth Sports Corporation for a project that will provide an educational and athletic program to introduce the sport of golf to 75 girls between the ages of 10 and 16. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2002 through May 31, 2002


<u>Center for Teacher Preparation and Professional Development (PD# 01162)</u>

The District Office has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Community College Board to create a Center which would explore, coordinate, and facilitate the role of the City Colleges of Chicago in the preparation and professional development of teachers. The proposal, for \$301,344, would fund the first year of the project, for which starting and ending dates have not, yet, been established.

Eliminate the Digital Divide (PD# 01163)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal for \$49,200 to the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for a project that would make computers and instruction accessible to community residents to increase their knowledge of computer and Internet use. The performance period for this project is from March 1, 2002 through November 30, 2002

Kennedy-King South Side Economic Opportunity Center (PD#01164) Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal for \$1,350,447, for a five year project, to the U.S. Department of Education. The project would inform and encourage first generation low-income residents to pursue post secondary education. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2002 through August 31, 2007.



Manufacturing Skills Development (PD# 01165)

The City Colleges of Chicago has been awarded a grant for \$94,000 from the U.S. Department of Labor (funded through the Regional Manufacturing Training Collaborative) to upgrade the manufacturing skills of underserved, dislocated and incumbent workers. Daley College's West Side Technical Institute and Kennedy-King College's Dawson Technical Institute will provide the manufacturing training. The City Colleges of Chicago will provide a subcontract to the *Instituto del Progresso Latino*, for \$43,000, in accordance with the terms of the grant, for their participation in the project. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002.

Telecommunications Network Cabling Installation Program (PD#01166)

Wright College has submitted a request to the Illinois Community Technology Fund for \$49,605 to train displaced, disadvantaged and/or underemployed workers to install telecommunications network cabling. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002.

Trio: Talent Search (PD# 01167)

Truman College has submitted a proposal to the U.S. Department of Education for \$1,000,000 during a four year period for a project which would provide support services to students in the 6th grade through 12th grade, or those who have dropped out of school, to encourage and help them get into college. The performance period for this project is from June 1, 2002 through May 31, 2006.

Mobile Education for Business and Industry Services (PD# 01168)

Truman College has submitted a request for \$50,000 to the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for a grant to provide onsite Information Technology instruction to local area businesses and community organizations. The performance period for this project is from March 1, 2002 through February 28, 2003.

Development of a Career Track in Bioengineering Technology (PD# 01170)

Daley College has submitted a proposal to the National Science Foundation to enable Daley and the University of Illinois at Chicago to collaborate on the development of new curriculum, recruit students, and articulate their programs in bioengineering technology. The proposal requests \$798,570 for a three year project which would begin on January 1, 2002.

Talent Search (PD# 01171)

Daley College has submitted a proposal for \$1,284,462 to the U.S.

Department of Education for a Talent Search grant. This project would identify, recruit and select 700 students at the 6th grade through 8th grade levels to participate in a program of support services which focus on mathematics and science preparation for high school and college. The performance period for this project is from January 18, 2002 through January 17, 2007.

The Port (PD# 01172)

Olive-Harvey has submitted a proposal for \$48,000 to th Illinois Community Technology Fund for project that would develop an employment skills oriented computer laboratory at the college to serve as a portal or entryway to education-for-employment resources for residents of Chicago's south side. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002.

The Chicago Community Foundation (PD# 01173)

The Chicago Community Foundation has awarded \$25,000 to WYCC Channel 20 for partial support of the broadcast on WYCC PBS education television of the PBS show entitled "School: The Story of American Public Education". The performance period for this project is from November 10, 2001 through March 30, 2002.

Minority Student Transfer Center (PD# 01174)

The District Office has received a \$530,000 award for the Minority Student Transfer Center project for the first year of a three year period of funding. The project will be a cooperative endeavor to promote statewide transfer efforts and will focus on the use of technology by community college students and the improvement of articulation agreements between institutions. The performance period for the first year of the three year project is from August 21, 2001 through August 31, 2002.

Community-Based Organizations College Access (PD# 01175)

The District Office has received a \$130,000 award for the Community-Based Organizations College Access project for the first year of a three year period of funding. The project will form and utilize collaborative ventures with community-based organizations to increase the number of minority, disadvantaged and *at-risk* students who attend college and then to encourage these students to transfer to four year institutions upon completion of college programs. The performance period for the first year of the three year project is from August 21, 2001 through August 31, 2002.

Educate and Automate, "Servers and Switches" (PD# 01176)

Washington College has submitted a proposal for \$450 to the Illinois State Library for the replacement of outdated fax equipment. The performance period for this project is from February 1, 2002 through June 30, 2002.

President's Discretionary Fund (PD# 01177)

WYCC Channel 20 has received a grant from the Joyce Foundation for \$20,000 to support the proposed book and author based television series, *Cover to Cover*. The award will be effective on October 28 for a period not to exceed 12 months.

HDTV/DDTV (PD# 01178)

Channel 20 has received an award of \$2,443,332 from the Illinois Community College Board to convert equipment so as to be able to deliver a digital television signal. The performance period for this project is from October 1, 2001 through October 31, 2002.

Sealant Survey in Dental Hygiene (PD# 01179)

Kennedy-King College and The University of Illinois at Chicago have been funded by the Chicago Department of Public Health to assess the number of children in the Chicago Public Schools who are using sealant on their teeth. Kennedy-King College will receive \$19,000 for work which will be completed during the month of November, 2001.

Talent Search (PD# 01180)

Olive-Harvey College has submitted a proposal for \$264,600 to the U.S. Department of Education for the first year of a Talent Search grant. This project would support students at the 6th grade through 12th grade levels as well as school dropouts with a program of services which are intended to help these students prepare to succeed in college. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2002 through August 31, 2007.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

Educational Talent Search (PD# 01169)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a continuation request to the U.S. Department of Education for the second year of funding for its Talent Search grant funded project at Dawson Technical Institute. The second year request is for \$280,000 with the five-year total being \$1,547,177. And the project provides support services to students to enable them to attend college. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2002 through August 31, 2007.

AMENDMENTS

Microsoft Office User Training Amendment (PD# 01161 - Amended from PD# 01111)

The Board of Education of the Chicago Public Schools has issued a 2nd contract amendment to increase funding, to \$124,000 (from \$55,000 and originally \$18,000), for a Malcolm X project which provides computer repair training and A+ certification preparation at Malcolm X and the West Side Learning Center. The period of performance for this project is from May 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002.
