**Korean American Merchants Association Scholarship(PD# 02010)**


Kennedy-King College has received a gift of \$500, from the Korean American Merchants Association, to be used as a student scholarship award. These funds are available for immediate disbursement.

**NEW GRANTS**

**Child Development Associate Credentialing Program (PD# 02007)**

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for a project which would expand and enhance existing programs of staff development for teachers, aides and home visitors employed in Head Start, Early Head Start, and other child care programs. The proposal requests \$1,000,000 per year for a five year period. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2007.

**Biotech Workforce Center (PD# 02009)**

The District Office has submitted a proposal for \$1,250,000 to the Illinois Community Technology Fund for a project that would develop an Illinois Community Computing Center in the area of biotech workforce development for women and minorities in Illinois. Daley College would take the lead in this three year project to provide training and career services in the rapidly growing field of biotechnology. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2002 through December 31, 2004.

**CONTINUATION GRANTS**

**The Illinois Louis Stokes Alliance for Minority Participation (PD# 02008)**

Each of the City Colleges of Chicago has received a subcontract of a grant from the National Science Foundation which was funded to Chicago State University. The seven subcontracts provide \$8,000 to each of the colleges. The goals of the project are to enhance the participation of minority students in science, mathematics and engineering. The period of performance for the subcontracts is from November 1, 2001 until October 31, 2002.

### AMENDMENTS

#### Truants' Alternative and Optional Education Program (PD# 02006)


The Illinois State Board of Education has refunded the TAOEP, at the District Office, for \$2,411,512. This program is a unique partnership between public, private and community-based organizations designed to provide alternative educational programs and services to reclaimed youth, 16-21 years old, who have dropped out of high school. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002. From the grant funds, payment to *Scholarship and Guidance Association*, for training and counseling services being provided to the Truman Middle College High School, was approved in the funded proposal, for the total annual amount of \$35,000. This funding was not reported in the previous Board Report item on this project.
