#### **NEW GRANTS**

### Pathways for Technical Careers (PD# 020603)

Daley College, in conjunction will the University of Illinois, Wright College and Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for \$115,000 for the first year of a three year project to develop and test a new model for the integration of adult technical education and ESL training. The period of performance for the first year of the project is from August 20, 2002 through June 30, 2003.

## More Teachers for Chicago (PD# 020604)


The District Office, in conjunction with Illinois State University, Northeastern Illinois University, El Valor and the Chicago Urban League has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for \$840,000 (\$280,000 per year for three years) for a project which would increase the number of highly qualified teachers (particularly from underrepresented populations) who are available to work in Chicago Public Schools. The period of performance for the first year of the project is from August 20, 2002 through June 30, 2003.

# NEH Challenge Grant: Scholars at Wright - Great Books Series (PD# 020607)

Wright College has submitted a proposal to the National Endowment for the Humanities for \$250,760 to fund a three year project which would expand the Great Books program at Wright and establish an endowment that will produce income to support humanities. The performance period for the project is from January 1, 2003 to December 31, 2005.

# <u>Telecommunications Network Cabling Installation Program (PD# 020608)</u>

Wright College has been awarded a grant of \$48,000 from the Illinois Community Technology Fund to provide job readiness and customer services



training in telecommunications installation services. The performance period for the project is from April 16, 2002 to February 28, 2003.

### Illinois Arts Council (PD# 020609)

The Illinois Arts Council has awarded Daley College with \$4,820 to fund a series of concerts and cultural events. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003.

### Summer Interns at Daley College (PD# 020610)

Daley College has received an award of \$17,650 from Carl Sandburg College, from a grant from the Illinois Community College Board. This funding will support three summer internships which have been awarded as follows:

- Joanne Burnside at the Adler Institute \$7,000
- Magda Banda at Loyola University \$4,640
- Maria Hernandez at the University of Illinois \$4,060.

The interns will work on projects in areas such as child development, institutional development and community development. In addition to the stipends listed above, each will receive \$500 for professional development and \$150 for mentoring. The performance period for the project is from January 1, 2002 to June 30, 2002.

### Junior Mentor Internship (PD# 020615)

Daley College has received an award for \$10,000 from the Chicago Community Foundation, which is an affiliate of the Chicago Community Trust, for a project which will build and advance scholarship and leadership skills of PREP graduates through an internship and mentoring program. The performance period for the project is from February 1, 2002 to January 30, 2003.

### Q2 Strategies for Success (PD# 020616)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal for \$326,650 to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for the first year of a four year project. The project would create and implement a structured learning model for technical education in the field of automotive technology for a global economy. The performance period for the project is from July1, 2002 to June 30, 2006.

# Combinatorial Analysis of Functional Interfaces and Surfaces Generated Via Dip-Pen Nanolithography (PD# 020618)

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal to the Air Force Office of Scientific Research for chemical research on the structure of inorganic substrates and their exchange processes. The proposal requests \$600,000 for

a 36 month project and will utilize Northwestern University as a subcontractor for \$360,000. The period of performance for the project is from January 1, 2003 through December 31, 2005

# <u>CSU/UIS/KKC/CPS: Certify Endorse Re-Certify Train - Online (PD# 020619)</u>

Kennedy-King College is a participant, along with the Chicago Public Schools and the University of Illinois at Chicago, in a project for which Chicago State University is submitting a proposal for \$158,860. The proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education is for the development of on-line post-baccalaureate teacher development and certification. The period of performance for the project is from July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003.

#### **Interactive Multimedia Diversity Training (PD# 020620)**

Kennedy-King College is a participant in a project for which Chicago State University is submitting a proposal for \$427,000. The proposal to the Illinois Board of Higher Education is to improve access to training in interactive/multimedia technologies for broadcasting students. The period of performance for the project is from July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003.

## <u>Technological Training for Small Businesses Through Local Community</u> <u>College and Chamber of Commerce (PD# 020621)</u>

The Humbolt Park Vocational Center at Wright College has submitted a proposal to the National Science Foundation for \$104,278 for a project which would analyze existing inventory control technologies, adapt them to small business needs, train business owners in their use and enhance the knowledge of mid-level IT specialists in this area. The period of performance for the project is from November 1, 2002 through October 30, 2003.

#### Project Prepare Youth Opportunity Project (PPYO) (PD# 020622)

The District Office has collaborated with Youth Guidance of Chicago in the submission of a proposal to the Mayor's Office of Workforce Development in Chicago (MOWD) for \$349,301 to expand educational, employment and social services for three high schools: Harper, Crane and Kelvyn Park High Schools. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003.

#### CONTINUATION GRANTS

#### FY2003 Community Services Contract (PD# 020602)

Harold Washington College has been awarded \$536,182 for the *FY2003 Community Services Contract* by the Illinois Department of Human Services. The program will provide children and adults with community and family training and services. The period of performance for the project is from July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003.

#### **Tech Prep - State (PD# 020605)**

The District Office has submitted a Tech Prep - State request for \$230,452 to the Illinois State Board of Education. to support vocational/technical career programs at the City Colleges of Chicago. This year emphasis will be placed on increasing the number of articulated agreements for occupational programs with both secondary schools and senior postsecondary institutions. The period of performance for the project is from July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003.

## Tech Prep - Federal (PD# 020611)

The District Office has submitted a Tech Prep - Federal request for \$172,758 to support vocational/technical career programs at the City Colleges of Chicago. This year emphasis will be placed on increasing the number of articulated agreements for occupational programs with both secondary schools and senior postsecondary institutions. The period of performance for the project is from July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003.

#### Carl D. Perkins, Title III (PD# 020612)

The City Colleges of Chicago has received a grant allocation under the federal Carl D. Perkins Title III program of \$4,001,117 from the U.S. Department of Education. The federal grant is designed to improve student performance in career and technical education programs as measured by a set of core indicators specified in the local plan guidelines. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003.

#### Program Improvement Grants (PD# 020613)

The Illinois State Board of Education has funded program improvement grants, totaling \$182,054, which are intended to improve the quality of the occupational education programs through the support of instructional equipment, staff development, curriculum development, and activities which enhance the integration of academic and occupational course content The individual state program improvement grants are:

The performance period for these projects is from July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003.

#### College Excel Program (PD# 020606)

The District Office has agreed to extend its contract with the Chicago Public

Schools for a project which will provide high school students with opportunities to earn college credit as well as high school credit. The program will have an estimated enrollment of 1951 (Fall and Spring combined) at the seven colleges with the Chicago Public Schools providing the cost of the normal tuition charge. The total reimbursable cost to the District is \$516,010. The performance period for the project is from August 16, 2002 to August 15, 2003.

#### **GEAR-UP (PD# 020614)**

Northeastern Illinois University has awarded a continuation subcontract of \$50,000 to the District Office to support efforts to better align standards from high school to college and to provide services which increase the proportion of students who leave high school prepared for college. In addition to costs of managing the Project, funds will support materials for students, faculty stipends, travel to K-16 conferences, and external consultants The period for this project is September 1, 2001 through August 31, 2002.

# Truants' Alternative and Optional Education Program (TAOEP) (PD# 020617)

The District Office has submitted a continuation proposal to the Illinois State Board of Education for \$2,460,128. This program is a unique partnership between public, private and community-based organizations designed to provide alternative educational programs and services to reclaimed youth, 16-21 years old, who have dropped out of high school. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003. From the grant funds, the following diploma programs and GED programs will utilize subcontracts from the City Colleges of Chicago:
