END-OF-TERM ENROLLMENT REPORT: FALL 2001

THE CHANCELLOR


REPORTS that in the Fall 2001 Semester (end-of-term data), unduplicated headcount enrollment in all instructional areas reached 82,799 students, and the Full-Time-Equivalent (FTE) enrollment reached 39,223 FTE students (Tables 1 and 2).

Headcount enrollment in the credit program reached 30,967 students, an increase of 1.4 percent over the previous year. The credit FTE enrollment reached 17,806 FTE students, which represents a 3.6 percent increase over the previous year.


Headcount enrollment in college credit, pre-credit, and vocational skills reached 35,273 students, an increase of 6 students compared to Fall 2000 (Table 1). These programs represent the traditional baccalaureate/transfer, occupational and remedial courses in the district. FTE enrollment reached 19,845 students, an increase of 3.5 percent (Table 2).

Headcount enrollment in the Adult Education program reached 31,604 students (Tables 1 and 3). FTE enrollment reached 17,719 FTE students (Tables 2 and 3).

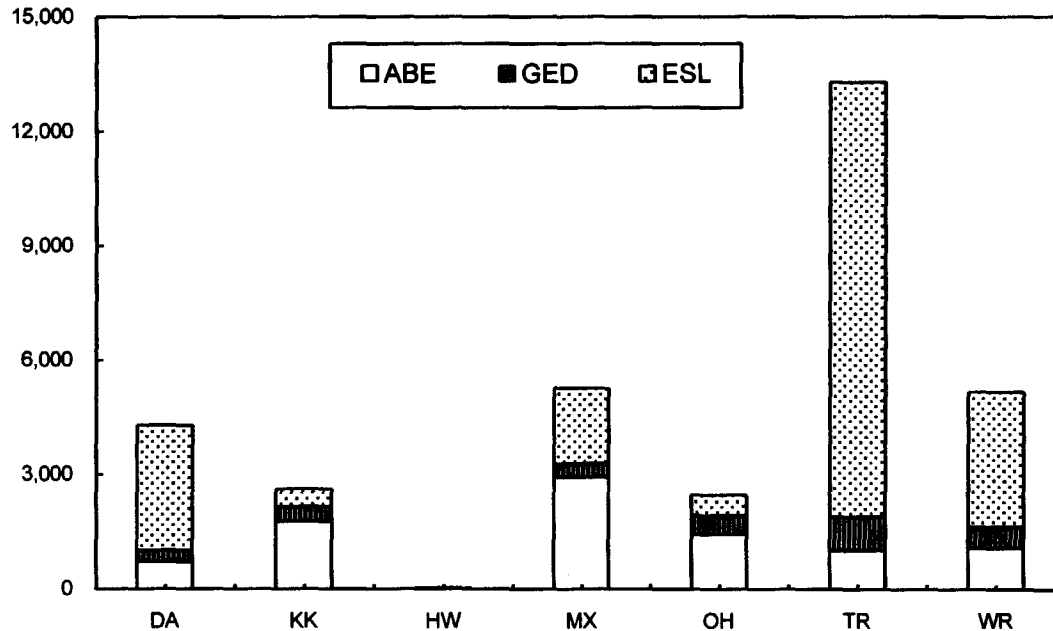
