**NEW GRANTS**

**Wright College Displaced Homemaker Center (PD#020501)**

Wright College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Department of Labor for \$64,000 support training, counseling and other services to increase the employability of displaced homemakers. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003.

**Servers and Switches (PD#020502)**

Wright College has received \$9,806 from the Illinois State Library for the development of local and wide area networks. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2002 through June 30, 2002.

**Bibliographic Instruction (PD#020503)**

Wright College has received \$9,790 from the Illinois State Library for the improvement of bibliographic instruction. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002.

**One World, Many Voices (PD# 020504)**

Harold Washington College has submitted a request to the Fund for the Improvement of Post Secondary Education (FIPSE) of the U.S. Department of Education for \$25,000 to support an international consortium of institutions through the production of multicultural multimedia curriculum materials. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2002 through August 30, 2003.

**Internationalizing the Core Curriculum of Industrial Technology Programs (PD# 020505)**

Harold Washington College has submitted a request to the Fund for the

Improvement of Post Secondary Education (FIPSE) of the U.S. Department of Education for \$200,000 to support a student exchange project between institutions in Europe and the USA. The focus of the exchange will be the globalization of the industrial technology curriculum and the immersion of students in the language and culture of the host institutions. The performance period for this three year project is from September 1, 2002 through August 30, 2005.

**Strengthening Institutions Program (PD# 020506)**

Malcolm X College is submitting a proposal to the U.S. Department of Education for \$360,000 for year one of a Title III project, "Strengthening Institutions Program." The project's goal is to achieve higher completion and retention rates by providing extended orientation, academic advising, early warning alerts, tutoring and mentoring services to students. The period of performance for the project is from October 1, 2002 through October 1, 2007.

**Hispanic-Serving Institutions (PD# 020507)**

Malcolm X College is submitting a proposal to the U.S. Department of Education for \$441,000 for year one of a Title V project, "Hispanic-Serving Institutions Program." The project's goal is to foster access and success of Hispanic and other under-represented students by strengthening academic programs and institutional management. The period of performance for the project is from October 1, 2002 through October 1, 2007.

**Juvenile Mentoring Program (PD# 020508)**

Truman College is submitting a proposal to the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice Programs, for \$220,000 for a three year project. The project's goal is to provide 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students at Senn High School with mentors to ease the transition from middle school to high school. The program will provide academic support (tutoring) as well as social support. The period of performance for the project is from September 1, 2002 through August 31, 2005.

**College Prep Program (PD# 020509)**

Truman College is submitting a proposal to the Field Foundation of Illinois, Inc., for \$6,150 for a five week summer project. The project's goal is to provide a five week academic experience on a college campus for 30 high school juniors and seniors. The period of performance for the project is from June 1, 2002 through August 31, 2002.

**Art of Teaching Across Related Disciplines (PD# 020510)**

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal for \$35,000 to the Illinois Community College Board for a project that would enhance faculty development and student assessment using a multi-disciplinary approach. The

period of performance for the project is from January 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002.

**A Family Affair (PD# 020511)**

Kennedy-King College has submitted a request to the Illinois Secretary of State's office for a grant of \$13,585 to be used to offer basic skills and GED preparation classes at domestic violence residential shelters. The period of performance for this project is from September 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003.

**Projecto Access 2002 (PD# 020514)**

Daley College has received a subcontract, for \$80,600, of a \$1,000,000 grant from NASA to the University of Texas at San Antonio. The nationwide project will identify 1,000 achieving middle and high school students with the interest and potential for careers in engineering, science, technology, and other mathematics-related areas and will reinforce them in the pursuit of these fields. The period of performance for this project is from March 1, 2002 to February 28, 2003.

**Senior Citizen Computer Technology Project (PD# 020515)**

Truman College has received a legislative add-on grant through the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for \$10,000. The goal of the project is to provide computer literacy training to the 370 residents of the Lawrence House Retirement Hotel. The period of performance for this project is from July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002.

**Illinois Arts Council (PD# 020516)**

Olive-Harvey College has been awarded \$420 to support a concert of Malachi Thompson and his Freebob Band, at the opening night of the Black Studies Conference. Mr. Thompson will also participate in a panel discussion concerning the future of jazz. The period of performance for this project is from April 17, 2002 through April 20, 2002.

**CONTINUATION GRANTS**

**United States Air Force Research Science Grant (PD#020512- Previously PD# 01015)**

Harold Washington College in cooperation with Northwestern University has received a \$200,000 grant from the United States Air Force for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of funding of the research project entitled, "New Strategies For Designing Receptors and Preparing Ultra-Sensitive, Chemically Selective Electrode Surfaces". The Grant will also be used to assist a selected group of Harold Washington College students develop science research skills. Period of performance for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year is December 1, 2001 to November 30, 2002.

**Certification Materials (PD# 020513)**


