NEW GRANTS

ACT Preparation Classes PD# (021110)

The District Office has received a grant of \$10,000 to fund ACT preparation activities at Olive-Harvey College which were provided for students at South Shore High School.. The performance period for this project is from March 1, 2001 through December 31, 2002.

Technological Training for Small Businesses Through the Local Community College and Chamber of Commerce (PD# 021103)

Wright College has submitted a proposal to the National Science Foundation for \$388,080 to fund a two year project which would enhance business development in the community through the increased use of technology. Specifically, the project will work with local small businesses to improve their inventory control technologies via adoption/adaptation of new technologies and training of users. The performance period for this project is from November 2, 2002 through October 31, 2004.

Developing a Career Track in Bioengineering/Biotechnology: Daley/UIC Partnership. (PD# 021104)

Daley College has submitted an articulation partnership proposal for \$298,954 to the National Science Foundation to fund a three year project which would create associate and baccalaureate degree career paths in bioengineering technology. Daley College will work with the University of Illinois at Chicago, local secondary schools and community organizations and WYCC-TV (Channel 20) and Argonne National Laboratory to develop the curriculum, recruit the students and implement the program.. The performance period for this project is from January 15, 2003 through January 14, 2006.

Web Design and Development Class for Humbolt Park Residents, Community-Based Organizations and Small Businesses (PD# 021107)

Wright College has submitted a proposal for \$5,000 to the Puerto Rico

Federal Affairs Administration which will be distributing funds which were received from the Illinois First initiative. The project would develop and pilot a curriculum for a web design program to be offered by the Humbolt Park Vocational Center's Continuing Education Department. The performance period for the project would be determined in the funding agreement.

High Technology School-To-Work Grant Program (PD#021108)

Truman College has partnered with Xomix, Ltd, a biotechnology company, in its application to the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for \$146,165 to expand the development and placement of students into the biotechnology workforce via a six week summer institute program. The period of performance for this project is from November 1, 2003 through October 31, 2004.

Daley College / SBC Partnership: Technology Upgrade Project (PD# 021109)

Daley College, in partnership with the West Side Technical Institute, has submitted a proposal for \$432,000 to the SBC Ameritech Foundation for a project to upgrade computer software and hardware at Daley and West Side Technical Institute. The performance period for the project is from January 1, 2003 through December 31, 2003.

Improving Access to Bibliographic Instruction Via CD ROM: An Innovative Approach (PD# 021111)

Wright College has requested a grant of \$24,549 from the Illinois State Library for a project which would create and distribute an instructional CD on bibliographic utilization at the Wright library. The performance period for this 20 week project would begin when the funding is received.

Opportunity Knocks (PD# 021112)

Olive-Harvey College has requested \$1,950 from the Illinois State Library for a project that would kick-off a new book club during Black History Month (February) by sponsoring a local Black author's presentation of his/her work and a public discussion. The performance period for this project would be the month of February, 2003.

Investing in Librarianship (PD# 021113)

Olive-Harvey College has requested \$4,650 from the Illinois State Library for a project that would provide assistance for the Olive-Harvey library in maintaining current holdings for mixed user demand and developing plans for renovation. The performance period for this project would be from January 1, 2003 through December 31, 2003.

Dream Again (PD# 021114)

Olive-Harvey College has requested \$103,230 from the Illinois State Library

for a project that would train faculty to teach students and support student efforts at on-line research, including the upgrading of the reference materials in the library and the integration of modules of library instruction in academic courses at the college. The performance period for this project would be from January 1, 2003 through December 31, 2003.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

ISBE - Child and Adult Care Food Program (PD#021101)

The District Office has requested \$650,000 for a program which subsidizes meal costs for children enrolled in Child Development Centers at the City Colleges of Chicago from the Illinois State Board of Education. The performance period for this project is from October 1, 2002 through September 30, 2003.

Head Start / Child Care Collaboration (PD# 021105)

The District Office has submitted a proposal for \$886,776 to the Chicago Department of Human Services to provide Head Start and Child Care Day and Nighttime collaborative services for children of low income parents at the Dawson, Kennedy-King, Malcolm X and Olive-Harvey Child Development Centers. The performance period for the project is from December 1, 2002 to November 30, 2003.

Institute for Business and Technical Careers (PD# 021102)

Richard J. Daley College, in collaboration with three local high schools and one manufacturing industry, has received funding for the second year of a program to prepare high school students for technical careers in shortage occupations while earning credit equivalent to that of the first year of college. The proposal, for \$272,975, was funded by the U.S. Department of Education's *Fund for the Improvement of Post Secondary Education* (FIPSE). The second year funding, of \$91,191 is for the performance period from September 1, 2002 through August 31, 2003.


Seabury Foundation Scholarship (PD# 021106)

On July 10, 2002 the Kennedy-King College Adult Learning Skills Program received \$6,000 in scholarship funds from the Seabury Foundation for the 2002-03 academic year. The funds are designated for full or partial support of one or two students and can be utilized for books, transportation, tuition, and day care as needed.
