**NEW GRANTS****TOE at Wright College (PD 021003)**

Wright College has received a subcontract of a grant to Northeastern Illinois University utilizing Illinois, Title II, Total Quality Education (TQE) funding for \$18,000. The purpose of the project is to provide leadership and support for the development and implementation of a new model of collaboration in degree development and curriculum, course and instructional design. The funds will provide for release time for four faculty member to work on the project. The performance period for this project is from October 1, 2001 through September 30, 2002.

**TOE at Truman College (PD 021004)**

Truman College has received a subcontract of a grant to Northeastern Illinois University utilizing Illinois, Title II, Total Quality Education (TQE) funding for \$21,000. The purpose of the project is to provide leadership and support for the development and implementation of a new model of collaboration in degree development and curriculum, course and instructional design. The funds will provide for release time for four faculty member to work on the project. The performance period for this project is from October 1, 2001 through September 30, 2002.

**More Teachers for Chicago (PD# 021006)**

The District Office, in conjunction with Illinois State University, Northeastern Illinois University, El Valor, the Golden Apple Foundation and the Chicago Urban League has been funded by the Illinois Board of Higher Education for a project which would increase the number of highly qualified teachers (particularly from underrepresented populations) who are available to work in Chicago Public Schools. The first year of the project has been funded for \$250,000, of which a subcontract to the Golden Apple Foundation, for \$150,000, will provide scholarships for minority participants in the Golden Apple Scholars Program. The period of performance for the first year of the project is from August 20, 2002 through June 30, 2003.

**Olive-Harvey College Technoogy Access Program (PD# 021011)**

Olive -Harvey College has requested funding of \$50,000 from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for a project which would provide senior citizens, preschool children and high-school aged children with computer access in an effort to eliminate the digital divide. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2003 through December 3, 2003.

**CONTINUATION GRANTS****Scaling Up Chicago's K-16 Partnership: A Comprehensive View of Articulation (PD# 021001)**

The District Office has been funded by the U.S. Department of Education's *Fund for the Improvement of Post Secondary Education* (FIPSE) for the second year of a three year project which will redesign articulation efforts in Chicago so as to align standards and improve disciplinary and interdisciplinary communications for K-16 faculty. The second year of funding is for \$222,738. The performance period for the second year of funding is from October 1, 2002 until September 30, 2003.

**A Model Project for Preparing At-Risk Low Income Students for A Successful College Experience (PD# 021002)**

Daley College has received continuation funding of \$229,338 from the US Department of Education, Office of Postsecondary Education (Trio Programs - Student Support Services) for a model project to help prepare at-risk and low income students for success in college. The performance period for the second year of the four year project is from September 1, 2002 through August 31, 2003.

**GEAR-UP (PD# 021005 )**

Northeastern Illinois University has awarded a continuation subcontract of \$285,367 to Truman College to support efforts to better align standards from high school to college and to improve readiness for college. The project will provide services which increase the proportion of students who leave high school prepared for college. The performance period for the second year of this project is September 1, 2002 through August 31, 2003.

**Food Service Sanitation Training (PD# 021007)**

Harold Washington College has been awarded \$86,657, from the Chicago Department of Public Health, to provide a Food Handling & Sanitation Certification Program.. The new agreement will extend the contract with the agency for an additional term, from January 1, 2002 through December 31,2004.

**Minority Student Transfer Center (PD# 021008)**

The District Office has received a \$344,500 award for the Minority Student Transfer Center project. The project will be a cooperative endeavor to promote statewide transfer efforts and will focus on the use of technology by community college students and the improvement of articulation agreements between institutions. The performance period for the project is from August 21, 2002 through August 31, 2003.

**Community-Based Organizations College Access (PD# 021009)**

The District Office has received a \$84,000 award for the Community-Based Organizations College Access project. The project will form and utilize collaborative ventures with community-based organizations to increase the number of minority, disadvantaged and *at-risk* students who attend college and then to encourage these students to transfer to four year institutions upon completion of college programs. The performance period for the project is from August 21, 2002 through August 31, 2003.

**Upward Bound Project (PD# 021010)**

Daley College has received an award of \$274,016 for the final year of the Upward Bound Program from the U.S. Department of Education. Upward Bound provides fundamental support to participants in their preparation for college entrance by serving high school students from low-income families and high school students from families in which neither parent holds a bachelors degree. The performance period for the final year of this project is from October 1, 2002 through September 30, 2003.

**AMMENDMENTS**

**HDTV/DTV (PD# 01191)**

The Illinois Community College Board has awarded WYCC-TV with a grant of \$2,443,332 to use with the conversion of the infrastructure of WYCC-TV to high definition digital capability. The performance period for this project, October 2, 2001 to October 31, 2002, has been extended to April 30, 2003.


**RECOMMENDS**
