NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS

The Online Language Assistant: Learning Language on the Internet with International Partners (PD# 030813)

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal for \$185,935 to the US Department of Education's *Jacob K. Javits Gifted and Talented Students Education Program*. The proposal is for the funding of the first year of a three year project to develop and pilot test an interactive approach to language learning with American, Chinese and Middle Eastern students. The performance period for the three year project is from January 15, 2004 through January 14, 2007.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

Cooperative Work Study at Wright College (PD# 030801)

Wilbur Wright College has received a grant from the Illinois Board of Higher Education for \$29,700 which will support the Wright College cooperative work study program by paying a portion of the salaries that students earn while in their internship positions in business and industry. The performance period for the projects is from April 2, 2003 until June 30, 2004.

Federal Tech Prep(PD# 030809)

The District Office has submitted a Tech Prep - Federal request for \$508,351 to support vocational/technical career programs at the City Colleges of Chicago. Funding will be provided by the Illinois Community College Board, utilizing Federal *flow-through* dollars. This year, emphasis will be placed on increasing the number of articulated agreements for occupational programs with both secondary schools and senior post secondary institutions. The period of performance for the project is from July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004.

Carl D. Perkins, Title III (PD# 030810)

The City Colleges of Chicago has received a grant allocation under the federal Carl D. Perkins Title III program of \$3,920,660 from the Illinois Community College Board, utilizing funds from the U.S. Department of Education. The federal grant is designed to improve student performance in career and technical education programs as measured by a set of core indicators specified in the local plan guidelines. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004.

Program Improvement Grant (PD#030811)

The Illinois Community College Board has granted \$163,849 to the City Colleges of Chicago for purchase of equipment for career programs on each campus. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004.

Foster Parent Training (PD# 030812)

Harold Washington College has received a contract from the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services for \$947,060 to provide foster parent training activities for the period from July 1, 2003 until June 30, 2004.

AMENDMENTS

Proyecto Access 2002 (PD# 020514)

Daley College has received a \$12,000 increase in a subcontract, for \$80,600 (now \$92,600), of a \$1,000,000 grant from NASA to the University of Texas at San Antonio. The nationwide project will identify 1,000 achieving middle and high school students with the interest and potential for careers in engineering, science, technology, and other mathematics-related areas and will reinforce them in the pursuit of these fields. The period of performance for this project is from March 1, 2003 to July 31, 2003.
