Whereas, students who have completed their General Equivalency Diploma (GED) instead of traditional high school have access to this scholarship by a qualifying score rather than a grade point average;

Whereas, in 2002 the American Council of Education revised the GED examination and modified the scoring system to increase scores by a multiple of 10;

Whereas, GED recipients needed a score of 260 on GED examinations taken before the changes in 2002 to qualify for the Harold Washington Scholarship;

RECOMMENDS

Therefore, let it be resolved that GED recipients taking the GED examination after January, 2002 will need a score of 2600 to qualify for a Harold Washington Scholarship.
