that the events included presentations on September 13, 2004 by Pirikana Johnson, from the California Student Government Association and Irene Schoefferman, from the United States Student Association, Washington, D.C., about organizing Student Government Associations and how to become actively involved in the policy making process. A Back to School - Get Out the Vote Jam, hosted with Power 92.3 radio station, encouraging students to register and vote, was also a part of the day's activities; and

that on September 14, 2004 a Summer Sizzle Raffle was held where prizes were awarded to students who registered early for the fall semester. Some of the prizes included a Malcolm X College Leather Jacket, Garment Bag, Lunches for a week, book vouchers, gift baskets and Sky Box tickets for either a Chicago Bulls or Blackhawk game; and

that September 13 and 14, 2004 were, also, Information Days during which informed college personnel provided information about each department and the services and resources available to students. Students also participated in an ice cream social when they registered to vote or presented their voter registration card; and
