NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS

Eli's Cheesecake TIFWorks Training Program (PD# 041002)

Wright College and Eli's Cheesecake have proposed a program of training for employees of Eli's Cheesecakes for \$168,626 to the Mayors Office of Workforce Development. The performance period for this project is from August 1, 2003, through March 1, 2005.

Integrative Approach to Continuing Education and College Credit Options in an Addictions Studies Context (PD# 041003)

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal for \$110,482, for the first year of a five year project, to the Illinois Department of Corrections. The project will provide training for inmates of the Sheridan Correctional Center which will, potentially, qualify them to serve as substance abuse counselors when they reenter the broader community. The performance period for the first year of the project is from October 1, 2004 through September 31, 2005.

Campus EAI Consortium Information Technology Grant (PD# 041009)

Wright College has submitted a request to the CampusEAI Consortium for up to \$1,000,000 in hardware, software and services for the implementation of an Oracle Portal System, an intranet portal that integrates with online learning, administrative computing and student services systems. The performance period for this project is from September 10, 2004 through August 30, 2005.

Student Support Services - Daley College (PD# 041010)

Daley College has submitted a proposal to the US Department of Education for \$254,375 for the first year of a four year project to support the academic success of entering students who are "at-risk". The performance period for

the first year of the project is from September 1, 2005 through August 31, 2006.

Student Support Services - Olive-Harvey College (PD# 041011)

Olive-Harvey College has submitted a proposal to the US Department of Education for \$203,979 for the first year of a four year project to support the academic success of entering students who are "at-risk". The performance period for the first year of the project is from September 1, 2005 through August 31, 2006.

Student Support Services - Kennedy-King College (PD# 041012)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal to the US Department of Education for \$220,000 for the first year of a four year project to support the academic success of entering students who are "at-risk". The performance period for the first year of the project is from September 1, 2005 through August 31, 2006.

Student Support Services - Wright College (PD# 041013)

Wright College has submitted a proposal to the US Department of Education for \$220,000 for the first year of a four year project to support the academic success of entering students who are "at-risk". The performance period for the first year of the project is from September 1, 2005 through August 31, 2006.

Student Support Services - Truman College (PD# 041014)

Truman College has submitted a proposal to the US Department of Education for \$219,672 for the first year of a four year project to support the academic success of entering students who are "at-risk". The performance period for the first year of the project is from September 1, 2005 through August 31, 2006.

Student Support Services - Malcolm X College (PD# 041015)

Malcolm X College has submitted a proposal to the US Department of Education for \$219,911 for the first year of a four year project to support the academic success of entering students who are "at-risk". The performance period for the first year of the project is from September 1, 2005 through August 31, 2006.

Diversity in Our Collection (PD# 041020)

Wright College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois State Library for \$4,000 to allow the library to enhance its circulating non-fiction collection. The performance period for this project is from October 10, 2004 through June 30, 2005.

The Wright Digital History Project (PD# 041021)

Wright College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois State Library for \$10,000 to allow the library to create an Internet-ready electronic version of its materials and collections, specifically, those materials related to Illinois history and culture. The performance period for this project is from October 10, 2004 through June 30, 2005.

Great Books Town Hall Meeting (PD# 041025)

WYCC-TV has submitted a request to the Chicago Tribune to support its flagship *Great Books Town Hall Meeting* (GBTHM) which features a televised annual dialogue among literary arts professors and students representing the seven City Colleges of Chicago that culminates a semester curriculum involving critiques of selected Great Books. This year's theme-*Power and Passion* will be explored through the following classic and contemporary works: Machiavelli-*The Prince*, Shakespeare-*Othello*, Carlos Fuentes-*The Death of Artemio Cruz* and Zora Neal Hurston-*Their Eyes Were Watching God* (alternative text).

CONTINUING AWARDS

Displaced Homemakers Program (PD# 041001)

Olive-Harvey College has received funding of \$58,410 from the Illinois Department of Labor for continuation of a project which provides training opportunities, counseling and services to increase employability of displaced homemakers. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005.

A FIPSE Project to Expand Learning and Achievement Among Minority and Non Traditional Students through A Great Books Curriculum (PD# 031103-YR2)

Wright College has received funding of \$141,800 for the second year of a three year program from the U.S. Department of Education's Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education (FIPSE). The project will design and apply instruments to evaluate what community college students can gain from Great Books instruction. The performance period for the second year of the project is from September 1, 2004 through August 30, 2005.

Minority Student Transfer Center (PD# 041004)

The District Office has received a \$350,000 award for the Minority Student Transfer Center project from the Illinois Board of Higher Education. The project will be a cooperative endeavor to promote statewide transfer efforts and will focus on the use of technology by community college students and

the improvement of articulation agreements between institutions. The performance period for the project is from September 1, 2004 through August 31, 2005.

Community-Based Organizations College Access (PD# 041005)

The District Office has received a \$70,000 award for the Community-Based Organizations College Access project from the Illinois Board of Higher Education. The project will form and utilize collaborative ventures with community-based organizations to increase the number of minority, disadvantaged and *at-risk* students who attend college and then to encourage these students to transfer to four year institutions upon completion of college programs. The performance period for the project is from September 1, 2004 through August 31, 2005.

ISBE - Child and Adult Care Food Program (PD#041006)

The District Office has requested \$380,000 for a program which subsidizes meal costs for children enrolled in Child Development Centers at the City Colleges of Chicago from the Illinois State Board of Education. The performance period for this project is from October 1, 2004 through September 30, 2005.

Head Start / Child Care Collaboration (PD# 041007)

The District Office has received funding for \$1,011,166 from the Chicago Department of Human Services to provide Head Start and Child Care Day and Nighttime collaborative services for children of low income parents at the Dawson, Kennedy-King, Malcolm X and Olive-Harvey Child Development Centers. The performance period for the project is from December 1, 2004 to November 30, 2005.

Child Care Access Means Parents in School (PD# 041008)

The District Office has been funded for the fourth year by the U.S. Department of Education for a project which expands day care services to children of students who are needy but not currently eligible or who do not have access to day care facilities. The fourth year of funding is for \$241,492 and will be used to expand day care services at: Daley, Kennedy-King, Malcolm-X, Olive-Harvey, Truman and at Dawson Technical Institute. The period of performance for the third project year is from October 1, 2004 until September 30, 2005.

Bridges to the Baccalaureate: Center for Science Success (PD# 01184 - YR3)

The District Office has received funding for the third year of this project from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for \$207,138. The

project prepares and supports 50 minority students from Washington, Olive-Harvey and Truman Colleges for transition to biomedical programs at the University of Illinois at Chicago. The performance period for the three year project is from September 1, 2002 to August 31, 2005. The project award includes a subcontract to the University of Illinois at Chicago for a total amount of \$167,356. This amount includes \$54,145 for FY '03, \$55,769 for FY '04 and \$57,442 for FY '05.

Our Money Matters: The ABC's of Personal Finance (PD# 041023)

The District has been refunded for \$202,250 by the Treasurer's Office of the City of Chicago for the second year of a project in which 12 Chicago area financial institutions will participate along with all seven of the City Colleges of Chicago. The project will offer seminars to assist citizens of Chicago with personal finances and banking. The performance period for the second year of the project is from July 1, 2004 until June 30, 2005.

AMENDMENTS

GraphicLink to Career Skills (PD# 040811)

Kennedy-King College has received a grant from the Illinois Board of Higher Education (the Cooperative Work Study Program) for \$10,400 (corrected amount), which will support cooperative work study programs in the graphic design and printing industry by paying a portion of the salaries that students earn while in their internship positions in business and industry. The performance period for the projects is from April 13, 2004 until June 30, 2005.

Computer Security and Forensic Investigations (PD# 041016)

Wright College has received a donation, valued at \$429,750 by the donor, of a neuSECURE Central Management System and related software modules and user licenses, support and database monitoring. The donor is Guarded Net and the system is for use in the Computer Security and Forensic Investigation Lab.

Stealth Watch Appliance M100 (PD# 041017)

Wright College has received a donation from Lancope of a Stealth Watch Appliance M100 (SWA-M-SC), of a network intrusion detection appliance and a one year maintenance agreement, valued by the donor at \$24,000. The donation is for use in the Computer Security and Forensic Investigation Lab.

Retina Network Security Scanners (PD# 041018)

Wright College has received a donation from eEye Digital Security of 20 RE50-00256-IP Retina Network Security Scanners (valued by the donor at \$6,520, each) and 20 IR40-00000-P Iris Network Traffic Analyzers (valued at \$1,295, each) for use in the Computer Security and Forensic Investigation Lab. The total donation is valued at \$156,300.

BIP I U Appliance (PD# 041019)

Wright College's Computer Security and Forensic Investigation Lab has received a donation of a BIP I U Appliance and deployment for one year (up to 50 IP's). The donation, from Beyond - IP, is valued at \$16,500.

WYCC-TV Underwriting (PD# 041022)

WYCC_TV has received general underwriting support from Instituto Cerventes (of Chicago) of \$2,500 for the period from August 30, 2004 through September 19, 2004.

Sewing with Nancy (PD# 041024)

WYCC-TV has received underwriting of \$6,000 from Jensen's Vac and Sew of Morris, Illinois for support of the show, Sewing with Nancy during the period from July 31, 2004 through October 24, 2004.
