NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS**Workplace Skills Enhancement (PD# 051002)**

The Business and Industry Services Department of Wright College has received funding of \$20,310 from the Illinois Secretary of State's Office to provide training in Workplace English as a Second Language for employees of the Freedman Seating Company (\$15,000) and the Eli's Cheesecake Company (\$5,310). The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006.

Two Tracks to Work: Transportation, Warehouse and Logistics (PD# 051003)

Daley College has been notified that it will receive funding of \$150,000 from the Workforce Boards of Metropolitan Chicago via a subcontract from Kerber, Eck and Braeckel, LLP, for a project to train WIA eligible, dislocated/low income workers to meet critical skills shortages in Illinois' Northeast Economic Development Regions' transportation, warehousing and logistics industry. As part of the award, Daley will subcontract with three community based organizations for \$33,000.00, each:

- Southeast Chicago Development Commission
- Central Federation of Labor Workers Assistance Committee
- Central States SER Jobs for Progress.

Daley will also subcontract with Star Industries to do forklift certification for a total of \$14,000.00. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2005 through December 31, 2006.

WYCC-TV20 General Operating Grant (PD# 051004)

WYCC-TV20 has requested a grant of \$150,000 for general operating support from the John D. And Katherine T. MacArthur Foundation. The funds requested will be utilized to support the capacity building efforts of the public television station. These funds have been requested for a five year period beginning January 1, 2006.

Hispanic and LEP Bridge to Healthcare and Hospitality Employment (PD# 051009)

Truman College has submitted a proposal for \$429,306 to the US Department of Labor for a two year project which will address the need for basic and work-related language skills and preparation of LEP and Hispanic individuals for career opportunities in high-need industries. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2006 through December 31, 2007.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

Community Services Agreement (PD# 051001)

The Illinois Department of Human Services has awarded a grant of \$738,349 to the District Office to support Site Administered Child Care Programs (\$220,000) and Developmental Disabilities Programs at Harold Washington College (\$518,394). The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006.

Head Start / Child Care Collaboration (PD# 051005)

The District Office has received funding of \$ 891,426 from the Chicago Department of Human Services to provide Head Start and Child Care Day and Nighttime collaborative services for children of low income parents at the Dawson, Kennedy-King, Malcolm X and Olive-Harvey Child Development Centers. The performance period for the project is from December 1, 2005 to November 30, 2006.

Minority Student Transfer Center (PD# 051007)

The District Office has submitted a request for \$567,252 to the Illinois Board of Higher Education to fund the Minority Student Transfer Center project. The project will be a cooperative endeavor to promote statewide transfer efforts and will focus on the use of technology by community college students and the improvement of articulation agreements between institutions. The performance period for the project is from September 1, 2005 through August 31, 2006.

Community-Based Organizations College Access (PD# 051008)

The District Office has submitted a request for \$228,280 to the Illinois Board of Higher Education to fund the Community-Based Organizations College Access project. The project will form and utilize collaborative ventures with community-based organizations to increase the number of minority, disadvantaged and *at-risk* students who attend

college and then to encourage these students to transfer to four year institutions upon completion of college programs. The performance period for the project is from September 1, 2005 through August 31, 2006.

A FIPSE Project to Expand Learning and Achievement Among Minority and Non Traditional Students through A Great Books Curriculum (PD# 031103-YR3)

Wright College has received funding of \$138,726 for the third year of a three year program from the U.S. Department of Education's Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education (FIPSE). The project will design and apply instruments to evaluate what community college students can gain from Great Books instruction. The performance period for the third year of the project is from September 1, 2005 through August 30, 2006.

Cooperative Work Study (PD# 050902)

Harold Washington College has received an award from the Illinois Board of Higher Education for \$26,000, to support cooperative work study programs by paying a portion of the salaries that students earn while in their internship positions in business and industry. The performance period for this project is from April 5, 2005 until June 30, 2006. *This award includes payments to the following agencies to support the internship salaries of participating students*
