that proposals, contracts, and other special funding instruments are under development or have been submitted by staff at this time.

NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS

Physician Assistant Training Grant (PD# 050904)

Malcolm X College has been awarded \$208,340 by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for the first year of a three year grant project (\$633,899 total) which will support the PA program at Malcolm X. The project will support recruitment efforts, retention strategies, faculty development activities and the upgrade of technology systems for enhancing the curriculum and improving the administration of the physician assistant program at Malcolm X. The first year of funding begins July 1, 2005 and ends June 30, 2006.

Interactive Teaching and Learning Mathematics Communities (PD# 050906)

Truman College has participated in a proposal, submitted by Northeastern Illinois University, to the Illinois Board of Higher Education, using Federal *No Child Left Behind* funding. The funded project total, of \$188,000, includes an award of \$52,838 for Truman. The purpose of the project is to improve teaching methods and mathematics content knowledge of Chicago Public School teachers. The performance period is from April 1, 2005 through August 31, 2006.

Gateway To College (PD# 050907)

Truman College has submitted a request to the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation for \$340,000 to supplement other available funding to provide services for at-risk youth who have dropped out of high school. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2005 through August 31, 2009.

**Targeted Training for Hispanic, Limited English Proficient Workers:
Food Processing Industry (PD# 050908)**

Truman College has submitted a request for \$121,380 the OSHA to support a bilingual, 10 hour OSHA certification course for Hispanic, LEP workers in the food processing industry. The performance period for this project is from October 1, 2005 through September 30, 2006.

CCAMPIS (PD# 050909)

The District Office has submitted a proposal to the US Department of Education for \$299,818 for the first year of a four year grants which would provide child care services for children of City Colleges of Chicago students. The performance period for the first year of this project is from September 1, 2005 through August 31, 2006.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

P-16 Initiative (PD# 050901)

The P-16 Initiative has been refunded by the Illinois State Board of Higher Education, as part of its fiscal year entitlement awards, for \$181,646.

Cooperative Work Study (PD# 050902)

Harold Washington College has received an award from the Illinois Board of Higher Education for \$26,000, to support cooperative work study programs by paying a portion of the salaries that students earn while in their internship positions in business and industry. The performance period for this project is from April 5, 2005 until June 30, 2006.

Workforce Development Grant (PD# 050903)

The District Office has received an award of \$257,160 from the Illinois Community College Board to support business and industry service programs at all of the colleges. The period of performance for this program is July 1, 2005 through June 30,2006.

Truants' Alternative and Optional Education Program (TAOEP) (PD# 050910)

The District Office has received funding of \$2,000,000 for a continuation project from the Illinois State Board of Education. This program is a unique partnership between public, private and community-based organizations designed to provide alternative educational programs and services to reclaimed youth, 16-21 years old, who have dropped out of high school. The Truman Middle College will receive \$244,208 and the Olive Harvey Middle College will receive \$267,460 from this funding. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006. From the grant funds,

The Illinois Louis Stokes Alliance for Minority Participation (PD# 050911)

Five of the colleges have received subcontracts of a grant from the National Science Foundation which was funded to Chicago State University. The subcontracts provide \$3,000, each, to Truman, Kennedy-King, Malcolm X and Wright and \$8,500 to Olive-Harvey. The goals of the project are to enhance the participation of minority students in science, mathematics and engineering. The period of performance for the subcontracts is from November 1, 2004 until October 31, 2005.

GIFTS

UPS Foundation (PD# 050905)

The UPS Foundation has donated \$18,000 for use by Malcolm X College to purchase new carpeting.

that the Board of Trustees approve acceptance of any gifts, grants or other funding which may be forthcoming from these proposals and authorize the Chancellor, the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, Planning and Research, or the District Director for Grants and Contracts to serve as *authorized representative* or *official representative* of the District in the submission of proposals for funding and to execute all documents for the acceptance of this funding or these gifts; said acceptance to be subject to the
