**NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS**

**Hurricane Katrina Supplemental Grant (PD# 060401)**

The District has been notified that it is eligible to receive funding of \$76,621 to help defray the institution's unexpected expenses associated with enrolling displaced students from institutions of higher education directly affected by hurricanes in the Gulf of Mexico in calendar year 2005. The funding, from the US Department of Education's "Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education" (FIPSE) is to reimburse CCC for expenses incurred between August 29, 2005 and September 30, 2006.

**Globalizing Vocational Training Program for the Electrical Industry to World Class Standards (PD# 060402)**

Daley College has entered into a subcontract with the Community College of Allegheny County, from a FIPSE grant (the Fund for the Improvement of Post Secondary Education, in the US Department of Education) to select four electrical students who will participate, along with Daley College staff, in this curriculum upgrading program. Daley will receive up to \$38,000 from CCAC. The performance period for the project is from September 1, 2005 through August 31, 2006.

**Adapting and Implementing Process Oriented Guided Inquiry Learning (POGIL) into the Harold Washington College Chemistry Curriculum (PD# 060403)**

Harold Washington College has submitted a request for \$54,384 to the National Science Foundation for a 24 month project which will upgrade the chemistry curriculum at the college. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2005 through August 31, 2007.

**Implementing Project Align in Chicago's High Schools: A Professional Development Program for English and Math Teachers (PD# 060404)**

The District Office has submitted a request for \$42,120 to the Lloyd A. Fry Foundation for a pilot project in which Chicago high school teacher will be trained in new instructional and assessment techniques. The performance period for this pilot implementation project is from August 1, 2006 through July 31, 2007.

**Bank Teller Training and Placement Services (PD# 060405)**

The District Office has received an executed Task Order Letter (TOL) from the Mayor's Office of Workforce Development (MOWD) which authorizes the City Colleges of Chicago to proceed with providing recruitment, assessment, customized training and placement services to prospective bank tellers. The performance period for this project is from March 1m 2006 through February 28, 2007.

**AMENDMENTS**

**Two Tracks to Work: Transportation, Warehouse and Logistics (PD# 051003)**

Daley College has been notified that it will receive funding of \$150,000 from the Workforce Boards of Metropolitan Chicago via a subcontract from Kerber, Eck and Braeckel, LLP, for a project to train WIA eligible, dislocated/low income workers to meet critical skills shortages in Illinois' Northeast Economic Development Regions' transportation, warehousing and logistics industry. As part of the award, Daley will subcontract with three community based organizations for \$33,000.00, each:

- Southeast Chicago Development Commission
- Central Federation of Labor Workers Assistance Committee
- Central States SER Jobs for Progress.

Daley will also subcontract with Star Industries to do forklift certification for a total of \$14,000.00. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2005 through December 31, 2006. *This project has now been modified, with permission from the Chicago Workforce Board, so that Southeast Chicago Development Commission will now receive a total of \$81,500 for recruitment, training, and case management of 53 machinists.*

**CONTINUATION AWARDS**

**Our Money Matters: The ABC's of Personal Finance (PD#041023 - YR2)**

The District has been refunded for \$203,000 by the Treasurer's Office of the City of Chicago for the second year of a project in which 12 Chicago area financial institutions will participate along with all seven of the City Colleges

of Chicago. The project will offer seminars to assist citizens of Chicago with personal finances and banking. The performance period for the second year of the project is from July 1, 2005 until June 30, 2006.

that the Board of Trustees approve acceptance of any gifts, grants or other funding which may be forthcoming from these proposals and authorize the Chancellor, the Executive Vice Chancellor, or the District Director for Grants and Contracts to serve as *authorized representative* or *official representative* of the District in the submission of proposals for funding and to execute all documents for the acceptance of this funding or these gifts; said acceptance to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth by the grantor, and said funds not to be expended by the Board for any other purposes.
