REPORTS

that Harold Washington College hosted its Annual Transfer College Fair on November 13, 2006. Over nine hundred current and past Harold Washington College students attended the event, and

that over thirty-five representatives (35) from Illinois, Indiana, and Wisconsin attended the fair. The colleges and universities listed below were in attendance: Chicago State University; Columbia College; DePaul University; DeVry University; Dominican University; East-West University; Eastern Illinois University; Elmhurst College; Governors State University; Illinois Institute of Art-Chicago; Illinois Institute of Technology; International University of Nursing; Loyola University; National-Louis University; National University of Health Sciences; Northeastern Illinois University; Northern Illinois University; Olivet Nazarene University; Purdue University-Calumet; Robert Morris College; Roosevelt University; Rush University; St. Xavier University; Southern Illinois University-Carbondale; University of Illinois-Chicago; University of Illinois-Urbana-Champaign; University of Illinois-Springfield; University of Phoenix; University of Wisconsin-Madison; and West Suburban College of Nursing, and

that as a part of their "Good as Gold Week," Phi Theta Kappa International Honor Society participated in the fair to help encourage scholastic achievement, and

that the purpose of the College Fair was to promote transfer opportunities for students to matriculate to a four-year college or university. Students learned about admission requirements, the application process, as well as the various programs of study offered by the each institution, and

that there was a "Meet and Greet" lunch where Sandra Banyard, Dean of Student Services, welcomed the college representatives and discussed transfer patterns of students at Harold Washington College. Dr. Barrington Edwards, Associate Dean of Instruction, also discussed articulations and future dual admission agreements with the four-year colleges and universities, and

that this fair promoted student awareness, educational opportunities for transfer, and provided students with a wealth of information and resources to make informed decisions about the possibility of pursuing a baccalaureate degree.
