that proposals, contracts, and other special funding instruments are under development or have been submitted by staff at this time.

**NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS**

**Collaborative Research: 2YC-REU: Two-Year College Research Experience for Undergraduates (PD# 060101)**

Harold Washington College has received funding of \$25,488 from the National Science Foundation for a collaborative project with William Rainey Harper College which will provide research experiences for college students. The performance period for this project is from September 15, 2005 through August 31, 2007.

**TWL Workforce Preparation Academy (PD# 060102)**

Olive-Harvey College has been notified that it will receive an award of \$380,000 support basic skills program development and other training in the context of transportation concepts and situations so as to increase the number of students who select careers in transportation areas. The performance period for this project is from October 1, 2005 through September 30, 2006.

**Bridges to the Baccalaureate: Center for Science Success (PD# 060103)**

The District Office has submitted a proposal for a new project to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for \$205,750 for the first year of a three year project. The project prepares and supports minority students from Washington, Olive-Harvey and Truman Colleges for transition to biomedical programs at the University of Illinois at Chicago. The performance period for the three year project is from September 1, 2006 to August 31, 2009.

**Head Start Support Services Program (PD# 060104)**

The City of Chicago, Department of Human Services has awarded Harold Washington College the amount of \$692,006 to provide Head Start Supportive Services, including support for the Teacher Assistant Program, the AA-Early Childhood Program, the AA-Social Services Program, the

Child Development Associate Program for Family Child Care Home Providers and the Child Development Associate Program for Center-Based Head Start. The performance period for this funding is from December 1, 2005 through November 30, 2006.

**Pilot Implementation of Project Align (PD# 060105)**

The District Office has submitted a request for \$103,420 to the Chauncey and Marion Deering McCormick Foundation for a pilot project in which seven Chicago high schools will undertake the first phase of Project Align implementation. Teachers in math and English will participate in professional development, implement standards-based learning assessments and focus their teaching on the learning outcomes which are essential for college success. The performance period for this pilot implementation project is from December 1, 2005 through August 31, 2006.

**Ethics Training Program (PD# 060106)**

The District Office has submitted a bid to the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago for a project which would provide ethics training for employees. The bid was for \$75,000 to provide services during the performance period from January 1, 2006 through December 31, 2006.

**AMENDMENTS**

**Interactive Teaching and Learning Mathematics Communities (PD# 050906)**

Truman College has participated in a proposal, submitted by Northeastern Illinois University, to the Illinois Board of Higher Education, using Federal *No Child Left Behind* funding. The funded project total, of \$188,000, includes an award of \$52,838 for Truman. The purpose of the project is to improve teaching methods and mathematics content knowledge of Chicago Public School teachers. The performance period is from April 1, 2005 through August 31, 2006. *This award includes a payment to SurveyZ.com for \$5,000 for on-line data collections services.*
