NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS

Sustainable Energy Curriculum (PD# 060602)

Wright College has received an award of \$80,000 from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to be used to enhance Illinois' sustainable energy industry workforce by providing career-training opportunities to community college students. The performance period for this project is from February 1, 2006 through December 31, 2006.

Building Energy Technologies: Installation of Renewable Energy Systems on Campus in Conjunction with Related Courses (PD# 060609) The Illinois Clean Energy Foundation has awarded a grant of \$38,000 to Wright College to be used to install small system integrated, renewable energy technologies (solar water heating, photovoltaic panels, preliminary wind turbine equipment) on campus to be utilized for instruction/training in new curricula and to reduce the campus energy draw. The performance period for this project is from May 1, 2006 through April 30, 2007.

MSTQE (PD#060610)

Northeastern Illinois University has awarded Wright College with a subcontract for \$10,000 to be utilized for faculty and administrative support for NEIU's MSTQE program. The performance period for this program is from July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006.

Geared-Up for Success (PD# 060606)

Truman College has submitted a request for a \$5,000 grant to Mayor Daley's Region 1 KidStart YouthNet program. The funding will support the creation of a boxed game and an interactive live game show which will be based on knowledge of what it takes to successfully complete high school and continue on to college or another postsecondary educational program. The performance period for this project is from May 1, 2006 through August 31, 2006.

Integrating Math and Sciences: A Pedagogy Approach (PD# 060607)

Malcolm X College has submitted a proposal for \$149,580 to the National Science Foundation for a three year project which would explore the impact of a teaching approach which integrates math with the other sciences. The performance period for the first year of funding of \$32,100 is from July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007.

<u>Disseminating NSF Catalyzed Innovations in the Two-Year Chemistry</u> Curriculum (PD# 060608)

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal for \$79,380 to the National Science Foundation for a three year project which would improve the educational practice in chemistry among the nation's two-year colleges by hosting an annual session on innovations at the fall National Meetings of the American Chemistry Society. The performance period for the first year of funding (\$26,460) is from January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007.

<u>Cross Community Early Childhood Educator Professional Development</u> <u>Project (PD# 060606)</u>

Truman College has submitted a request for \$32,456 as a subcontract of a Northeastern Illinois University's proposal for \$1,013,615 to the U.S. Department of Education for the Chicago Teachers' Center. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2006 through August 31, 2007.

Employer Training Investment Program (PD# 060611)

Wright College has been awarded \$60,000 by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to provide training for small to mid-sized companies to upgrade skills of existing workers. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2005 through September 30, 2006.

<u>Implementation of CAS Request Import Interface (PD# 060612)</u>

The District Office has requested a grant of \$15,000 from the Illinois Board of Higher Education to fund the software purchase, installation and testing for an interface which will allow students to electronically import their academic records from the District's student information system into their CAS (Course Applicability System) accounts. The performance period for this project is from May 15, 2006 through June 30, 2006.

Community Service Grant (PD# 060613)

WYCC-TV has received notification of anticipated funding of \$826,817, for the Television Community Service Grant from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting. This grant supports the basic operation of WYCC-TV and the performance period for the grant project is from October 1, 2005 until September 30, 2007.

Interconnection Grant (PD# 060614)

WYCC-TV has received notification of anticipated funding of \$16,491 for the Interconnection Grant from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting. This grant supports the basic operation of WYCC-TV and the performance period for the grant project is from October 1, 2005 until September 30, 2006.

Cooperative Work Study (PD# 060615)

Wright College has received funding of \$30,000 from the Illinois Board of Higher Education to support cooperative work study programs by paying a portion of the salaries that students earn while in their internship positions in business and industry. The performance period for this project is from April 4, 2006 until June 30, 2007.

Exploring New Models for Authentic Undergraduate Research with Two-Year College Students (PD# 060616)

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal to the National Science Foundation for \$3,031,802 to support a collaborative project which will link ten 2-year colleges with research institutions in the Chicago area to support productive research experiences for students. The performance period for this 60 month project is from September 1, 2006 through August 30, 2011

Central Illinois Bridges Program (PD# 060617)

Truman College has received a subaward from a National Institutes of Health grant to Illinois State University. The subcontract, for \$9,591, will support a summer Biotechnology Institute for Truman students and will help to create dual credit courses with the Chicago Public Schools. The performance period for the three year project is from March 15, 2006 to September 30, 2006.

Grow Your Own Teachers Program (PD# 060618)

Daley College has been awarded, via an intergovernmental agreement, a grant of \$30,010 to pay the cost of courses related to the "Grow Your Own Teachers Program". The performance period for this project is from December 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006.

Jobs to Careers: Promoting Work-Based Learning for Quality Care (PD# 060619)

Wright College's Humbolt Park Vocational Center has submitted a proposal for \$437,977 to the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. The project will focus on bilingual skills and health care training which will enable 35 participants to benefit from career enhancement activities leading to nursing certificates and licenses. The performance period for this project is from September 15, 2006 through September 14, 2009.

Cooperative Work Study (PD# 060620)

Harold Washington College has received an award from the Illinois Board of Higher Education for \$26,000, to support cooperative work study programs by paying a portion of the salaries that students earn while in their internship positions in business and industry. The performance period for this project is from April 4, 2006 until June 30, 2007.

Englewood New Citizens Initiative (PD# 060621)

Kennedy King College has submitted a proposal for \$200,000 to the Mayor's Office of Workforce Development (MOWD) for a project that would develop a model support program, provide access to a collaborative network of support and establish an evaluative research initiative for the re-integration of previously incarcerated individuals with felony convictions for non-violent and non-predatory molestation and sex related offenses. The performance period for this demonstration project is from January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007.

CONTINUATION GRANTS

The Illinois Louis Stokes Alliance for Minority Participation (PD# 060603)

Six of the colleges have received subcontracts of a grant from the National Science Foundation which was funded to Chicago State University. The subcontracts provide \$1,000, each, to Truman, Kennedy-King, Malcolm X, Wright, Olive-Harvey and Daley. The goals of the project are to enhance the participation of minority students in science, mathematics and engineering. The period of performance for the subcontracts is from November 1, 2005 until October 31, 2006.

National Youth Sports Programs (PD# 060604)

The City Colleges of Chicago has received a notice of funding from the NYSP Fund for Summer, 2006 programs. Federal funds are coordinated through the NCAA and provided for "Youth Education through Sports" programs for children ages 10 to 18 for the period from June through August, 2006. Program funded are being for Kennedy-King College (\$40,000) and Daley College (\$40,000). The projects will begin on June 26, 2006 and will end on July 25, 2006 (for Kennedy-King) and August 3, 2006 (for Daley).

National Youth Sports Programs Summer Food Services (PD# 060605)
The City Colleges of Chicago is requesting funding of \$200,000 from the Illinois State Board of Education to provide food services (lunch and snacks) for participants of Summer, 2006 National Youth Sports Programs (or similar

programs) at three of the colleges. Food services would be provided during the period from June 1, 2006 through August 30, 2006.

Bridges to the Baccalaureate: Center for Science Success II (PD#040404-YR3)

The District Office has received funding from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for \$210,494 for year three of a three year project. The project will prepare and support 65 minority students from Kennedy-King, Daley, Wright and Malcolm X Colleges for transition to biomedical programs at the University of Illinois at Chicago. This project includes a subcontract of \$67,676 to the University of Illinois at Chicago. The performance period for year three of project is from April 1, 2006 to March 31, 2007.

Collaboration to Improve Hispanic Transfer & Degree Completion (PD# 041114-Yr3)

Truman College has received an award of \$696,983 for the third year of a five year project in which Truman and St. Augustine College will collaborate to support transfer systems and improve faculty skills for the success of predominately Hispanic students. The funding is from the U.S. Department of Education under its Title V. Developing Hispanic Institutions Program. The performance period for the third year of the five year project is from October 1, 2006 through September 30, 2007.

GIFTS

Refurbished HP LaserJet Printers (PD# 060601)

Malcolm X College has received a donation of 10 refurbished HP LaserJet printers from Advocate Health Care. The printers, with approximate value of \$6,000, can be used by the College without restriction from the Donor.
