NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS

Food Service Sanitation Training (PD# 060301)

Harold Washington College has been awarded \$86,657, from the Chicago Department of Public Health, to provide a Food Handling & Sanitation Certification Program. The new agreement will extend the contract with the agency for an additional term, from January 1, 2006 through December 31, 2006.

Locally Grown (PD#060302)

West Side Technical Institute at Daley College has submitted a proposal for \$275,124 to the US Department of Agriculture for a project which will support curriculum development and program improvement for urban agribusiness. The performance period for the 36 month program is from July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2009.

PATHWAYS: A Holistic Approach to Augment STEM Degree Recipients (PD# 060304)

The District has collaborated with Illinois State University in a proposal to the National Science Foundation for \$1,999,805. This five year project includes an award of \$514,718 to the District to pay for faculty efforts, travel and other support in this project that aims to increase the number of students who complete degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM). The project will focus on recruitment, program improvement and student support beginning at the high school level and following through to degree completion and transfer to the university. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2011.

Centers for New Horizons Site Administered Child Care (PD# 060303)

The City Colleges of Chicago (CCC) in collaboration with Centers for New Horizons/Chicago Coalition of Site Administered Child Care Programs (CNH/CCSAP) will continue the *Child Care Assistant Program*, employing CCC Child Development Studies students to work in child care centers in the Chicago area. This joint initiative provides students with meaningful work experiences in their field of study, while meeting the demand for qualified staff at agencies offering high quality early childhood educational experiences. CNH will pay the City Colleges a maximum total of \$133,000 to support this project. The program will operate from January 1, 2006 through December 31, 2006.

RECOMMENDS

that the Board of Trustees approve acceptance of any gifts, grants or other funding which may be forthcoming from these proposals and authorize the Chancellor, the Executive Vice Chancellor, or the District Director for Grants and Contracts to serve as *authorized representative* or *official representative* of the District in the submission of proposals for funding and to execute all documents for the acceptance of this funding or these gifts; said acceptance to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth by the grantor, and said funds not to be expended by the Board for any other purposes.
