REPORTS that a brown bag lunch discussion sponsored by the Social Science Department was held on Monday, September 18, 2006. State Rep. Connie Howard and Attorney Lou Myers talked about "The Constitution and You" to an audience of approximately 50 persons. A question and answer session followed.
