that Olive-Harvey College hosted National Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day on February 7, 2007, as part of activities commemorating Black History Month. The event was organized by the Office of Student Support Services in conjunction with several organizations in the city; and

that students, faculty, staff and community residents participated in the event. Various experts spoke on the issue as well as the treatment of HIV/AIDS. Presenters included Christopher Brown, Assistant Commissioner, Chicago Department of Public Health; Howard Spiller, HIV Prevention Planning Group/Luck Care Center; Bethsheba Johnson, South Side Health Association/Luck Care Center; and J. Davis, Luck Care Center. Fifty students took the AIDS test which was available during the entire presentation; and

that in recognition of her efforts, Evangelist Phyllis Rodgers was presented the Sherry Luck Award of Excellence named after the founder of the facility that provides AIDS prevention counseling. Certificates of Recognition were also presented to several HIV/AIDS activists; and

that sponsors of the event included the Chicago Department of Public Health; AIDS Foundation of Chicago; Abbot Laboratories; Glaxo-Smith Kline; Alliance for Community Empowerment; the South Side Health Association/Luck Care Center.
