**NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS (Total Value - \$1,232,985)**

**Career and Technical Innovation Grant (PD# 081201)**

The Illinois Community College Board has made allocations for a new grant category to help develop or enhance innovative community college career and technical education programs. The allocations, based on CTE enrollments and using both federal and state funding, provides the following funding: Daley (\$11,974), Kennedy-King (\$13,339) Malcolm X (\$4,899), Olive-Harvey (\$4,228), Truman ((\$4,708), Washington (\$29,685) and Wright (\$6,288). The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

**Dropout Retrieval: Empowerment for Academic Matriculation NCLB Funding (PD# 081202)**

The District Office has received notification of US Department of Education supplemental funding from Title I (No Child Left Behind) of \$33,480. This funding is for the Middle College Program at Olive-Harvey College to provide academic programs and services for retrieved high school dropouts. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

**Dropout Retrieval: Empowerment for Academic Matriculation SGSA Funding (PD# 081203)**

The District Office has received notification of Illinois *Supplemental General State Aid* (SGSA) funding of \$119,070. This funding is for the Middle College Program at Olive-Harvey College to provide academic programs and services for retrieved high school dropouts. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

**Grow Your Own Teachers (PD# 081204)**

The Organization of the NorthEast (ONE) has been awarded a grant from the Illinois State Board of Education which includes a sub-award to Truman College for \$35,160. Truman's project will provide course work and support services in the Rogers Park, Edgewater and Uptown areas. The performance period for the project is from September 15, 2008 through August 31, 2009.

**Workforce Career Pathway for Alternative Energy Sources (PD# 081205)**

Wright College has submitted a proposal to the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for an Illinois Sustainable Education Project. The proposal requests \$90,000 for the development of a career pathway model for the sustainable energy industry. The performance period for this project is one year from the date of the award.

**Green Roof Program 2007 (PD# 081206)**

Wright College has received an award of \$5,000 from the Chicago Department of the Environment (using funds from the "ComEd Settlement Agreement") to install a "green roof" on the Science Building at Wright College. The project will include replacement of lighting (fluorescent T-12) with more efficient lighting (T-8) throughout the campus, installation of photovoltaic cells and a solar thermal system, the inception of wind data collection and the implementation of an energy auditing system. The performance period for this project is from December 1, 2008 through November 30, 2009.

**Dollar General Literacy Award (PD# 081208)**

Daley College has received an award of \$5,000 from the Dollar General Literacy Foundation to support the College's adult education GED program. The grant will provide ten scholarships of \$150 to GED graduates and will pay the GED examination fee of \$35.00 for 100 students. The performance period for the project is from October 1, 2008 through August 30, 2009.

**Nursing School Expansion (PD# 081209)**

Truman College has submitted a request to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for a grant of \$300,000 to expand the capacity of Truman's nursing program by implementing a weekend/evening option. The performance period for this award is from March 1, 2009 through February 28, 2010.

**Grow Your Own Teachers (PD# 081210)**

Northeastern Illinois University has been funded by the Illinois State Board

of Education for a project to help communities train and retain teachers for local schools. The grant includes a subcontract for Daley College, of \$38,054, to pay for office supplies, travel, college advisors and forgivable loans to students (\$13,290). The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2008 through August 31, 2009.

### **Grow Your Own Teachers SWOP (PD# 081211)**

Northeastern Illinois University has been funded by the Illinois State Board of Education for a project to help communities train and retain teachers for local schools. This award is part of the Southwest Organizing Project (SWOP) Chicago grant. The grant includes a subcontract for Daley College, of \$45,100, to pay for developmental coursework, college advisors and forgivable loans to students (\$30,000). The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2008 through August 31, 2009.

### **Entrepreneurship Chicago (PD# 081212)**

The Coleman Foundation has notified the City Colleges of Chicago that they intend to make an award of \$487,000 to the District Office for a three year project that will support entrepreneurship education in Chicago. This project will help the City Colleges of Chicago to provide entrepreneurship courses and programs throughout the District. The anticipated performance period for this project is from January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2011.

## **GIFTS AND DONATIONS (Total Amount Not Available)**

### **Albertina Walker Scholarship (PD# 081207)**

Olive-Harvey College has been selected by the Albertina Walker Scholarship Foundation for Creative and Performing Arts to participate in its scholarship program. Participating students may be awarded up to \$1,000.

### **Pre School Reading Library (PD# 090101)**

Olive-Harvey College has received a certificate which can be redeemed for a Pre School reading library of materials, valued at \$500.00, and ordered from the Magic Tree Bookstore. The certificate is a gift to the Day Care Center from the Chicago Public Schools Community Partnership Program.
