**NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS**

**Wright TOE Teacher Preparation (PD# 080601)**

Wright College has received a subaward for \$10,000 from Northeastern Illinois University to provide faculty stipends and other support for the partnership to improve teacher preparation. The performance period for this award is from July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008.

**Truman TOE Teacher Preparation (PD# 080602)**

Truman College has received a subaward for \$20,000 from Northeastern Illinois University to provide faculty stipends and other support for the partnership to improve teacher preparation. The performance period for this award is from July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008.

**Tourneés Festival (PD# 080603)**

Olive-Harvey College has received and award of \$1,800 from the French American Cultural Exchange (FACE) to support their participation in FACE's French Film grant program, the *Tourneés Festival*. For its participation, Olive-Harvey will host an African Diaspora Film Festival on campus. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008.

**ANNUAL AWARD REFUNDING**

**Adult Education -State Basic (PD# 080604)**

The District Office has requested funding of \$3,700,000 from The Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) to provide instructional services for Adult Basic Education and English as a Second Language at all seven colleges. The period of performance for this program is July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009. As part of this grant, City Colleges of Chicago will subcontract with 21<sup>st</sup>

Century Urban Schools in the amount of \$25,000 and with Logan Square Neighborhood Association in the amount of \$80,000.

**Adult Education -State Performance (PD# 080605)**

The District Office has requested funding of \$2,500,000 from The Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) to provide instructional services for Adult Basic Education and English as a Second Language at all seven colleges. The period of performance for this program is July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009. As part of this grant, City Colleges of Chicago will subcontract with 21<sup>st</sup> Century Urban Schools in the amount of \$25,000 and with Logan Square Neighborhood Association in the amount of \$80,000.

**Adult Education - State Public Assistance (PD# 080606)**

The District Office has requested funding of \$4,000,000 from The Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) to provide instructional services for public assistance clients at all seven colleges. The period of performance for this program is July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009.

**Adult Education -Federal Basic (PD# 080607)**

The District Office has requested funding of \$3,800,000 from The Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) to provide instructional services for Adult Basic Education and English as a Second Language at all seven colleges. The period of performance for this program is July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009.

**Adult Education -Federal EL/Civics (PD# 080608)**

The District Office has requested funding of \$1,000,000 from The Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) to provide instructional services for English as a Second Language at all seven colleges. The period of performance for this program is July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009.

**Partnerships for College and Career Success - Federal Perkins Allocation (PD# 080610)**

The City Colleges of Chicago anticipates a preliminary grant allocation under the Federal Perkins IV, Title II program of \$495,168 to support vocational/technical career programs at the City Colleges of Chicago. Funding will be provided by the Illinois Community College Board, utilizing Federal *flow-through* dollars. This year, emphasis will be placed on increasing the number of articulated agreements for occupational programs with both secondary schools and senior post secondary institutions. The period of performance for the project is from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009.

**Carl D. Perkins, Title III (PD# 080610)**

The City Colleges of Chicago anticipates a preliminary grant allocation under the federal Carl D. Perkins Title III program of \$3,545,087 from the Illinois Community College Board, utilizing funds from the U.S. Department of Education. The federal grant is designed to improve student performance in career and technical education programs as measured by a set of core indicators specified in the local plan guidelines. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009.

**Program Improvement Grant (PD#080611)**

The City Colleges of Chicago anticipates receiving an award of \$128,232 from the Illinois Community College Board for purchase of equipment for career programs on each campus. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009.

**Early School Leavers Program (PD# 080612)**

The District Office anticipates receiving preliminary notification of the award of \$287,686 to continue the Early School Leavers program, a project funded by the Illinois Community College Board with the purpose of providing an array of opportunities for youths, age 16 to 21 years, to re-engage in school and earn a high school diploma or GED credential while receiving intensive career preparation services. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009.

**Student Support Services - Daley College (PD# 080614)**

Daley College has requested funding from the US Department of Education for \$235,689 for the fourth year of a five year project to support the academic success of entering students who are "at-risk". The performance period for the first year of the project is from September 1, 2008 through August 31, 2009.

**Student Support Services - Olive-Harvey College (PD# 080615)**

Olive-Harvey College has requested funding from the US Department of Education for \$203,979 for the fourth year of a five year project to support the academic success of entering students who are "at-risk". The performance period for the first year of the project is from September 1, 2008 through August 31, 2009.

**Student Support Services - Wright College (PD# 080616)**

Wright College has requested funding from the US Department of Education for \$220,000 for the fourth year of a five year project to support the academic success of entering students who are "at-risk". The performance period for

the first year of the project is from September 1, 2008 through August 31, 2009.

**Student Support Services - Truman College (PD# 080617)**

Truman College has requested funding from the US Department of Education for \$219,672 for the fourth year of a five year project to support the academic success of entering students who are "at-risk". The performance period for the first year of the project is from September 1, 2008 through August 31, 2009.

**Student Support Services - Malcolm X College (PD# 080618)**

Malcolm X College has requested funding from the US Department of Education for \$219,911 for the fourth year of a five year project to support the academic success of entering students who are "at-risk". The performance period for the first year of the project is from September 1, 2008 through August 31, 2009.

**Truants' Alternative and Optional Education Program (TAOEP) (PD# 080620)**

The District Office has requested funding of \$2,721,240 for a continuation project from the Illinois State Board of Education. This program is a unique partnership between public, private and community-based organizations designed to provide alternative educational programs and services to reclaimed youth, 16-21 years old, who have dropped out of high school. The Truman Middle College will receive \$535,500 and the Olive Harvey Middle College will receive \$535,500 from this funding. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009. From the grant funds, the following diploma programs and GED programs will utilize subcontracts from the City Colleges of Chicago:

**Community Services Agreement (PD# 080621)**

The District Office anticipates an award from the Illinois Department of Human Services of \$738,349 to the to support Site Administered Child Care Programs (\$220,000) and Developmental Disabilities Programs at Harold Washington College (\$518,394). The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009.

**Community College Tech Prep Support Grant (PD# 080622)**

The District anticipates and award from the Illinois Community College Board of \$64,135 to be used for identification, reporting, and assessment of post secondary Tech Prep students and testing and placement of secondary Tech Prep students. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009.

**Career and Technical Education Grant Agreement (PD# 080623)**

The District Office anticipates an award of \$140,000 from the Illinois Community College Board (utilizing Federal Perkins funding) for Continuous Quality Improvement activities (\$70,000) and Performance Enhancement activities (\$70,000) related to post secondary career and technical education programs. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009.

**Upward Mobility Program (PD# 080624)**

The District Office has entered into an intergovernment agreement with the Department of Central Management Services of the State of Illinois which will provide tuition and fee payments for Illinois state employees who are participants of the Upward Mobility program. The performance period for this agreement is from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

**Workforce Development Grant (PD# 080625)**

The District Office anticipates an award of \$257,160 from the Illinois Community College Board to support business and industry service programs at all of the colleges. The period of performance for this program is July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009.

**State Prekindergarten Sub-contracting Project (PD#080626)**

The District Office has submitted a request for \$504,187 to the Chicago Public Schools to continue to provide preschool experience for three and four year old children who are at risk of academic failure at Daley, Kennedy-King, Malcolm X, Oliver-Harvey and Truman Colleges. The performance period for the project is from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009.

**Illinois Basic Operating Supplement (PD#080627)**

WYCC Channel 20 has received notice of the funding of a supplement to its Basic Operating Grant from the Illinois Arts Council for \$170,084 to be spent on basic operating costs of WYCC. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2007 through August 31, 2008.

**AMENDMENT**

**Head Start Support Services Program (PD# 080502)**

The City of Chicago, Department of Human Services has extended their award to Harold Washington College and increased the maximum cumulative funded amount (for the project since 12/1/2005) to \$1,688,668 (which includes new funding of \$398,331) to provide Head Start Supportive Services, including support for the Teacher Assistant Program, the AA-Early Childhood Program, the AA-Social Services Program, the Child Development Associate Program for Family Child Care Home Providers and the Child Development Associate Program for Center-Based Head Start. The performance period for this funding is extended for the one year period from December 1, 2007 through November 30, 2008.
